PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., Commanding His Najesty's Forces, Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS it has been Represented to me that a flagrant OUTRAGE has been committed upon the ABORIGINAL NATIVES of WESTERN PORT by a Party of WHITE MEN, and that other OUTRAGES of a similar Nature have been Committed by Stockmen and others upon the Natives in the Neighbourhood of PORT PHILLIP; NOW, therefore, I, THE GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the Power and Authority in me vested, do hereby Proclaim and Notify to all HIS MAJESTY'S Subjects and others whom it may concern, that the whole of the Country on the Southern Coast of New Holland extending Westward from Wilson's Promontory to the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Degree of East Longitude, reckoning from the Meridian of Greenwich, being within the limits of New South Wales, all Persons residing or being within the same, are subject to the Laws in force in the said Colony, and the promptest measures will be taken by me to cause all Persons who may be guilty of any Outrage against the ABORIGINAL sions of the said Company, as to His Majesty in

NATIVES, or of any breach of the said to be brought to Trial before the Supreme Court of New South Wales, and Punished accordingly.

GOD SAVE THE KING!

IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Order of the King in Council, dated 20th November, 1835, appointing the Ports of Sydney, Hobart Town, and Launceston, Free Warehousing Ports for the importation and exportation of Goods into and from any of His Majesty's possessions, be published for general information.

T the Court at Brighton, the 20th day of November 1835,

PRESENT.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British " possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limitis of the East India Company's charter, excepting the possesCouncil shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing in the said Act to the contrary notwith-standing; and that if any goods shall be imported or exported in any manner contrary to any such Order of His Majesty in Council, the same shall be forfeited, together with the ship importing or

exporting the same :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said recited Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the authority thereby in His Majesty in Council in that behalf vested, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from, His Majesty's colonies of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of His Majesty's possessions abroad, except into or from the respective Ports of Sydney, in New South Wales, and of Hobart and Launceston, in Van Diemen's Land; and it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the free importation of goods into, and the free exportation of goods from, the said Ports of Sydney, Hobart Town, and Launceston shall be permitted, and that the same Ports shall be Free Warehousing Ports:

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For the maintenance of good order on the Wharf at Green Hills, Maitland, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council.—5th William IV., No. 13.

- No Ballast or Rubbish to be landed on this Wharf, under a penalty of Twenty Shillings for each offence.
- 2. No bulky Article of any description to remain within twenty feet of the Wharf's edge, nor continue for more than twenty-four hours on any part thereof, under a penalty of Twenty Shillings for each offence.

3. Shells for lime, and Vegetable Matter for manure, to be landed in baskets, and immediately carried away, under a penalty of Twenty

Shillings for each offence.

4. No Cattle, Horses, Sheep, or Pigs to be suffered to remain on the Wharf any longer than a reasonable time for landing or embarking, under a penalty of Twenty Shillings for each offence.

- No Vessel or Boat to make fast to any part of the wooden piers, or to the platform of the Wharf, under a penalty of Twenty Shillings for each offence.
- No Wood to be cut, or Lime to be burnt on any part of this Wharf, under a penalty of Twenty Shilling for each offence.
- The above Fines are independent of the provisions and penalties of the Act of the Governor and Council, 5th William IV., No. 6.
