COURT OF CLAIMS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following CLAIMS for DEEDS of GRANT of Lands and Town Allotments, will be ready for examination by the Commissioners appointed for that purpose under the Act of Council 5th Wm. IV. No. 21, at the expiration of Two Months from this date, before which day any Caveat or Counter Claim must be entered at this Office. Due notice will be given of the days appointed for the hearings.

Case No. 71.—JOHN EDYE MANNING, 300 acres, in the County of Durham, parish unnamed, at William River, commencing at the north-east corner, and bounded on the north by a west line by compass of 100 chains; on the west by a south line by compass of 30 chains; on the south by an east line by compass of 97 chains; and on the east by the River William to the north-east corner aforesaid.

This land was promised on the 3rd September, 1825, by Sir Thomas Brisbane to John Fowler, deceased, in whose name a description of the land was advertised in the Gazette of 31st October, 1832, page 373, with a view to the preparation of a Deed of Grant, which was prepared accordingly, but Fowler died previous to its execution. Mr. Manning claims under a Power of Attorney, on behalf of John Fowler, of Clonnaugh, in the County of Wexford, nephew of the promisee.

Case No. 72.—HANNAH LITTON BROWN, 20 perches, in the County of Cumberland, town of Sydney, parish of Saint Lawrence, allotment No. 7 of section No. 16; bounded on the north by Park-street, bearing west 2 degrees south 120 links; on the west by Castlereagh-street, bearing south 3 degrees 30 minutes east 105 links; on the south by No. 8 allotment, bearing east 3 degrees north 119 links; and on the east by No. 6 allotment, bearing north 3 degrees 30 minutes west 104 links.

This allotment it is alleged was originally promised by Governor Macquarie to Samuel Rowley, and was advertised preparatory to the preparation of the Deed of Grant in the Notice of 2nd November, 1831, in the name of William Brown, now

deceased; see Gazette of November 3rd, 1831. Mrs. Brown claims as the purchaser from Rowley prior to her marriage.

Case No. 73.—JOSHUA THORP, 30 acres, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Saint George, at Cook's River; bounded on the north by a line west 30 chains, commencing at Martin's south-west corner; on the west by a line south 18 chains; and on the south and east by a creek running into Cook's River, called Woolli Creek.

This land was in the occupation of James Bricly, deceased; a Deed of Grant was prepared in his favour in pursuance of the Advertisement in the Gazette of 20th September, 1831, as No. 23, but he died previous to its execution, and devised the land to Mary Bricly, and Thorp claims as having purchased from R. Roberts, her husband.

Case No. 74.—PATRICK HILL, 700 acres, in the County of Camden, parish unnamed, at the Kangaroo Ground, commencing at the south-west corner, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 105 chains; on the north by a line bearing east 63 chains; on the east by a line bearing south 61 chains to the Kangaroo River; and on the south by that river to the south-west corner aforesaid.

This land was promised by Governor Macquarie to the late Richard Brooks. Hill claims as Trustee and Executor.

Case No. 75.—GEORGE BARBER, 640 acres, in the County of King, parish unnamed, at Yass; bounded on the east by a line north 196 chains, commencing near Shelly's crossing-place, a ford over the Yass River; on the north by a line west 40 chains; on the west by a line south 96 chains; and on the south-west and south by the Yass River to the point of commencement.

This land was promised on the 3rd October, 1829, to Thomas Meehan, deceased. Barber claims as a purchaser from Meehan.

Case No. 76.—JOHN THORN, 67 perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Saint John, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 81 in section No. 16, situate on the north side of Macquarie-street; bounded on the west by a line 3 chains 68 links; on the north by a line 1 chain 5 links; on the east by a line to Macquarie-street 3 chains 70 links; and on the south by that street 1 chain 5 links.

This allotment is leased to James Bradley by Sir Thomas Brisbane for twenty-one years, from 30th June, 1823. The Sheriff sold, it is alleged, to Thomas Rose—Rose to Thomas Wilson—Wilson to Samuel Gilbert—and Gilbert to claimant. The land is charted as being in the occupation of Robert Tomlinson.

Case No. 77.—THOMAS STEELE, 2,000 acres, in the County of Durham, parish unnamed, at Carrow Brook; commencing at the western extreme of the north boundary line of James Black's grant of 2,560 acres, and bounded on the south by an east line of 109 chains; on the east by a north line of 180 chains; on the north by a west line of 104 chains to Carrow Brook; and on the west by Carrow Brook downwards to the western extreme of the north boundary line of the aforesaid grant of James Black.

This land was promised to James Busby on the 8th May, 1824, by Sir Thomas Brisbane, and advertised with a view to the preparation of the Deed in his name in the Gazette of 18th November,

1835, page 823. Busby, it is alleged, sold to Arnold—Arnold to Black—and Black to the claimant. Busby, Arnold, and Black, have left the Colony.

Case No. 78.—Rev. THOMAS HASSALL, 4 acres, 2 roods, 21 perches, in the County of Cumberland, Parish of St. John, Town of Paramatta, section No. 18, allotment numbered 45; bounded on the north by George-street, south 78 degrees, east 686 links; on the east by Danger's and Broughton's allotments, south 8 degrees, west 6 chains 55 links to Macquarie-street; on the south by Macquarie-street, north 84½ degrees, west 659 links; and on the west by Charles-street, south 6 degrees, east 726 links.

This allotment originally formed three allotments, leased by the Crown to Rowland Hassall, Smith, and Ikins. Smith and Ikins, it is alleged, sold to Rowland Hassall, who bequeathed to his wife Elizabeth Hassall (now deceased), for her life, and then to claimant.

Case No. 79.—THOMAS HORTON JAMES, 43 rods in the County of Cumberland, Parish of St. John, Town of Paramatta, allotment No. 3, in section No. 24; bounded on the north by a line 2 chains 10 links; on the west by a line 84 links to the north boundary of No. 51, Phillip-street, by that boundary 27 links, and by a line 50 links; on the south by a line to Church-street 1 chain 66 links; and on the east by that street 1 chain 45 links.

This allotment is leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years, from the 30th June 1823, to John Beale. Beale, it is alleged, mortgaged to John Norris, and to George Howell, and William Knight, and they sold by auction to Charles Marsh, who sold to claimant.

Case No. 80.—PETER WILLIAM PLOMER, 24 perches, County of Cumberland, Town of Sydney, Parish of St. Lawrence, allotment No. 2, of section No. 17; bounded on the east by Castle-reagh-street, bearing north 3 degrees 30 minutes west 77 links; on the north by No. 3 allotment, bearing west 3 degrees south 196 links; on the west by No. 18 allotment, bearing south 4 degrees east 77 links; and on the south by No. 20 and No. 21 allotments, bearing east 3 degrees north 195 links.

This allotment was advertised with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant, in the name of George Taylor, in the Notice of 16th December, 1831 (see Gazette of Dec. 17th), claimant, it is alleged, purchased from Taylor, who has left the Colony.

Case No. 81.—MARGARET GIBBONS, 1 rood, 37 perches, in the County of Cumberland, Town of Sydney, and Parish of St. Phillip, bounded on the east by Kent-street, bearing north 15 degrees 30 minutes west 118½ links, then east 14 degrees north 8½ links, then north 14 degrees west 170 links; on the north by allotment No. 15, bearing west 15 degrees south 89 links, then south 14 degrees east 12½ links, then west 17 degrees south, 144 links; on the west by allotments Nos. 9, 10, and 11, bearing south 16 degrees east 65 links, then south 14 degrees 30 minutes east 99 links, then east 3 links, then south 13 degrees east 98 links; and on the south by allotment No. 13, bearing east 13 degrees north 178 links.

This allotment was advertised in the Gazette of March the 4th, 1835, page 126, with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant in the name of Mathew John Gibbons, now deceased. Mrs. Gibbons claims as sole Legatee and Executrix.

Case No. 82.—HENRY RUSSELL, 50 acres, in the County of Cumberland, Parish of South Colah, bounded on the north by a line east 20 degrees north 45 chains, commencing at Pincham's south-west corner; on the east by a line south 20 degrees east 13 chains; on the south by a line west 20 degrees south 37 chains; and on the west by a line north-west 15 chains.

This land was promised by Governor Macquarie, on the 10th September 1818, to Mary Russell, in whose name a description thereof was advertised in the Gazette of the 14th October 1831, as No. 7, with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant. Henry Russell claims as the husband of the promisee.
