#### EMIGRANTS.

BY the Ship *Westminster*, which has this morning arrived from England with two hundred and fifty-one Emigrants, consisting of agricultural laborers, with their families, from the County of Kent, a Despatch, dated 22d March, 1838, has been received from the Agent-General for Emigration, stating that arrangements have been made for despatching from Great Britain and Ireland certain Ships, which may be expected to reach the Colony within the next three months, with Emigrants, at the rate of eight hundred and ten persons per month, and forwarding the annexed Return of such Vessels, which His Excellency the Governor has directed to be published for general information.

A Ship named the *Duncan* is also referred to as being despatched in December last, although not included in the statement now received.

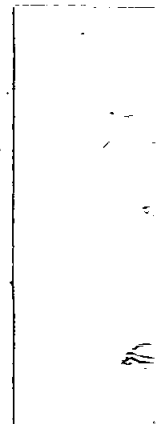
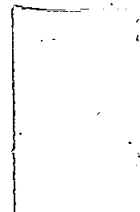
