ANNO SEXTO AND SEPTIMO GULIELMI IV. REGIS.

Cap. XLVI.

An Act to continue until the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, an Act of the Ninth Year of His late Majesty, for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land. 28th July, 1836.

WHEREAS, an Act was passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice 9 G. 4 c. 83. in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, and for the more effectual Government thereof; and for other Purposes relating thereto: ' And whereas the said Act will expire at the End of the Session of Parliament next following the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and it is expedient to continue the said Act for a limited time: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said Act shall be and the same is Recited Act hereby continued until the Thirtyfirst Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, and thenceforward until the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

Promised by Sir Ralph Darling on 6th February, 1829, to George Mossman, and possession authorised on 24th July, 1829, as a primary grant, but now advertised at the Grantee's request, for

O be Let by PUBLIC AUCTION, in the George-street Market Building, Letter, C, on Thursday, the 22nd day of December instant, at One o'Clock, P. M., the Market Dues authorised and imposed by the Act of the Governor and Council 2nd William 4, No. 16, and arising and to be collected during the twelve months next after, and commencing the 1st day of January, 1837, in the towns undermentioned, under and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and of 4th William IV., No. 7, and to the Market Rules and Regulations published in the Government Gazette of 3rd March, 1834, and to all other Rules and Regulations which shall at any time during the said term of twelve months be made and in force, for the Regulation of any, or all of the Markets undermentioned, viz.-

1.-In Sydney, George-street Market; the Market Dues demandable for the Stalls of the four Buildings, reserving from the south-east Building, letter C, the constant use of one Stall for the Clerk of the Market, and the use of another Stall whenever required by the Government for the sale of land and other property.
