IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

E. DEAS THOMSON.

1. "A Bill to regulate the temporal affairs of " Presbyterian Churches and Chapels connected

" with the Church of Scotland in the Colony of New South Wales."

It is proposed to regulate the mode of nominating and appointing Trustees for Presbyterian Churches, in pursuance of the Act of Council 7 Wm. IV. No. 3, and that the Minister for the time-being, recognized by the Presbytery, shall, ex officio, be entitled to vote at all Meetings of Trustees concerning the affairs of said Church,

and in case of equality of votes the Chairman to have a casting vote.

Persons eligible as Trustees to be members of the congregation of the Church, either as seatholders or communicants, free, and above twentyone years of age.

In case of death, resignation, absence, infirmity, or improper conduct of Trustees, new Trustees to be appointed.

The mode of selection of new Trustees to be

regulated.

The power of Trustees to be defined.

Trustees to furnish annual accounts of receipts and disbursements of money to the Presbytery.

The period for nominating Trustees for Presbyterian Churches already built to be extended months from the passing of this Act.

2. "A Bill for facilitating legal proceedings by " and against a certain Company under the "style and title of 'The Royal Australian

"Exchange Company,' and for other purposes therein mentioned."

It is proposed that all suits at law or in equity shall be carried on in the name of the Secretary for the time-being.

That the Company may sue Shareholders or Members of the Company, and such persons may sue the Company.

That a Memorial of the name of the Secretary shall be recorded in the Supreme Court, and renewed when any new Secretary shall be appointed.

That no action or suit shall be brought or commenced until such Memorial be recorded.

That the Secretary and other Officers of the Company may give evidence notwithstanding in the Company.

That execution before any judgment may be issued against any Member of the Company, who shall have his remedy against the other Members.

That Bonds, &c., taken on behalf of the Company, in the name of the Secretary, may be put in suit in the name of the Secretary for the timebeing.

The Company may purchase and dispose of land for the purposes of the Comapny under certain restrictions.

The Company to have power to lend money on security of real or chattel estates.

Monies arising from sale of any lands to be applied to the purposes of the Company.

Deed signed by the Committee of Management to be valid.

The monies and other property of the Company to be answerable for debts contracted.

Shares to be deemed personal estate. Shareholders may transfer their shares.

This Act to be at all times valid, notwithstanding

any change of Proprietors.

The Company not to be incorporated.

In case of dissolution of the Company estates to remain vested in the last Committee and be disposed of by them.

Plaintiff not to be nonsuited in any suit for want of proof of record of Memorial.

Nothing in the Act to affect any right, &c., of His Majesty, or any bodies politic or corporate.

The Act not to take effect until it shall have received the Royal Assent.

The Act to be deemed a public Act.
