To His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

May it Please Your Excellency,—

We, the undersigned Magistrates, Clergy, and Free Inhabitants of the Town and District of Liverpool, beg to approach Your Excellency with feelings of deep respect, and assurances of our most cordial welcome.

It is a source of the highest gratification to us, to hail in the person of Your Excellency, the arrival of the first representative of our youthful and beloved Sovereign, to whom, in common with every true Briton, whether dwelling in the same Land, or separated by a wide waste of waters, our hearts turn with a zealous, loyal, and faithful attachment.

We cannot but regard it as the favorable omen of a future wise and paternal administration, that but a short period previous to Your Excellency's arrival, we celebrated the Fiftieth Anniversary of our Colony. We may proudly say, that the annals of the world present no other instance of such rapid strides to power, to wealth, and to civilization, thus made in one brief half-century.

On Your Excellency's matured judgment and enlightened wisdom, we place unlimited confidence, feeling assured that under your paternal care "Australia will advance," and that the Divine blessing (upon which every thing depends) will be insured by Your Excellency's strict maintenance of morality amongst us, and affording that protection which will enable the different classes of the community, to worship God in the way most agreeable to their feelings.

That Your Excellency and your amiable family may enjoy many years of health and happiness amongst us, we most sincerely hope, and shall ever earnestly pray.

HIS EXCELLENCY'S REPLY.

GENTLEMEN,—I feel very happy that I have been able to come amongst you, to receive this mark of your kindness, and to thank you, in your own rising and interesting Town, for the cordial welcome with which you have greeted me to the Land of Australia.

It is, indeed, a delightful thing, Gentlemen, to see Towns springing up in places which were so lately barren wastes; and to find the habitations of men acquainted not only with the arts of civilized life but with the luxuries of refined society, succeeding to the bark hut of the savage. But it affords a yet higher gratification to a person in the station which I have the honor, however unworthily, to fill, to find that neither change of scene, nor the growth of new interests in this distant land, has diminished the feelings of love and loyalty to the person of our Sovereign, which form, for Englishmen and their descendants in all parts of the world, the surest bond of union, and the best security for the continued enjoyment both of individual happiness and of public prosperity.

Gentlemen, I regret that my stay with you must, of necessity, be short; but the urgency of public business recalls me (as you must be aware) to the Capital.
