BASS'S STRAITS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following copy of a letter, addressed to His Excellency, by WILLIAM HOBSON, Esq., Captain of His Majesty's Ship *Rattlesnake*, enclosing the copy of a communication made by him to the Hydrographer of the Navy, describing the position of the CROCODILE ROCK, IN BASS'S STRAITS, as determined by bearings taken on board the *Rattlesnake*, on the 28th of February, 1837.

SIR,—I have the honor to enclose for general information, the copy of a letter I addressed to the Hydrographer of His Majesty's Navy, describing the position of the Crocodile Rock, in Bass's Straits, as determined by bearings taken on board His Majesty's Ship *Rattlesnake*, under my command, on the 28th of February last.

SIR,—I have the honor and satisfaction to acquaint you, that the situation of the Crocodile Rock in Bass's Straits, which has hitherto been much dreaded from its doubtful position in the Charts, was fully and satisfactorily determined on

the 28th ultimo, by bearings taken on board H. M. Ship *Rattlesnake*, under my command.

As I had the good fortune, when the rock was seen to have as my guest, that eminent Surveyor, Captain P. P. King, R. N., I give you the position of the rock as determined by his angles and bearings; which the public will receive with a degree of confidence, that I could not hope would attach to any observation of mine.

The S. E. end of the Crocodile Rock, for a space of probably fifty yards, is elevated about 3 or 4 feet above the level of the sea at high water, from which a reef appears to extend three-quarters of a mile to the N. W.

Soundings in coral bottom were obtained at one mile south from the reef in 40 fathoms; $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile west in 42; and 3 miles N. W. in 45 fathoms.

Crocodile Rock bears S. 42° E. magnetic, (S. 34° E. true) 6 miles from Redondo.

Ditto ditto bears N. 47° W. magnetic, (N. 40° W. true) $11\frac{1}{3}$ miles from Sir Roger Curtis' Island summit.

Ditto ditto bears West, magnetic, (N. 83° W. true) $13\frac{1}{3}$ miles from the Devil's Tower.

DIRECTIONS TO AVOID THE CROCODILE ROCK.

From the Eastward—Pass to the southward of the Devil's Tower, and steer W. by S. (magnetic) until Redondo bears to the northward of N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. (magnetic).

From the Westward—As the rock, when in a line with the Devil's Tower, bears east by keeping the Tower to the northward of E. by N., or to southward of E. by S., it will be easily avoided. When the tide is ebb the stream sets to the northward, and must be allowed for. The sea breaks constantly upon the rock. Its position is very near the situation assigned to it on Captain Flinders' Chart of Bass's Straits.

CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that applications for pecuniary aid from the Colonial Treasury for the support of Dispensaries, Schools, or other Charitable Institutions established by Societies or Individuals, and unconnected with the local Government, are to be addressed to the Colonial Secretary, and delivered at his Office in Sydney, on or before the 31st of May next.

All such applications are to be made by the trustees, committee, treasurer, or other person or persons managing the affairs of the Institution, and are to contain a brief account of the objects for which it has been established, and of the service it has rendered to the public in the past year, with the names of the persons forming the society. The application is to be accompanied by a statement of the funds of the Institution, shewing the amount received in the last year by private contributions, or from public bodies, the amount and general particulars of expenditure during the same period, and the balance actually in hand, on the 1st day of January of the present year, together with a statement of any debts then chargeable against the Institution.

The statement of accounts is to be verified by a declaration from the treasurer or manager of the funds of the Institution in the following form:—

"I do hereby declare and certify, that to the best of my knowledge and belief, the foregoing account is a true and *bona fide* statement of the whole funds, receipts, and expenditure of the during the year 183 , and of the balance in hand, and the debts of the Institution, upon the 1st of January, 1837. If the objects of the Institution, and the manner of conducting it, are such as in the opinion of the Governor to render it deserving of support from the public funds, application will be made to the Legislative Council for such aid as it may be deemed proper to grant, in no case exceeding the amount of private contributions and donations from public bodies.

If the Council shall think fit to appropriate a sum towards the support of the Institution, it will be placed on a supplementary estimate for the present year, and issued immediately after being granted.
