Pension to Mr. Joseph Forbes ..	700	0	0	Whereas, by an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Temporal Affairs of Presbyterian Churches and Chapels connected with the Church of Scotland, in the Colony of New South Wales," it is enacted that the Trustees appointed for all Presbyterian Churches and Ministers' Dwellings shall be elected and appointed in manner mentioned in the Act 7 William IV, No. 3, intituled, "An Act to promote the Building of Churches and Chapels, and to provide for the maintenance of Ministers of Religion," and their names transmitted through the Presbytery of New South Wales, for the approval of the Governor and Executive Council; and further, that the officiating Ministers in all such Churches shall be recognised, and certain other matters mentioned therein shall be sanctioned, by the said Presbytery; and whereas, there are sundry Presbyterians in the said Colony, Ministers, as well as other Persons, professing to hold the Standards of the Church of Scotland, but disclaiming the Jurisdic-tion of the said Presbytery of New South Wales, who are deprived of the benefit contemplated for all Christian Churches by the said last recited Act; It is therefore proposed to empower the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, to issue for the year 1839, Stipends to such Presbyterians as aforesaid, and also to grant such Sums of Money for the erection of Churches and Dwelling-houses for such Ministers as may be required, in conformity with the provisions of the said last recited Act, in the same manner as if that Act had not been passed.

3. "A Bill to alter and amend, and, except as so altered and amended, to revive and continue for a limited time, An Act passed in the Second Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King WILLIAM THE FOURTH, intituled, An Act for the Relief of Debtors in Execution for Debts which they are unable to pay."

Whereas the Act of the Governor and Council 2nd Wm. IV., No. 11, intituled "An Act for the relief of Debtors in Execution for Debts which they are unable to pay," as revived and continued from time to time by the Acts respectively 5 Wm. IV., No. 4, and 6 Wm. IV., No. 18, expired on the 31st day of August last, it is proposed to revise and continue the same for a limited time, with certain alterations and amendments.

4. "A Bill to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled An Act to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands."

As the Crown Lands Occupation Act, 7 William IV., No. 4, will expire on the thirty-first December next, it is proposed to renew the same for a further period of two years.

COLONIAL TRADE.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified that the continuance of the existing Trade between this Colony and the Dutch East India Possessions can no longer be permitted, it having been recently decided by Her Britannic Majesty's Government, that the Commercial intercourse between the Subjects of the British and Dutch Governments, in the Eastern Archipelago, allowed by the Treaty of 17th March, 1824, does not extend to New Holland.

In pursuance of this decision, no Dutch Vessel will be admitted to Entry in the Ports of New South Wales or its Dependencies, which may sail from any Port of the Dutch East India Possessions, after the receipt of the present Notice at the Port from which she sailed; or which may arrive in New South Wales after the first day of January, 1839, whatever may be the date of her departure from any Port in the Dutch East India Possessions.
