ANNO SEXTO AND SEPTIMO  
 GULIELMI IV. REGIS.

Cap. XLVI.

An Act to continue until the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, an Act of the Ninth Year of His late Majesty, for the Administration of Justice in *New South Wales* and *Van Diemen's Land*. 28th July, 1836.

**W**HEREAS, an Act was passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "*An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice* 9 G. 4 c. 83. in *New South Wales* and *Van Diemen's Land*, and for the more effectual Government thereof; and for other Purposes relating thereto:" And whereas the said Act will expire at the End of the Session of Parliament next following the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and it is expedient to continue the said Act for a limited time: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said Act shall be and the same is hereby continued until the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and thenceforward until the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

MARKET DUES.
