THE following Address was presented to His Excellency the Governor, at Maitland, on Thursday the 21st of April:—

To His Excellency Major General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, &c. &c. &c.

We, the free Inhabitants of Maitland and its vicinity, are happy once more to approach Your Excellency with feelings of loyal attachment to our Gracious Sovereign, and with an assurance of personal esteem for you as his Representative; at the same time we gladly embrace this opportunity to congratulate Your Excellency on the proof His Majesty has given of his high estimation of your merit, by conferring on you the honorable distinction of Knight Commander of the Bath.

Although this town is too remote from the seat of Government to be constantly under Your Excellency's view, yet we cannot refrain from expressing our belief, that the frequency of your visits has greatly contributed to the extraordinary rapidity of its increase, which bears testimony of the benefits resulting to the Colony from the improvements carried on under Your Excellency's administration, having originated in your local experience acquired by indefatigable exertion.

Whilst we hope that on this occasion, Your Excellency will see an extreme want of those public buildings, the erection of which, we believe to be in contemplation, we have to thank you for the formation of so splendid a line of road from the

head of the navigation of our river to this town whereby a direct benefit has been conferred on every individual interested in the districts of the Hunter.

Thanking Your Excellency for the lively interest you take in this district, and hoping that your visit will add as much to your health and gratification as it has afforded pleasure to us, we have the honor to remain,

HIS EXCELLENCY'S REPLY.

I receive with great pleasure from the free Inhabitants of Maitland and its vicinity, this renewed declaration of loyalty and attachment to our Gracious Sovereign; and I feel deeply indebted to their kindness for the very flattering expressions of personal regard which their address conveys. The satisfaction which they are pleased to express at His Majesty's gracious notice of my humble exertions in his service, adds greatly to the value which I attach to the Royal favor.

I am happy to find that the Inhabitants of Maitland consider the occasional visits, which I have much pleasure in making to this interesting district, have contributed to its prosperity. It would have given me additional satisfaction to have found that the public works, which I have from time to time directed to be undertaken in this neighbourhood, had advanced with a rapidity commensurate to my wishes, or to the wants of an augmenting population. The great demand for labor in private undertakings, which it would be unwise to check, and the great extent of the Colony, towards every part of which the attention of Government is to be directed, render it impossible to effect at once what it would be desirable to see accomplished for each province. The Inhabitants of Maitland may, however, be assured that no exertion shall be wanting on my part, by a liberal distribution of such aid as the Government can bestow, to second their active industry, and promote the prosperity of the town and district.
