without any Numerical Flag above it, will

The *Numerical Pendant, Yellow and Red*, when
placed above the *Square Descriptive Flag*,
which shows whether the Vessel signalised is a
Ship, Brig, &c., will denote that she contains
Immigrants. When placed above a *Triangular
Numerical Flag*, it will denote as heretofore,
that it is intended to express *Figures merely*,
without reference to the List of Pilot's Reports.

Parties are reminded that all Applications for Agricultural Labourers and Mechanics must be renewed at these Sessions as after 1st day of October ensuing, all former Applications for Convicts of that description will be cancelled in conformity with existing Regulations.

The Magistrates will take particular care to point out to Applicants any informality in their Forms of Application, in order that the same may be corrected before transmission to the Commissioner, and to remind them, where necessary, to require their Overseers to send in their Returns in Form B, to the Sessions of the District in which they reside. The Magistrates are also requested to see that all the particulars required in terms of the Regulations are duly filled up in the several Forms, to avoid the inconvenience and delay in returning them for correction.

The greatest accuracy will be required on the part of the Applicants in filling up the Returns, as the best means of avoiding confusion and inconvenience in the Public Service.

Applications for domestic Servants and Convicts of the same trade as the parties applying, do not require to be renewed at these Sessions.

Those Magistrates who were authorised to employ Assessors last year for taking into consideration Applications for Servants, will be allowed, if still necessary, to retain the same parties on the present occasion; but where the employment of other parties in lieu should be requisite, the Magistrates will immediately report the names to this Office.

Case No. 259.—Representatives of the late THOMAS PARMETER, of Quirosville.

Fifty acres, County of Northumberland, parish of Branxton, at Anvil Creek, commencing at the north-east corner of Bailey's fifty acre farm on Anvil Creek; and bounded on the east by 40 chains of his west boundary line, bearing south by compass; on the south by a west line by compass of 12 chains; on the west by a north line by compass of 46 chains and 40 links to Anvil Creek; and on the north by Anvil Creek to the north-east corner aforesaid.

Governor Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order dated 21st April, 1825, promising fifty acres of land to Benjamin Granger, deceased, who, before his death, selected it as above described, and, as it is alleged, sold it by public auction to Thomas Hunt, who sold to claimants. In 1828, after Granger's death, Mary, his wife, applied to Governor Darling for the measurement of the land to her. Her request was complied with by order dated 31st October, 1828; and the land is now charted in her name.

Case No. 261.—ROBERT SCOTT, of Glendon, and others, Trustees of the Estate of the late H. W. Radford.

Two thousand acres, in the County of Durham, parish of Marwood; commencing at the south-west corner, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 230 chains; on the north by a line bearing east 80 chains; on the east by a line bearing south 246 chains 50 links to Hunter's River; and on the south by that river to the south-west corner aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Sir Thomas Brisbane's, dated the 28th January, 1823, to Alexander Shand, who, it is alleged, is either dead or absent from the Colony.

Case No. 262.—Captain CHARLES STURT, of Mittagong.

Sixty acres in the County of Camden, parish unnamed, at Mittagong; commencing at the Old Road from Keighran's to Bong Bong, at the north-west corner of George Cutter's 300 acres, and bounded on the south by that land, being a line bearing south 50 degrees east 19 chains and 70 links; on the east by John Regan's 100 acres, being a line bearing north 40 degrees east 25 chains and 50 links; on the north by Michael Hughes' land, being a bearing line north 50 degrees west 26 chains to the Old Road to Bong Bong; and

on the west by that road to the north-west corner of George Cutter's 300 acres aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Macquarie's, dated 31st March, 1821, in favour of George Lilly or Lilley, who it is alleged, sold to George Cutter, and lie to claimant.

Case No. 263.—SAMUEL H. HORNE, of Parramatta, by his Attornies, Carr, Rogers and Young, opposed by James Walton of Parramatta.

Twenty-seven Perches in the County of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, Town of Parramatta, allotment No. in section No. 8, situate on the north side of Pennant-street, and bounded on the east by Hawkin's allotment, 220 links; on the north by a line of 76 links to Villier's-street; on the west by Villier's-street, 226 links; and on the south by Pennant-street, 77 links.

On the 30th June, 1823, Sir Thomas Brisbane leased the above described allotment for 21 years to James Walton, who, it is alleged, prior to 1824, sold it to William Connelley, who sold to claimant, who requests a Deed on payment of 21 years quit-rent, as provided for by a clause in the lease.

Case No. 264.—ALEXANDER BERRY, Esq., M. C., of Sydney.

Sixty Acres in the County of Cumberland, parish of Willoughby, near the Crow's Nest estate; commencing at a marked tree near the Crow's Nest, and bounded on the west by Edward Woolstonecroft's 520 acres, being a line north 32 degrees west 50 chains; on the north by a line east 12 chains; on the east by a line south 32 degrees east fifty chains; and on the south by a line west 12 chains to the marked tree aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Macquarie's, dated 21st March, 1821, in favour of James Henry, who, it appears, is absent from the Colony. His father, William Henry, on his behalf entered a Caveat against the claim of Mr. Berry, but that Caveat is now withdrawn.

Case No. 265.—JAMES BARKER, of Sydney.

Thirty-six Perches in the County of Northumberland, parish of Newcastle, Town of Newcastle, allotment No. 75, bounded on the west by 1 chain of the east side of Newcomen-street, bearing north 7 degrees east; on the north by a line dividing it from allotments Nos. 72 and 73 bearing east 7 degrees south 2 chains and 25 links; on the east by a line dividing it from allotment No. 74, bearing south 7 degrees west 1 chain; and on the south by a line dividing it from allotment No. 77, bearing west 7 degrees north 2 chains and 25 links to Newcomen-street.

On the 1st July, 1823, Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order in favour of James Mudie, for an allotment at Newcastle, and that above described was located accordingly. Mudie, who is out of the Colony, sold, it is alleged, to claimant.

Case No. 266.—NATHANIEL PAYTEN, of Parramatta, Builder, by his Attorney, Augustus Hayward, Esq.

Sixty-one Perches in the County of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, Town of Parramatta, allotment numbered 11 of section No. 6; bounded on the west by a line 2 chains 54 links; on the north by a line 1 chain 51 links; on the east by a line to Pennant-street, 2 chains 57 links; and on the south by that street, 1 chain 51 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from the 30th June, 1823, to Thomas Blackett, who, it is alleged, sold it to Isaac Howarth, who sold to claimant, who requests a Deed by payment of 21 years quit-rent, as provided for by a clause in the lease.

Case No. 267.—NATHANIEL PAYTEN, of Parramatta, Builder, by his Attorney, Augustus Hayward, Esq.
