## COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, now under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,  
E. DEAS THOMSON.

1. "A Bill to regulate the Temporal Affairs of the Religious Societies denominated Wesleyan Methodists, Independents, and Baptists."

It is proposed, that on the requisition of three Subscribers to any Church or Chapel of either of the Communions above-mentioned, or of three Members of the Society for whom the same may be erected, the Trustees appointed under the Act 7 WILLIAM IV., No. 3, shall convey the Trust to three or more Trustees, according to a Model Deed of each Society, to be enrolled in the Supreme Court within two years, on being presented by the Minister of each of the said Communions in Sydney.

In default of such conveyance, the Trust to pass to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, who shall make proper conveyance thereof to new Trustees.

2. "A Bill to amend an Act, intituled 'An Act to enable the Proprietors of a certain Company carried on in the Town of Sydney, in the Colony of New South Wales, under the Name, Style, and Firm of THE UNION ASSURANCE COMPANY OF SYDNEY, to sue and be sued in the name of the Chairman of the said Company for the time-being, and for other purposes therein mentioned.'"

It is proposed, that on a certain day in each year, the names of all the then existing Members of "THE UNION ASSURANCE COMPANY," with their respective places of abode and description, shall be recorded on oath by the Chairman or other principal Officer for the time-being, in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, and that the List shall be open for inspection at all reasonable hours, on payment of a fee.

3. "A Bill to alter and amend an Act, intituled 'An Act for regulating the Police in the Town and Port of SYDNEY, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions therein.'"

It is proposed to alter so much of the Act 4 WILLIAM IV., No. 7, as relates to *Placards*, and to permit Persons to affix *Placards* and other Papers on the Walls of Buildings in the occupation of themselves, or of other Persons giving a written consent thereto.

4. "A Bill to give further time to prepare and settle the Jury Lists for the District of MAITLAND, for the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight."

The Jury Lists for the District of MAITLAND not having been prepared within the time required by the Acts 2 WILLIAM IV., No. 3, and 4 WILLIAM IV., No. 12, it is proposed to extend the period for preparing such Lists for 1838, and, meanwhile, to render valid the Lists prepared for 1837.

Nothing in the present Bill to affect the regular preparation of the Lists for 1839.

5. "A Bill for regulating the Police in the Towns of PARRAMATTA, WINDSOR, MAITLAND, and BATHURST, respectively, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions therein."

It is proposed to extend to the several Towns above-mentioned the Provisions of the Sydney Police Act, 4 WILLIAM IV., No. 7.

6. "A Bill to provide for Trial by Jury at the Courts of Quarter Sessions to be held at MELBOURNE and PORT MACQUARIE."

It is proposed that, at the Courts of Quarter Sessions to be held at MELBOURNE and PORT MACQUARIE, Offenders shall be tried before a Jury of twelve of the Inhabitants, residing within a certain distance of those places, respectively, to be appointed, selected, and summoned in the ordinary manner.

Nothing in the present Bill to interfere with the Summary Jurisdiction of the Courts.

#### MILITARY ESCORT.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct the publication of the following General Order, dated 22nd September, 1832, No. 222, pointing out the duty of Military Escorts when required to aid the civil authorities as guard over prisoners, for the information and guidance of the civil officers to whom it relates.

#### (COPY.) GENERAL ORDER. No. 222.

*Sydney, 22nd September, 1832.*

The following instructions are to be strictly attended to by officers and non-commissioned officers commanding detachments of infantry at out-stations in this command.

Upon the application of a Justice of the Peace for a military party to patrol the roads or bush, to search for offenders, or to assist in the execution of a warrant, the party is to be immediately granted by the officers or non-commissioned officers in command, provided that a Justice, or the chief or principal constable of the district proceeds with the party. If the Justice or peace officer shall afterwards leave the party with which he set out, the party is to return immediately to quarters.

Parties for the escort of prisoners are to be furnished when applied for by a Justice of the Peace personally, or in writing, provided that the escort be accompanied by a constable holding the magistrate's warrant and having charge of the prisoners. The escort being furnished to protect the constable in the execution of the warrant, and to prevent rescue or escape, the non-commissioned officers commanding the escort will carefully attend to the constable's directions for such purposes. The distance to which escorts are to proceed will be regulated as far as practicable by the situation of the military post, gaol, or lock-up house, in the direction of their route. Escorts on leaving the detachment will always be furnished with a written paper of route, showing the distance they are to proceed with the places they are to halt, and the number of days for which they are rationed.

A return is to be forwarded to the Brigade Office on the last day of every month, showing the number and strength of escorts furnished during that month. In the event of any duty being required beyond what the strength of the detachment

can with propriety perform, an immediate report is to be made of the circumstance to the Major of Brigade at Sydney. When escorts arrive at one military post from another, the officer or non-commissioned officer at the former will furnish a like escort to proceed with the prisoners, if required by the constable holding the warrant so to do.

Officers and non-commissioned officers in command at the out-stations will turn out the detachments in support of the civil power for the suppression of riot, or the preservation of the peace, whenever required by the Sheriff of the Colony or by any Justice of the Peace.

The Mounted Police, at out-stations where infantry are quartered, are subject to the orders of the officer in command, in all matters of military duties, and interior economy in barracks and stables, but they will receive their orders from their own officers, or from the Justices of the Peace of the district in which they may be stationed. The foregoing instructions for escorts do not therefore relate to the Mounted Police, who will receive their orders through their own officers.

Parties are reminded that all Applications for Agricultural Labourers and Mechanics must be renewed at these Sessions as after 1st day of October ensuing, all former Applications for Convicts of that description will be cancelled in conformity with existing Regulations.

The Magistrates will take particular care to point out to Applicants any informality in their Forms of Application, in order that the same may be corrected before transmission to the Commissioner, and to remind them, where necessary, to

require their Overseers to send in their Returns in Form B, to the Sessions of the District in which they reside. The Magistrates are also requested to see that all the particulars required, in terms of the Regulations are duly filled up in the several Forms, to avoid the inconvenience and delay in returning them for correction.

The greatest accuracy will be required on the part of the Applicants in filling up the Returns, as the best means of avoiding confusion and inconvenience in the Public Service.

Applications for domestic Servants and Convicts of the same trade as the parties applying, do not require to be renewed at these Sessions.

Those Magistrates who were authorised to employ Assessors last year for taking into consideration Applications for Servants, will be allowed, if still necessary, to retain the same parties on the present occasion; but where the employment of other parties in lieu should be requisite, the Magistrates will immediately report the names to this Office.

#### COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, now under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,  
E. DEAS THOMSON.

1. "A Bill for the more effectual recovery of Fines and enforcement of forfeited Recognizances imposed and entered into by and before Justices of the Peace in New South Wales."

Doubts and difficulties having arisen as to the applicability or mode of application in New South Wales of the Law of England relating to the recovery of fines and the enforcement of forfeited recognizances imposed and entered into by and before Justices of the Peace, it is proposed to make special provision in that behalf, adapted to the circumstances of the Colony.

2. "A Bill for preventing the extension of the infectious disease commonly called the Catarrh or Influenza in Sheep or Lambs, in the Colony of New South Wales."

It is proposed to impose a penalty for turning out, keeping, depasturing, or driving, or conducting diseased flocks upon any land not owned or rented by the Proprietor of the Sheep, or upon any public highway, except in cases where the disease may break out in Sheep when depastured upon their accustomed run, whether the same be or be not owned or rented.

It is proposed that all Sheep shall be considered as infected in which the disease has prevailed during the previous three months.

It is proposed that all Sheep which may become infected during the time of their being driven upon any public highway, shall be immediately killed, and the carcasses burnt or buried, under a penalty.

It is proposed to empower any two Justices to award compensation to the Proprietor of Sheep so destroyed, not exceeding one-half their value if they had continued sound, provided, it shall be made clearly to appear that the disease had not prevailed amongst them at any time during the previous three months.

It is proposed to empower one or more Justices to grant a warrant for the removal of Sheep after a conviction under the Act, or for the seizure and detention of Sheep driven or depastured contrary to the Act, until they can be examined.

It is proposed that notice shall be given where a public road passes through land upon which diseased Sheep are depastured.

It is proposed to impose penalties on abandoning diseased Sheep, throwing the carcasses of such into any running stream or waterhole, or on failure to burn or bury the carcasses of diseased Sheep.

It is proposed to enable two or more Justices to award compensation, not exceeding fifty pounds, for injury sustained by the communication of the disease to healthy flocks, but not to prevent the party, if he prefer it, from seeking his remedy in the Supreme Court, where the amount of damage shall exceed that sum.

It is proposed to impose a penalty on Butchers selling the carcasses of diseased Sheep, or any part thereof.

It is proposed to make the penalties recoverable before any two Justices of the Peace, and, except in the latter case, upon the complaint of a Proprietor or Overseer in charge of Sheep.

It is proposed to allow Appeal to the Quarter Sessions when the penalty awarded shall exceed ten pounds.

It is proposed that the Act shall be in force for two years.

3. "A Bill to authorise the Marriage of Females under the age of twenty-one years, without the consent of Parents or Guardians, in certain cases."

It is proposed that any Female under the age of twenty-one years making oath before any Police Magistrate of the Territory, that she is under twenty-one years of age, and that she has neither Parent nor Guardian in the Colony qualified to give consent to her marriage, and that she knows of no impediment by reason of any former marriage, consanguinity, affinity, or any lawful cause whatsoever to hinder it, shall be allowed to marry, on producing a certificate to that effect from the Police Magistrate aforesaid.

4. "A Bill to enable the Governor of New South Wales to order the issuing of Licenses to retail Fermented and Spirituous Liquors for the present year, in certain cases."

The Certificates for Licenses to keep Public-houses, having, in a number of instances, not been presented at the Colonial Treasury, and the duty thereon paid, within the period of fourteen days from the respective dates of such Certificates, as required by the Act 3 William IV., No. , it is proposed to enable the Governor to direct Licenses for the year, from 1st July, 1838, to 30th June, 1839, to be issued to such Persons as obtained Certificates in due form of law, and presented the same at the Office of the Colonial Treasurer, and tendered the amount of duty thereon, within one month from the respective dates of their Certificates.

Nothing in this Bill to affect the deposit of Certificates, and payment of Duties for Licenses for the year commencing 1st July, 1839.
