**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,  
E. DEAS THOMSON.*

1.—*A Bill further to continue for a limited time, an Act entitled—“An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases in the Supreme Court of New South Wales,” and to make further provision for Trial by Jury.*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Gnl. IV., No. 3, will expire on the 30th June next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of one year.

2.—*A Bill to give any Person or Persons appointed by the Governor to be Town Surveyor in Sydney, or appointed to the charge of tracing, laying out, making, repairing, and fencing in roads, or to the charge of constructing or repairing bridges, the same powers and indemnities as are given by former Acts to the Surveyor-General and his assistants. Also, to give to any Person appointed by the Governor to be Superintendent of an Iron-gang, or Superintendent of any party of Convicts, employed on the roads or public works in the Colony, the same power and authority to punish such Convicts for misconduct, as is given to an Officer of the Surveyor-General's department, under the provisions of the 3rd William IV., No. 3, sec. 28.*

**A** REPORT having been made to the GOVERNOR of certain Bushrangers having provided themselves with Fire-arms from the out-stations of private Individuals, in a manner highly discreditable to the Parties from whom they were obtained, His Excellency has directed the circum-

stance to be made public, with the view of recalling attention to the Government Order on this subject, dated 20th October, 1830, No. 15, and of showing the impropriety, therein pointed out, of placing such articles in the hands of ordinary Overseers and Servants. To do so, experience has proved, is too frequently only to hold out temptation to the evil-disposed, and to afford means for the perpetration of additional crimes. His Excellency therefore finds himself compelled to request that all Arms and Ammunition, now in possession of Servants at out-stations, may be immediately removed by the Proprietors.


