PORT PHILLIP.

HIS Majesty's Government having authorised the location of Settlers on the vacant Crown Lands adjacent to the shores of Port Phillip under the same Regulations as are now in force for the alienation of Crown Lands in other parts of New South Wales, and several persons having already passed over there from Van Diemen's Land, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint Captain WILLIAM LONSDALE, of the 4th, or King's Own Regiment, to be Police Magistrate for that district, of which all persons concerned are hereby required to take notice.

Arrangements are in progress for effecting the Survey and Measurement of such parts of the Land near Port Phillip as it may be expedient to dispose of in the first instance; but until the same have been completed, of which due notice will be given, no applications for purchase can be entertained. In the mean time, it is distinctly to be understood by those persons who may be desirous of resorting to Port Phillip from other parts of New South Wales, or from Van Diemen's Land, that no advantage will be obtained by the occupation of any land at that place previously to its conveyance by a legal instrument from the Government of New South Wales, as without such title the land (unless required for public purposes) will be subject to be put up for competition at a Public Sale, and sold to the best bidder.

This allotment was originally advertised in the name of Benjamin Kirkby, on the 3rd March, 1835.

Or. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ p., allotment No. 14 of section No. 53, Sydney; bounded on the west by Kent-street, bearing south 4 degrees east 29 links, then south 14 degrees 30 minutes east 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ links; on the south by allotment No. 15, bearing east 4 degrees north 59 links; on the east by allotment No. 13, bearing north 12 degrees west 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ links; and on the north by Erskine-street, bearing west 13 degrees 30 minutes south 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ links.

This allotment was originally advertised in the name of the Rev. John Joseph Terry and Caleb Wilson, on the 18th August, 1835.

THOMAS WILLS and GEORGE TERRY HOWE, a portion of, situated in King-street, Oa. 1r. 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ p., allotment No. 11 of section No. 54, Sydney; bounded on the west by Sussex-street, bearing south 16 degrees 15 minutes east 230 links; on the south by King-street west, bearing east 11 degrees 30 minutes north 170 links; on the east by allotments Nos. 12 and 13, bearing north 12 degrees 30 minutes west 41 links, then west 9 degrees south 2 links, then north 12 degrees west 23 links, then north 15 degrees west 59 links, then east 13 degrees north 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ links; then north 13 degrees west 98 links, then north 14 degrees 30 minutes west 25 links; and on the north by allotment No. 10, bearing west 16 degrees south 190 links.

This allotment was originally advertised in the name of William Henry Moore, on the 3d March, 1835.

10. JAMES ARNDELL, 600 acres, County of Cumberland, parishes of Maroota and Comelia (originally promised to Thomas Arndell), commencing at the north corner of Thomas Johnstone's grant of 60 acres; bounded on the west by a line bearing north 33 degrees east 91 chains 80 links; on the north by a line east 25 degrees south 66 chains; on the east by a line south 33 degrees west 101 chains; and on the south by a line west 33 degrees north 66 chains.

11. ELIZABETH BATES, 100 acres, County of Camden, parish unnamed, at Minumurra, Illawarra (originally promised to George Bates); bounded on the north by John Ritchie's 300 acres, being a line extending west 40 chains along the south side thereof from the north-west corner of John Chard's 50 acres; on the west by a line extending south to a branch out of the Minumurra Rivulet, and along that rivulet; on the south by a line extending east to the south-west corner of John Chard's 50 acres; and on the east by a line extending north 75 chains along the west side of John Chard's 50 acres from the south-west to the north-west corner thereof.

12. ALEXANDER BERRY, 600 acres, County of St. Vincent, parish unnamed, at Shoalhaven (originally promised to William Wetherman), commencing on the Shoalhaven River, at the north-east corner of Messrs. Berry and Wolstonecraft's 2320 acres purchase, and bounded on the west by part of the eastern boundary of the said purchase, being a line south 90 chains; on the south by the said purchase, being a line east 80 chains; on the east by part of the western boundary of Edward Wolstonecraft's 2000 acres grant, being a line north to the Shoalhaven River; and on the north by that river to the north-west corner.

This land was advertised on the 22d July, 1833, in the name of the original donee.

13. JOHN COBB, 600 acres, County of Northumberland, *parish of Ovingham* (originally promised to John Beveridge), commencing at the south-east corner of Cobb's 600 acre farm, and bounded on the north by a line bearing west 80 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 80 chains; and on the east by Lang's farm, being a line bearing north 80 chains to the south-east corner of Cobb's farm as aforesaid.

This land was advertised on the 30th March, 1835, in favor of the original donee.

14. JOHN CUNNEENE, 100 acres, County of Durham, *parish of Vahe* (originally promised to Daniel Pollard), commencing at the south-west corner of Henry Snell's land, on Falbrook, and bounded on the east by Snell's west boundary line bearing north 55 chains; on the north by a west line of 23 chains; on the west by a south line of 39 chains and 50 links to Falbrook; and on the south by Falbrook to the south-west corner of Henry Snell's land as aforesaid. The bearings are magnetic.

This land was advertised in the name of the original donee on the 1st June, 1836.

15. RICHARD FITZGERALD, 100 acres, County of Northumberland, *parish unnamed, at Brisbane Water* (originally promised to George Tilley), commencing at Mulling's north-east corner, and bounded on the south by a line east 53 chains; on the east by a line north 25 chains; on the north by a line west 39 chains to Brisbane Water; and on the west by that water.

16. SARAH GALVIN, in trust for her Son, JOHN GALVIN, a minor, 50 acres, County of Camden, *parish unnamed, at Wombat Brush* (originally granted to John Wood), commencing at the south-east corner of J. Mehan's 800 acres, and bounded on the north by a line west 33 chains 34 links; on the west by a line south 15 chains; on the south by a line east 33 chains 34 links to the west boundary of Leak's 100 acres; and on the east by part of Leak's western boundary, being a line north 15 chains.

17. HENRY HOWEY and MARIA MATILDA, his Wife, 124 acres, County of Cumberland, *parish of Melville*, (being a portion of a larger grant originally promised to William Minchin), commencing at the north-east corner of the said William Minchin's 1000 acres grant called Minchinbury, bounded on the west by a line bearing south 75 chains; on the south by a line east 25 chains 50 links to a road; on the east by that road, bearing north 32 chains 15 links; on the north by William Brown's farm, being a line west 15 chains 50 links; again on the east by William Brown's farm, being a line north to the Western Road; and again on the north by that road to the commencing corner.

This land was advertised on the 23rd April, 1833, in favor of the original donee.

18. MARGARET KENNEDY, 60 acres, County of Camden, *parish unnamed, at Illawarra*, (originally promised to Michael Brennan), bounded on the north by a line bearing west 56 chains; on the west by a line, bearing south 14 chains; on the south by a line, bearing east 46 chains; and on the east by the sea coast.

This land was advertised on the 23rd October, 1832, in favor of the original donee.

19. WILLIAM LAWSON, SENIOR, 2560 acres, County of Bathurst, *parish of Carlton*, (originally promised to William S. Woodward), bounded on the north by a line west 128 chains, commencing at the Cadianyalong or Oak Rivulet; on the west by a line south 275 chains to the Belubulu River; on the south by the Belubulu River to its confluence with Cadianyalong Rivulet; and on the east by the Cadianyalong Rivulet to the point of commencement.

20. PRICE MORRIS, 50 acres, County of Cook, *parish unnamed*, (originally granted to William Melville), on the west bank of the Macdonald River; bounded on the north by a line bearing west 30 degrees south 21 chains; on the west by a line south 10 degrees east 27 chains; on the south by a line east 30 degrees north 21 chains to the Macdonald River; and on the east by that River.

This land was advertised on the 30th March, 1835, in favor of the original donee.

21. ELIZABETH MUIR, 94 acres, County of Northumberland, *parish of Maitland*, (being a portion of the 116 acres originally promised to George Mitchell), which 116 acres is bounded on the west by Riley's allotment bearing south 38 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 32 chains; partly on the east by a line bearing north 30 chains; partly on the north by Martyn's farm, bearing west 19 chains; on the residue of the east by a line bearing north to Hunter's River, and on the residue of the north by that River.

This land was advertised on the 6th November, 1832, in favor of the original donee.

22. JOHN PROSSER, 50 acres, county of Hunter, *parish unnamed, on the Macdonald River*, (originally granted to Thomas Prosser), commencing at the south-east corner on the Macdonald River, and bounded on the west by a line north 8 chains; on the north by a line bearing north 70 degrees west 39 chains to the Macdonald River; and on the east by that river to the south-east corner aforesaid.

23. A. B. SPARK, 100 acres, county of Hunter, *on the Wollombi*, (originally promised to Charles Langham); bounded on the north by a line bearing east 45 chains, to the south branch of Wollombi Brook, called Sugar Loaf Creek; on the east by that creek to the north boundary of W. Aird's land; on the south by part of the northern boundaries of W. Aird's and H. Finch's lands, bearing west 59 chains; and on the west by a line bearing north 20 chains.

This land was advertised on 30th March, 1835, in favor of the original donee.

24. JOHN WESGATE, 100 acres, county of Northumberland, *parish of Stockrington*, (originally promised to Gilbert Macleod,) commencing at the north-east corner of John Palmer's 600 acres farm, and bounded on the south by 25 chains of its north boundary line, bearing west by compass; on the west by a north line by compass of 40 chains to the south boundary of Brooks' farm; on the north by an east line by compass of 25 chains; and on the east by a south line by compass of 40 chains to the commencing south-east corner.

This land was advertised on the 7th November, 1832, in favor of the original donee.
