**I**N consequence of the long-continued Drought, and the failure of the Wheat and Maize Crops, **HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR** is pleased to direct, with the advice of the Executive Council, that wherever the same can be done with the concurrence of the existing Contractor, *Two Pounds of Beef or Mutton, or One Pound and a quarter of Salt Pork, shall be substituted for Two Pounds of Seconds Wheaten Flour, in the weekly Ration of each Convict in the service of Government, until the 31st day of December next.*

With a view to diminish the consumption of Flour generally, His Excellency, with the advice of the Council, is further pleased to authorise and recommend the adoption of a similar measure on the part of all Assignees of Convict servants.
