THE following Address was presented to His Excellency the GOVERNOR, at Port Phillip, on the 4th tustant:—

To His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c. &c.

SIR,—We, the undersigned Inhabitants of Port Phillip, beg to approach your Excellency, and offer our congratulations upon your safe arrival in this portion of your Government.

The pleasure we experience in thus addressing your Excellency is enhanced by the consideration that your arrival dissipates the reports which had reached us of your Excellency's resignation, and bids us hope that the Colony may continue to derive advantage from the exercise of those talents which have always been exerted for, and have tended materially to advance its prosperity.

We cannot sufficiently thank your Excellency for having at so early a period visited this newly settled District. It is very important that the sites of towns, and other preliminary arrangements, should be speedily and efficiently determined, and we congratulate ourselves that these will be effected under your Excellency's personal superintendence.

We may perhaps be allowed to express our regret that so few are present to meet your Excellency on this occasion, but the absence of several from the District, and the distant position of the residences of others, have prevented many from manifesting their respect and attachment to your Excellency, and joining us in welcoming you to this interesting and important part of New South Wales.

His Excellency's answer.

GENTLEMEN,—I thank you for the kind manner in which you have welcomed my arrival in this promising Settlement. In the belief that its future progress will realise the sanguine expectations

entertained regarding it, I have felt very strongly the necessity of fixing at once those points of occupation which are obviously of the greatest importance, in order to prevent the waste of capital, and to give to the industry of the Settlers a permanent direction. In coming among you for this purpose, I see no reason, notwithstanding the temporary effects of a dry summer, to doubt the eminent adaptation of the vast tract of country by which you are surrounded, to those lucrative pastoral objects which have been so successfully pursued in other parts of this Colony. The fostering care of His Majesty's Government will, I am assured, be never wanting to promote and protect to the utmost those useful pursuits. The difficulty of introducing all the advantages of order and society into new and remote Settlements is well known, but I trust that in the present instance the praiseworthy disposition evinced by the Inhabitants will continue to characterise the District, and to aid the efforts of Government in securing its peace and prosperity.

This land was promised on the 3rd September, 1825, by Sir Thomas Brisbane to John Fowler, deceased, in whose name a description of the land was advertised in the Gazette of 31st October, 1832, page 373, with a view to the preparation of a Deed of Grant, which was prepared accordingly, but Fowler died previous to its execution. Mr. Manning claims under a Power of Attorney, on behalf of John Fowler, of Clonnaugh, in the County of Wexford, nephew of the promisee.

This allotment it is alleged was originally promised by Governor Macquarie to Samuel Rowley, and was advertised preparatory to the preparation of the Deed of Grant in the Notice of 2nd November, 1831, in the name of William Brown, now deceased; see Gazette of November 3rd, 1831. Mrs. Brown claims as the purchaser from Rowley prior to her marriage.

Case No. 73.—Joshua Thorp, 30 acres, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Saint George, at Cook's River; bounded on the north by a line west 30 chains, commencing at Martin's southwest corner; on the west by a line south 18 chains; and on the south and east by a creek running into Cook's River, called Woolli Creek.

This land was in the occupation of James Bricly, deceased; a Deed of Grant was prepared in his favour in pursuance of the Advertisement in the Gazette of 20th September, 1831, as No. 23, but he died previous to its execution, and devised the land to Mury Bricly, and Thorp claims as having purchased from R. Roberts, her husband.

Case No. 74.—Patrick Hill, 700 acres, in the County of Camden, parish unnamed, at the Kangaroo Ground, commencing at the south-west corner, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 105 chains; on the north by a line bearing east 63 chains; on the east by a line bearing south 61 chains to the Kangaroo River; and on the south by that river to the south-west corner aforesaid.

This land was promised by Governor Macquarie to the late Richard Brooks. Hill claims as Trustee and Executor.

This land was promised on the 3rd October, 1829, to Thomas Mechan, deceased. Barber claims as a purchaser from Meehan.

Case No. 77 .- THOMAS STEELE, 2,000 acres, in the County of Durham, parish unnamed, at Carrow Brook; commencing at the western extreme of the north boundary line of James Black's

This allotment is leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years, from the 30th June 1823, to John Beale. Beale, it is alleged, mortgaged to John Norris, and to George Howell, and William Knight, and they sold by auction to Charles Marsh,

who sold to claimant.
