PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke K. C. B. Captain General and Governor in Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

HEREAS, by a Proclamation under my hand and seal, bearing date the First day of July, One thousand eight hundred and thirtyfour, I did in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf appoint and order that Courts of General Quarter Sessions should be holden at certain places and times as is therein set forth; And whereas it hath been represented to me the said Governor that it would be expedient for the Courts of General Quarter Sessions to be holden on other days than those fixed by the said Proclamation for holding the same respectively, Now therefore, I the said Governor, in pursuance of the said power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do direct and appoint that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall henceforth be holden at the several Towns and places and at the respective times hereinafter particularly mentioned, that is to say :-

At Sydney, on the First Monday in the respective Months of January, April, July, and October,

respective Months of February, May, August, "of Tolls thereon;" '- It is amongstother things

At Parramatta, on the Second Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Windsor, on the Thursday next after the Second Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every

At Bathurst, on the Fourth Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Maitland, on the Second Monday in the respective Months of March, June, September, fences to be built and set up, as shall be deemed and December, in every Year.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., commanding His Majesty's Forces, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

THEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the present Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for re-"pealing so much of an Act intituled An Act to " continue, until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, and other " sums of Money imposed by the Governors of " New South Wales, and for other purposes as " relates to the levying of Tolls in New South "' Wales, and for raising a Fund towards making, At Campbelltown, on the First Monday in the "and Ferries, and for regulating the collection " ' repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road, which has been or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense; and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same; and to cause such gates, bars, chains, rails, and necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and

paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act: And whereas by my Proclamation bearing date the Twentieth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, certain places were appointed for the collection of certain Tolls whereat they have been collected, and it has become necessary to appoint other places for that purpose, Now I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do by this my Proclamation appoint the following places in addition to those formerly named, at which Toll-Gates shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected to the amount and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Ordinance; —that is to say,

There shall be a Toll-Gate—

1. On the road from Sydney to Parramatta, at the top of the hill at Grose Farm, where a new Toll-Gate has been erected, instead of at the former Sydney Toll-Gate near the Benevoleut Asylum, which has been taken down and removed.

2. On the Old Botany Road at or near its junction with the road from Sydney to Parramatta, near

the Benevolent Asylum.

3. On the Cook's River Road at or near its junction with the road from Sydney to Parramatta,

near the Brisbane Distillery.

Of which several Toll-Gates all Persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice, according to the provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance.

18 Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the general objects of the following Bills about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council.

By His Excellency's Command, ALEXANDER M'LEAY.

1. A Bill to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands.

The unauthorised occupation of the Waste Lands of the Colony, being derogatory to the rights of the Crown and conducive to many illegal and dishonest practices, and the laws at present in force being insufficient for the speedy removal of intruders; it is proposed that from and after the next, any person found day of in the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands

shall be subject to the following Penalties; that is to say, for the first offence £10, for the second £20, and for the third, or any subsequent offence, £50;-to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, upon the information and complaint on eath of any Commissioner of Crown Lands, or of parish unnamed, at Baromebin; bounded on the

carriages from passing, unless there shall be then any Proprietor or Lessee, of Land, or of his Agent (being free), provided that no conviction for a second or subsequent offence shall take place within one month of the former conviction. Costs to be recovered against the complainant in default of proof of the information, and treble costs if the complaint be without reasonable grounds.

Any Commissioner of Crown Lands, or Justice of the Peace, by himself or bailiff, to be authorised to seize Cattle or other animals found trespassing on Crown Lands, and if found within twenty miles of an established Pound to drive the same thereto; or, otherwise to detain and impound them at the nearest convenient place, which for the purposes of the Act shall be deemed to be a lawful Pound; Cattle and other animals so impounded to be subject to certain rates and charges.

Proceedings had under the Act not to affect
