COURT OF CLAIMS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following CLAIMS for DEEDS of GRANT of Land and Town Allotments, will be ready for the examination of the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, under the Act of Council 5th William IV., No. 21, at the expiration of two months from this date; before which day any Caveat or Counter-claim must be entered at this Office. Due notice will be given of the days appointed for the hearings.

Case No. 198.—A. B. SPARK and SAMUEL ASHMORE, Esquires, Executors of GEORGE BALLARD VINE, deceased.

Two thousand five hundred and sixty acres, in the county of Argyle, parish unnamed, at *Cottle Wolley, Upper Wollondilly*, commencing on the Wollondilly River opposite to the north-west corner of Major D'Arcy's 2560 acres; and bounded on the north by a line bearing west 298 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line bearing east to the Wollondilly River; and on the east by that river to the commencing point.

The above description of this land was advertised by the Colonial Secretary in the Gazette of 18th November, 1835, page 820, with a view to the preparation of a Deed of Grant in the name of the Promisee, G. B. Vine, but, he being deceased, a Deed is now claimed by the Executors.

Case No. 199.—THOMAS EVERNDEN, Esq., J. P., of Bathurst.

Ninety acres, in the county of Bathurst, parish of Bathurst, allotment No. 19; bounded on the north by allotment No. 18 east 78 chains from the Vale Creek; on the east by part of Calf's allotment south 11 chains; on the south by a west line 89 chains to the Vale Creek; and on the west by that Creek.

This land was located in pursuance of an Order issued by Governor Darling, of date 17th November, 1830, in favor of Edward White, deceased, who, it is alleged, sold to claimant.

Case No. 200.—WILLIAM COX, Esq., of Hobart Ville, Richmond.

Two thousand five hundred and sixty acres, in the county of Brisbane, parish of Ellis, at *Upper Hunter*; bounded on the south by a line west 181 chains, commencing on Hunter's River, and forming part of the northern boundary of F. Allman's 2560 acres; on the west by a line north 160 chains; on the north by a line east 109 chains to Hunter's River, and forming part of the southern boundary of William Cox's, junior, 1280 acres; and on the east by Hunter's River to the south-east corner, which is opposite the confluence of the Muscle Brook with the Hunter.

On the 3rd May, 1825, the late William Cox was authorised to purchase 4000 acres of land; he completed the purchase of 2560 acres, and sold, it is alleged, to claimant.

Case No. 201.—ALEXANDER BERRY, Esq., M. C.

Four thousand acres, in the county of Camden, parish of *Bunberra*; bounded on the west by a line bearing south to the Shoalhaven River, commencing from the south-west corner of Alexander Berry's 4000 acres purchase; on the south by the Shoalhaven River to the confluence of Broughton's Creek; on the east by Broughton's Creek; and on the north by Berry's 4000 acres aforesaid, being a line west to the south-west corner thereof as aforesaid.

On the 21st May, 1825, the late Edward Wolstonecroft was authorised to purchase 4000 acres of land, and that above described was located accordingly. Mr. Berry has completed the purchase, and claims, as the sole Executor and legal Representative of Wolstonecroft.

Case No. 202.—RACHAEL MOORE WHITE, of Parramatta.

Two hundred and eighty acres, in the county of Camden, parish unnamed, district of *Illawarra*; bounded on the east by a line bearing south 35 chains, commencing from the south-east corner of Joseph Thompson's farm; on the south by a line bearing west 80 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 35 chains; and on the north by a line bearing east 80 chains to the commencing corner.

A Deed of Grant of this land was prepared in favor of John Drummond, deceased, the original promisee, on the report of the former Commissioners, No. 20, and executed subsequently to his death; it is, therefore, invalid. Drummond, it is alleged, bequeathed to his wife, now deceased, and she bequeathed to claimant.

Case No. 203.—WILLIAM WEBB, of Sydney.

Seventeen and one quarter perches, in the county of Cumberland, town of Sydney, parish of Saint James, allotment No. 31, in section No. 41; bounded on the west by the building line of Phillip-street, bearing south 3 degrees 30 minutes east 60 links; on the south by a line bearing east 1 degree north 178 links; on the east by a line bearing north 15 minutes west 58 links; and on the north by a line bearing west 1 degree 15 minutes south 185 links.

This allotment, it is alleged, was in the possession of one John Flood, who, in 1829, authorised possession to one John Caffrey for life. In 1831, Flood and Caffrey sold by auction to Thomas Smithers, who conveyed to claimant.

DISTRICTS.

1. *District of Sydney.*—The Town of Sydney and along the Parramatta Road to the eighth mile-stone at Burwood; the Road from Iron Cove Bridge to the Ferry opposite Bedlam Point; the South Head Road, and all Roads leading to Botany Bay east of the turning off to Liverpool from the Parramatta Road.

2. *District of Parramatta.*—The Town of Parramatta and along the Road to Sydney as far as the eighth mile-stone at Burwood; the Road from Parramatta to Liverpool to where it joins the main Road from Liverpool to Sydney; the Road to the Male Orphan School; the Western Road to Emu Ford; to Blacktown on the Richmond Road; the North Road through Mulgoa towards the Cowpastures, to its junction with the Liverpool Road at Mr. Blaxland's farm; the Windsor Road as far as Rouse Hill; the cross Road by the Seven Hills to Tongabee; the North Road to Dural from Parramatta by Castle Hill; the North Road from Bedlam Point Ferry to Dural, and all Roads within these already mentioned.

3. *District of Liverpool.*—The Towns of Liverpool and Campbelltown; the Road from Liverpool to its junction with the Parramatta Road at Petersham; all Roads between that Road and Botany Bay, and George's River; also from Liverpool to the Cowpasture Bridge; the cross Road from Carne's farm leading to the North Road; the North Road from Kirkham to Mr. Blaxland's Farm; the Road leading west from the Male Orphan School to the Cowpasture Road at Carne's Farm; the Road from Liverpool to Campbelltown, and from thence to Menangle Ford, and such cross Roads as may be within those described.

10. *Lower Hawkesbury District*.—From Wiseman's Ferry northward to Baker's Farm; southward to Great Maroota Forest, and westward to Cattai Creek.

11. *Lower District of Hunter's River*.—Newcastle, Maitland, Paterson's Plains, Dungog, both sides of Hunter's River to Black Creek and Glendon; the Road from Black Creek to Baker's Farm, and all between that and the Coast.

12. *Upper District of the Hunter*.—Patrick's Plains, Jerry's Plains, and both sides of Hunter's River upwards from Black Creek and Glendon.

13. *District of Port Stephens*.

CONDITIONS.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1. All the Articles required by this Notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Bread for all the purposes above stated must be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheat Bread to be made in loaves of 3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3½lbs. each, and baked twenty-four hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the Military Ration to be in the proportion of 5lbs. of Beef and 2lbs of Mutton weekly; deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations the Beef is required in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto to be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum to be West India, five per cent. under proof.

MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. No part whatever of the Supplies above specified are to be received in charge of the Commissariat, but all to be delivered by the Contractor direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, upon the written order of the Commissariat Officer in charge of the District, or of the Person authorised for that purpose.

7. The Rations for the Troops, the Convict Establishments, and Road and other Parties are to be delivered by the Contractor at the Barracks, Establishments, or Huts where the Parties to be supplied may be stationed; being, previously to removal from the Contractor's premises, approved by a Person authorised for the purpose.

8. The Forage to be delivered by the Contractor at the Establishments where the Horses or Cattle are stationed, and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species to be reckoned as the proportion of the Ration undermentioned, viz.—

The Maize or Barley 4-12ths.

The Hay 5-12ths.

The Bran 2-12ths.

The Straw 1-12th.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. The whole of the Supplies of every description in each District are intended to be included in one Contract; and, therefore, no Tenders can be received unless for supplying the whole without exception that may be required in the entire of a District, and to each District there must be a separate Tender.

10. Provisions and Forage being required by Rations according to scales under these respective heads, the Tenders are required to express the price per Ration only, and not of the several Articles, excepting that of Rum, the price of which requires to be separately stated.

11. Fuel and Light, as well as the Supplies for Hospitals and Penal Settlements, being required by weight and measure, must be priced accordingly as shewn under these heads respectively.

12. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other roads similarly situated, are required to have at all times on the spot the supply for fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent to whom reference may be had in the Contractor's absence.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supply as to its quality, the same is to be decided in the following manner.—The Party objecting will name one Person as Arbitrator, the Contractor or his Agent another, these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as Umpire, who in the event of the Arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final. And should it be decided that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing which it will be procured and the expense charged to his account.

14. It will be in the power of either Party to limit the duration of the Contract by giving in writing a Notice of three calendar months to the opposite Party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such Notice can be given only from the first day of a Month.

15. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, according to the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers in a complete state, will receive payment either in British Silver Coin, or by a Bill on Her Majesty's Treasury at Par, at the option of the Senior Commissariat Officer.

16. The value of all packages is to be included in the prices demanded.

17. Persons wishing to Tender are requested to apply either at this Office, or to the Commissariat Officers in charge at the several Stations, who will furnish them with printed Forms for the purpose, and communicate further particulars; and as adequate security will be required for the due fulfilment of the Contracts, each Tender must be accompanied by a letter from the Parties proposed as such, stating that they are willing to become bound as securities for the Contractor accordingly; and no payment will be made upon any Contracts until the bonds have been executed;

the expense of which, if any, is to be paid by the Contractor.

18. The Amounts of the Bonds required in the several Districts are as follows, viz.—Sydney, £3,000; Parramatta, £1,500; Liverpool, £1,000; Myrtle Creek, £500; St. Vincent, £500; Illawarra, £500; Blue Mountain, £1,000; Bathurst, £1,000; Windsor, £1,000; Lower Hawkesbury, £200; Lower Hunter, £1,000; Upper Hunter, £300; Port Macquarie, £1,000.

19. All Tenders are to be enclosed in a separate envelope, addressed to the undersigned and marked "Supplies for 1838."

20. Flour in place of Bread to be given for the Military Ration, when required, in the proportion of 14 2-7th ozs. of the former for 16 ozs. of the latter.

21. The Contractor for the District of Sydney will also be required to furnish the Government Vessels, or casual purposes, any of the Supplies under the head of Hospitals.

22. The Rations and Articles particularised under the head of Provisions, Nos. 1 to 11, may be required not only for the purposes specified, but also for any other purpose of of the Military and Convict services, should there be occasion for it.

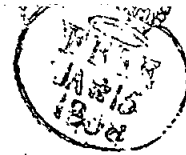
