**SUPPLIES OF FOREIGN WHEAT, &c.**

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has deemed it necessary to hold out encouragement for the importation of supplies to meet the probable deficiency in the stock of Wheat and Flour required for consumption in the Colony until the end of the present year; but is at the same time desirous to interfere with private speculations no further than may be indispensable for the public interests, and rather to induce Merchants and others to undertake themselves the necessary measures, on their being guaranteed to a certain extent from loss.

His Excellency, with the advice of the Council, is therefore pleased to direct that Tenders be called for specifying the lowest rate of guarantee per hundred pounds avoirdupois, at which parties are willing to import into Sydney, *before the 31st December next*, from any place except the Australian Colonies, *Wheat or Flour*, in good condition, and of sound merchantable quality, in quantity not exceeding Six Millions of Pounds, being equal to about One Hundred Thousand Bushels of Wheat; the Government guaranteeing to the Contractor the purchase of the Wheat or Flour, at the rate specified in the Tender, if accepted, provided the Contractor shall declare in writing to the Colonial Secretary, within one week after arrival (being within the period before stated), his desire to dispose of it to the Government at that rate. The Contractor will thus be at liberty to sell it either to the public, to the best advantage in his power, or to the Government, at the guaranteed rate, if he shall declare his wish within the time specified.

The condition and quality of the Wheat or Flour will be subject to the report and opinion of a Board, consisting of—

The Deputy Commissary General;  
 The Colonial Storekeeper; and  
 The Health Officer;

whose determination shall be final.

Proof must be given to the satisfaction of the Board, that the importation has been made in pursuance of this Notice.

Security will be required for the due fulfilment of the Contract, and that the Wheat or Flour shall be sold for consumption in the Colony.

His Excellency, with the advice of the Council, also desires Tenders to be invited on a similar principle, and under similar conditions, in all respects, for the importation into Sydney of Two Millions Five Hundred Thousand Pounds of *Rice*, *by the 30th September next*.

The Tenders for the whole, or any part of the above, not being less than Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, will be received until twelve o'clock of Saturday, the 6th instant, at the Colonial Secretary's Office, to be endorsed "*Tenders for the supply of Wheat, Flour, or Rice*," as the case may be.

No Tender will be noticed unless the Party, or an authorised Agent on his behalf, shall attend at the time abovementioned to afford any explanation or information required.

If no eligible Tender be received, the Government will have no alternative but to take measures for the importation, on their own account, of a supply of Flour or Grain equal to the probable wants of the Colonists.
