NOTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office until Monday the 23rd day of May next, at noon, for furnishing about two hundred and thirty tons of Colonial Salted Beef for the Public Service, for the ensuing year, under the following conditions, viz.—

The Beef to be of Oxen at least three years of age; to be cut into 8lb. pieces, excluding the neck, shin, and other inferior parts; to be properly cured for keeping, and to be packed with St. Ube's salt, during the months of June, July, and August next; to be put into Tierces of substantial materials and manufacture, bound with at least six iron hoops; each Tierce to contain three hundred and thirty-six pounds, the price of the Tierces to be included in that demanded for the Beef, and to be delivered into the Commissariat Magazines at Sydney, previous to the 31st day of August next.

The quality and condition of the Beef and Packages to be subject to the inspection and decision of a Board of Survey, appointed in the usual manner.
