THE following Address was presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Inhabitants of the District of Illawarra, on the 2d of May, 1837:—

To His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., Governor of New South Wales, &c. &c. &c.

SIR,

We, the undersigned Inhabitants of the District of Illawarra, are happy to have an opportunity of offering to your Excellency our sincere and hearty congratulations on your arrival again in this fertile District, and to assure your Excellency of our unabated respect and esteem.

During your visit about four years since, the capabilities of this part of the country did not escape your Excellency's penetration. The fertility of the soil, the temperature of the climate, the proximity to the Capital, the Harbour of Wollongong, attracted your attention, and as Governor of the Colony, desirous to advance Australia, "you sought to promote the success of her future Garden."

Since your Excellency's second visit, Wollongong and its vicinity have assumed a new aspect. Several streets have been formed, and building is in progress in the Township laid out under your directions. Many miles of road, that would be creditable in the mother country, have been made, and suitable bridges erected, to facilitate communication with the various parts of the Settlement. The passage down the mountain has been reduced from an anxious and dangerous labour to an easy and interesting ride; and moorings have been laid down in the harbour, which have proved highly serviceable.

We are happy to believe, that on the present occasion your Excellency has the intention to direct an extension of these advantages, with a view to the more perfect development of the resources of the District.

That your Excellency may long enjoy health and happiness, is the sincere wish of

HIS EXCELLENCY'S ANSWER.

GENTLEMEN,—You are right in believing that from the time of my first visit to your fertile district, I have been strongly impressed with its great value, as affording the future means of a most plentiful supply of agricultural, but especially of garden produce to the market of Sydney, and that I have been in proportion desirous to facilitate your communication with the Capital, both by sea and land.

The paucity of labour at the command of the Government has hitherto much delayed the improvements which I have been so anxious to accomplish, but I have a satisfaction which can hardly be exceeded by your own, in perceiving all the promised advantages now nearly within your reach, and that the value of your property and the spirit of enterprise and industry keep pace with the opening prospect. A steam communication is, I am happy to learn, about to be established, and I trust with the able assistance of the Colonial Engineer I may soon be able, without infringing upon other necessary undertakings in different parts of the Colony, to render the Harbour of Wollongong more commodious for that moderate number of small vessels which are likely to be required for the conveyance of your produce to Sydney.

It is principally with this object that I have made the present visit to your neighbourhood, and in the kind feeling with which you have received me, I have on this, as on former occasions, found the best reward of the attention it has been my pleasure to bestow upon a district, where the soil and the inhabitants prove equally grateful for the care bestowed upon them.
