## LIGHT AT FALSE POINT, BAY OF BENGAL.

### NOTICE.

**R**EFERRING to the Notice published from this Office under date 19th July last, Notice is given, that on the 1st day of March next, a Light will be exhibited at False Point on a tripod, in a Latitude  $20^{\circ} 19' 25''$  N., and Longitude  $86^{\circ} 48' 8''$  E.

The Light will be exhibited from an elevation of about 65 feet above high water mark, and be visible in clear weather at a distance of about 13 miles from an elevation of 15 feet above the surface of the sea.

The Light will be continued at this height until the end of November, after which it will be discontinued in order to the removal of the Lantern to the top of the permanent building. It will subsequently, viz., on and after the 1st March,

1838, be again exhibited at an elevation of 120 feet above high water mark, and be then visible from 18 to 20 miles, in clear weather, from the height of 15 feet from the surface of the sea.

The Pilot's station will be continued as heretofore off Point Palmyras, during the S.W. Monsoon, that is, from the 15th March to 15th September, during which period the Pilot Vessels will cruise during the day off the Point, anchoring during the night in a line East and West in Latitude  $20^{\circ} 42'$  and  $20^{\circ} 48'$  N., with the Point bearing West to W. by S.; the Vessel on board of which the next turn Pilot may be, will burn a Blue Light and fire a Maroon alternately every half-hour, commencing with the former at eight o'clock and continuing till daylight.

Commanders on making False Point are recommended after bringing it to bear West in from 13 to 14 fathoms, to steer to the N.E., keeping in from 13 to 18 fathoms, as the wind may hang to the Westward or Eastward, on no account coming under the former depth. In this track the Blue Light and Maroon above mentioned will be seen long before the Light on False Point is lost sight of. If, however, about the beginning of September, the wind comes from the Eastward or the weather assumes a threatening appearance, the Pilot Vessels necessarily haul off to the Eastward, and will then be found in a line between Point Palmyras and the Floating Light at the entrance of the Eastern Channel. Vessels therefore about that period, if the wind hangs to the Eastward or has a threatening appearance, are recommended after leaving False Point on no account to approach Point Palmyras, but rather to endeavour to make for the Floating Light at the entrance of the Eastern Channel; and it is further notified that, from the 15th September, no Pilot Vessel will be found to the Westward of the Western Sea Reef.

From the 15th September to the 15th March, the Pilot Vessels cruise during the day between Saugor Sand and the Western Sea Reef, anchoring in the night East and West of each other, in Latitude  $21^{\circ}$  to  $21^{\circ} 10'$  North.

Vessels approaching either Station during the day are requested to make for that Vessel on board of which they will see a large Red Flag flying at the main, whenever they can do so without great inconvenience or delay. In the night during the N.E. Monsoon, that is, from 15th September to 15th March, at the Floating Light Station at the entrance of the Eastern Channel, the Vessel having the next turn Pilot on board will burn a Maroon every hour, and in thick weather every half-hour; and, as before stated, at the Point Palmyras Station during the S.W. Monsoon, or between the 15th March and the 15th September, such Vessel will alternately burn a Blue Light and Maroon every half-hour. Commanders are in like manner requested during the night to seek their Pilot from such Vessel, it being however understood that any Pilot Vessel which may be first seen is bound immediately to use every exertion to put a Pilot on board, night or day, without reference to turn or rotation, and that this latter is only allowed when no delay is occasioned thereby.

#### ADDITIONAL GRANTS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that, by command of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Additional Grants of Land will be given, under certain limitations hereinafter defined, to those persons who, having obtained Primary Grants under the printed Regulations issued from the Colonial Office, Downing-street, in April 1826, and April 1827, shall establish their claim to such Additional Grants under the following clause of those Regulations, viz:—

“Any Grantee who can shew an expenditure of capital upon his first Grant to the amount of five times the estimated value of that Grant at the time of its being made to him, will be entitled to a further Grant, with a reduction in his quit-rent at the rate of 2½ per cent. on the estimated value of such Grant, on proving that he has sufficient capital to cultivate to advantage the additional Grant.” (s. 21 of Regulations, 1827.)

In carrying this order into effect, Lord Glenelg directs that the closest enquiry be instituted, both to ascertain beyond all doubt that the conditions required of the Settler have been actually performed, by the *bona fide* expenditure of capital in permanent improvements on his first grant, and that he is in assured possession of the capital required for the cultivation of the additional grant. “Parties,” His Lordship observes, “claiming as a right the fulfilment of an agreement on the part of the Government, involving as it does, a departure from a system which it is essential to the true interests of the Colony should not be deviated from, except for the most cogent reasons, must submit to the strictest scrutiny as to the performance of their own part of the conditions upon which alone that agreement originally rested.”

In order to avail himself of the indulgence now held out, each applicant will be required to furnish proof,

That he emigrated to this Colony on the faith of the Regulations in question.

That at the expiration of seven years from the date of possession he had *bona fide* expended in permanent improvements on his original grant five times its value, estimated at 3s. 4d. an acre, or such higher amount as had been specially affixed to it.

That at the expiration of the said period of seven years, he was in actual possession of the land.

That he had in hand on that date, sufficient capital to cultivate an additional grant to advantage.

That upon the date of preferring his claim, he is not indebted to Government on account of Quit-Rent.

All applications must be sent in within a certain period; those from persons who have already been seven years in possession of their original grants, on or before the 31st December next; and all others within six months after the expiration of seven years from the dates of obtaining possession of the original grants upon which they are respectively founded; otherwise the claims will be considered as abandoned.

The applications are to be addressed to the Colonial Secretary for submission to the Governor, when, if there appear no sufficient objection to the validity of the claim, on the face of the application, or on the Records of the Government, the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims appointed under the Act of Council, 5 Wm. IV., No. 21. Each application is to be accompanied by a statement shewing the following particulars, viz:—

Date of Applicant's arrival in the Colony.

All Grants of Land obtained from the Government with the respective dates, and, if any of them have been alienated, the dates of alienation.

Particulars and amount of capital in hand, and the proportion considered applicable to the additional Grant, if obtained.

The Commissioners will demand such proof of the fulfilment of the conditions upon which the original Grant was obtained, and of the possession of the capital required for the cultivation of the additional Grant, as to them shall seem necessary. They will adopt the same rule in allotting land for capital, as was observed by the former Land Board, in no case recommending an additional Grant exceeding the maximum allowed under the Regulations in question for an original grant, namely, 2560 acres. (s. 15 of Regulations, 1827.)

They will submit a separate report in each case, through the Colonial Secretary, for the approval of the Governor, and, if the several particulars and proofs have been established, to the satisfaction of His Excellency, the Applicant will receive an order to select within four months, and from lands open prior to July 1st, 1831, the number of acres to which he may be considered entitled.

The Lands so selected, will be held under an annual Quit-rent of 2½ per cent. upon 5s. per acre, or other higher estimated value, commencing on the date of possession, and all other conditions of ordinary Additional Grants.

As no claim for an Additional Grant can be admitted where the Original Grant has not been received under the Regulations of 1826 or 1827, it is evident that none can be admitted where the Original Grant was above the maximum of these

Regulations (2500 acres) or below the maximum (320 acres.)

Such further general Regulations as may be found necessary, will be communicated to the Commissioners for their guidance and the information of those concerned.
