PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., Commanding His Majesty's Forces, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to me that a flagrant **OUTRAGE** has been committed upon the **ABORIGINAL NATIVES** of **WESTERN PORT** by a Party of **WHITE MEN**, and that other **OUTRAGES** of a similar nature have been Committed by Stockmen and others upon the Natives in the Neighbourhood of **PORT PHILLIP**; **NOW**, therefore, **I, THE GOVERNOR**, in pursuance of the Power and Authority in me vested, do hereby Proclaim and Notify to all **HIS MAJESTY'S** Subjects and others whom it may concern, that the whole of the Country on the Southern Coast of New Holland extending Westward from Wilson's Promontory to the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Degree of East Longitude, reckoning from the Meridian of Greenwich, being within the limits of New South Wales, all Persons residing or being within the same, are subject to the Laws in force in the said Colony, and the promptest measures will be taken by me to cause all Persons who may be guilty of any Outrage against the **ABORIGINAL**

NATIVES, or of any breach of the said Laws, to be brought to Trial before the Supreme Court of New South Wales, and Punished accordingly.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,
ALEXANDER M'LEAY.

1. *A Bill to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act to facilitate the apprehension of transported Felons and Offenders illegally at large, and of Persons found with arms, and suspected to be robbers."*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 5 Gul. IV. No. 9., commonly called the Bushranging Act, will expire on the 31st August next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of two years.

2. *A Bill further to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases in the Supreme Court of New South Wales," and to make further provision for Trial by Jury.*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Gul. IV. No. 3, will expire on the 30th June next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of one year, with a declaratory clause that persons of bad fame and repute, or of dishonest life or conduct, or of immoral character or repute, are

disqualified from serving on Juries in any case, either civil or criminal.

3. *A Bill to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act for the relief of Debtors in execution for debts which they are unable to pay."*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Gul. IV. No. 11, will expire on the 31st of August next, it is proposed to continue it for a further period of two years.

4. *A Bill to remove doubts as to the validity of Grants to Land in New South Wales.*

Doubts having arisen as to the validity of Grants to Land in New South Wales, in consequence of their having been issued in the name of the Governors and Lieutenant Governors of the Colony; instead of in the name of His Majesty, and the King having graciously signified his Royal pleasure through the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies that all Grants to Land so issued should be declared valid in law, it is proposed to quiet the titles of all persons holding or entitled to Lands so granted, by declaring such Grants to be as valid and effectual in law, and binding upon His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, as if such Grants had been issued in the name of His Majesty, or of either His Majesty's two last Royal Predecessors.
