QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His Present Majesty, entitled an "*Act for subjecting Vessels coming to New South Wales, from certain places, to the performance of Quarantine*;" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make such orders as shall be deemed necessary and expedient, in any particular case or cases, with respect to Vessels arriving and having any infectious disease on board: and all such orders so made shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all intents and purposes, with respect to the Commander, Master, or other person having charge of any Vessel, and all other persons on board the same, as well as with respect to any other persons having any intercourse or communication with them, and to the Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments, to which they may respectively become liable, as any order or orders concerning Quarantine made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and notified by proclamation as therein mentioned; and whereas, information has been given to the Governor of the said Colony, and to the Executive Council thereof, that a contagious Fever has been, and still is, on board the ship *Lady Macnaghten*, lately arrived in the Harbour of Port Jackson, and it is necessary to prevent the spreading or communication of such infectious disease to the Inhabitants of the Colony.

Now, therefore, by Command of His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, it is hereby notified that an infectious disease, known as Contagious Fever, prevails on board the said ship *Lady Macnaghten*, and it is hereby further ordered and directed that the said ship, together with the Master, crew, passengers, and contents of, or belonging thereto, shall immediately be placed in Quarantine at the usual station at Spring Cove, in the Harbour of Port Jackson, and such of the crew and passengers, and contents of the said ship,

as may be deemed proper by the surgeon in charge, shall be forthwith landed and kept in Quarantine on the usual Quarantine Ground at Spring Cove, until further orders; and all persons are hereby prohibited from having any communication whatsoever with the said ship whilst under Quarantine, or from going under any pretext whatsoever into Spring Cove, whilst the said ship is lying there with the Yellow Flag flying; and all persons are also hereby strictly prohibited from having any communication whatsoever with the said Quarantine Ground at Spring Cove, or from going under any pretence whatsoever within the limits of the same, until the said ship, and the crew, passengers, and contents thereof, shall be duly released from Quarantine; of which all persons are required to take notice, under the Penalties and restrictions imposed by the said recited Act for any violation of the Regulations relating to Quarantine, therein particularly set forth.

IN reference to the Act of the GOVERNOR and Council, 7 Wm. IV., No. 4, For restraining the ~~unauthorised~~ occupation of Crown Lands, and to the regulation consequent upon it, dated the 1st October, 1836; His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the following additional list, obtained from the Colonial Treasurer, of Persons who have taken out Licenses for depasturing Crown Lands, situated beyond the boundaries of location, upon the payment of the established fee, be published for general information, and as a guide to the Commissioners appointed to carry the Regulations in question into effect.
