1.— "A Bill to enable the Society, denominated "Wesleyan Methodists, to appoint Trustees for "Chapels built before the year 1836."

After recital of certain of the provisions of the Acts of the Governor and Council, 7 WILLIAM IV, No. 3, and 2 VICTORIA No. 7, it is proposed, that any appointment of Trustees, which may have been heretofore made for the Wesleyan Chapels in Macquarie-street and Princestreet respectively, shall be null and void; and that the election and appointment of Trustees, for the said Chapels respectively, shall be made in manner directed by the said Acts of the Governor and Council, 7 WILLIAM IV, No. 3, and 2 VICTORIA, No. 7, within six months from the passing of the proposed Act.

2.— "A Bill to remove doubts concerning the "validity of certain Grants of Land in New "South Wales."

Grants or Conveyances of parts of the Waste Lands of the Crown, in the Colony of New South Wales, having been made in the name of His late Majesty KING WILLIAM IV, after the demise of His said late Majesty, it is proposed, that all Grants, Deeds, or Conveyances, so made, of any Lands situated in the said Colony, shall be as effectual and binding upon Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, to all intents and purposes, as if such Grants, Deeds, or Conveyances had been made in the name of Her said Majesty.

3.— A Bill to simplify and facilitate proceedings at Law, and in Equity, by or against the Union Bank of Australia."

That a Memorial, setting forth the name of the said Inspector, and of each of the Local Directors of the Board of Direction in Sydney, signed by the said Inspector and Directors, and verified by the oath of some Officer of the Bank, shall be registered in the Supreme Court within thirty days after the passing of the proposed Act, in the form set forth in a schedule annexed thereto; and that a similar Memorial shall be registered upon every change of the Inspector, or in the Direction.

That until such registration, no suit or proceeding shall be instituted by authority of the proposed Act.

That Shareholders shall be competent witnesses.

That every judgment against such Inspector or Director shall have the same effect against all the Shareholders as against the party in whose name any suit has been carried on.

That such nominal Plaintiff or Defendant shall be reimbursed by the Company.

That the Act shall extend to all future Proprietors or Shareholders of the said Bank.

That the proposed Act shall not affect the rights of Her Majesty.

That the proposed Act shall be a public Act.

M'Roberts and Bray claim the southern half also, and up to Hunter-

bearing south 9 degrees 30 minutes west 68 street, and allege that Ikin bought of William one corner of the allotment remains unclaimed, but is stated by Papps to belong to one Davey.
