CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that applications for pecuniary aid from the Colonial Treasury for the support of Dispensaries, Schools, or other Charitable Institutions established by societies or individuals, and unconnected with the Local Government, are to be addressed to the Colonial Secretary, and delivered at his Office in Sydney, on or before the 30th of April next.

2. All such applications are to be made by the Trustees, Committee, Treasurer, or other person or persons managing the affairs of the Institution, and are to contain a brief account of the objects for which it has been established, and of the service it has rendered to the public in the past year, with the names of the persons forming the Society. The application is to be accompanied by a statement of the funds of the Institution, shewing the amount received in the last year by private contributions, or from public bodies, the amount and general particulars of expenditure during the same period, and the balance actually in hand, on the 1st day of January of the present year, together with a statement of any debts then chargeable against the Institution.

3. The statement of accounts is to be verified by a declaration from the Treasurer or Manager of the funds of the Institution in the following form:—

4. If any assistance be required towards the erection of buildings, the application must be made in the annexed form Z, specifying the object, amount of contributions collected, and other particulars therein mentioned; nominating Trustees for the approval of the Governor and Executive Council; enclosing a plan and specification of the intended Building; and describing the nature of the Title to the site, without satisfactory proof of the validity of which, no aid whatever can be granted towards the purpose stated.

5. If the objects of the Institution, and the manner of conducting it, are such as in the opinion of the Governor to render it deserving of support from the public funds, application will be made to the Legislative Council for such aid as it may be deemed proper to grant, in no case exceeding the amount of private contributions and donations from public bodies.

6. If the Council shall think fit to appropriate a sum towards the general support of the Institution, a warrant for issuing the amount will be prepared immediately after, upon application being made to the Auditor-General, accompanied by such statements and vouchers as that Officer shall find necessary under the established regulations.

7. If any sum shall be appropriated towards the erection of buildings, the Trustees will be required to transmit to the Colonial Secretary, before any issue can be made, an account of the sums actually expended thereon, accompanied by the usual

vouchers. Such account will then be referred to some competent Architect appointed on behalf of the Government, who will be required to examine the building, and certify that the workmanship and materials are good and sufficient, and conformable to the plan and elevation laid before the Governor and Council, and that he believes the specified sum to have been actually laid out. One half of the amount of any sums so expended and certified, will be issued to the Trustees from time to time; but it is to be understood that the number of examinations and issues is not on account of any one building to exceed two intermediate, and one final, or three in the whole.

8. No expenditure can be sanctioned unless the estimate be sent in, and the amount voted by the Legislative Council as above mentioned.

RELIGIOUS ESTABLISHMENTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to establish the following Regulations, under which issues will be made from the Colonial Treasury in aid of the erection of Churches, Chapels, and Ministers' Dwellings, and towards the payment of Ministers' Stipends, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 7th WILLIAM IV., No. 3.

1.—All applications for such aid are to be made to the Governor and Executive Council, through the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Australia, the Presbytery of the Church of Scotland, or the Right Reverend the Roman Catholic Bishop on behalf of their respective Churches.

2.—Every such application for aid towards the building of a Church or Minister's Dwelling, under the first clause of the said Act, shall be made in the annexed form marked (A), and shall set forth the particulars therein required. Unless the sum of £300 have been subscribed and actually paid, the application cannot be entertained; and until the Trustees have been duly named and approved, and satisfactory proof given of a valid title to the intended Site, no assistance can be given in money, towards the proposed Building.

3.—All applications for stipends towards the support of Ministers under the second clause of the Act, shall be made in the form hereunto annexed, marked (B); shall comprise all such particulars as are set forth in the said clause; and shall also contain a declaration that the persons signing it have not previously signed any other application of the same kind.

4.—All special applications for Ministers' stipends under the third clause of the said Act, in cases where there are not one hundred proposed Adult Attendants shall be made in the same form (B) last mentioned, accompanied by an explanatory letter from the Lord Bishop of Australia, the Presbytery, or Roman Catholic Bishop respectively, setting forth the particular circumstances of the case for the consideration of the Governor and Council.

5.—All applications for increase of stipends, made under the fourth clause of the said Act, shall contain the several particulars required by the second clause, and set forth in form (B) hereunto annexed, with such alterations only as the case may require.

6.—All applications made under the fifth clause of the Act for stipends towards the support of Ministers where there is no Church or Chapel, must contain the several particulars required by that clause, and be accompanied by the recommendation of the Lord Bishop of Australia, the Presbytery, or Roman Catholic Bishop respectively.

7.—Pursuant to the sixth clause of the said Act, a statement shall be transmitted in the month of

January of every year, to the Clerk of the Executive Council, signed by the Lord Bishop of Australia, the Moderator on behalf of the Presbytery, or the Roman Catholic Bishop respectively, certifying that each Minister of their respective Churches has, during the past year, or such part thereof as he shall have been employed, faithfully and diligently performed the several duties allotted to him in the District for which he shall be appointed: which statement shall be deemed sufficient proof of such performance, unless a complaint be made in writing to the Governor or Executive Council, who shall render further enquiry necessary; and no stipend will be issued for the current year, until such certificate shall have been received, or such enquiry, if instituted, shall have been satisfactorily determined.

8.—Previous to the issue of any sum from the Colonial Treasury under these Regulations towards the erection of any Church or Chapel, or Minister's Dwelling, the Trustees thereof will be required to transmit to the Colonial Secretary, an account (*accompanied by the usual vouchers*) of the sums actually expended in the Building.

Such account will then be referred to some competent Architect appointed on behalf of the Government, who will be required to examine the Building, and certify that the workmanship and materials are good and sufficient, and conformable to the Plan and Elevation laid before the Governor and Council, and that he believes the specified sum to have been actually laid out.

One half the amount (not being less than £50) of any sums so expended, and certified, will be from time to time issued to the Trustees, subject to the limitation imposed by the said Act.

9.—The advances alluded to in the preceding paragraph, cannot be made upon materials not worked up.

The number of Inspections to be made on behalf of the Government, of any Building in progress, will be confined to two intermediate and one final, or *three* in the whole; and in ordinary cases, the number of advances will correspond.

But, to obviate inconvenience, if advances are in any case urgently required more frequently, they may be made on the Trustees giving their personal security that the amount shall be repaid on demand, in the event of its exceeding one half the value of the work executed and duly approved within three years from the date of the issue of the first advance from the Colonial Treasury.

10.—Application for aid from the Colonial Treasury towards the erection of Churches or Chapels, or Ministers' Dwellings, or towards the stipends of Ministers, on behalf of any denomination of Christians not named in these Regulations, will be taken into consideration according to the special circumstances of each case, but such part of these regulations will be acted upon as may be applicable thereto.
