HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, with reference to the regulations for the introduction of Emigrants into the Colony by private individuals, dated 25th September, 1837, that in addition to the certificates required, by the 2nd paragraph, to be produced in favor of the persons brought out, the importer will be called on to satisfy the Board, named in the regulations, that the Emigrants have been supplied, during the voyage, with a sufficiency of good and wholesome provisions, and with reasonably comfortable accommodation; and any infraction of this condition, which a due regard for the comfort and health of the Emigrants and the interest of the Settlers requires should be strictly enforced, will prevent the payment of the bounties.

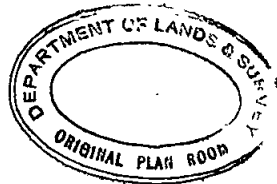
