## COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,  
E. DEAS THOMSON.

*"A Bill to consolidate and amend the Laws for the Distillation of Spirits in the Colony of New South Wales, and for the Issue of Licenses for Distilling, Rectifying, and Compounding Spirits therein, and for repealing certain Laws relating thereto."*

WHEREAS, it is expedient to repeal an Act passed in the Second Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled, "*An Act to regulate the Distillation of Spirits in the Colony of New South Wales, and for the Issue of Licenses for the Distilling, Rectifying, and Compounding Spirits therein,*" and to make other provision in lieu thereof, and to provide for the recovery of Fines and Penalties incurred respecting the same—It is proposed:—

That from and after the passing of the proposed Act, the said recited Act, 2 Victoria No. 24, shall be repealed; and that it shall not be lawful thereafter for any Person to carry on the business of a Distiller, &c., in any part of the Colony, except in the Town of Sydney, or in such other Towns or Places as His Excellency the Governor may appoint, under penalty of not less than £100, nor more than £500.

That Distillers, &c., shall be Licensed under penalty of not less than £100, nor more than £500.

That before such License be granted, the Party applying for the same shall transmit to the Colonial Secretary a Drawing of his Still, setting forth its dimensions, &c., and enter into a Recognizance in the sum of £500, conditioned for the faithful payment of all Spirits which may be Distilled and sold by him.

That such License shall be granted for the term of One Year, and no longer; that the sums to be paid for such Licenses respectively shall be, for the Distillation of Spirits, £50, and for the Rectifying or Compounding of Spirits, £25; and that such Licenses shall be renewed annually.

That Apothecaries, &c., may have Stills of not more than eight gallons content, on being Licensed thereto; but using such Stills for purposes other than Medical, or without such License, to forfeit from £100 to £500.

That no Person shall follow the business of a Brewer within any Premises Licensed for the Distillation, &c., of Spirits, under penalty of £100.

That no Person Licensed to Distil, &c., Spirits shall hold License to Retail Spirituous or Fermented Liquors.

That Spirits shall not be Sold by Licensed Distillers in quantities less than fifty gallons, nor by Rectifiers or Compounders in quantities less than two gallons, under penalty of £100.

That all Distilleries Licensed after the passing of the proposed Act shall be at certain distances from other Premises, and have surrounding Walls.

That a Store for the deposit of all Spirits Distilled shall be built within the Walls of each Licensed Distillery; that it shall not be lawful for any Person to enter the same except by permission and in presence of the Inspector of Distilleries; that such Store shall be registered by the Inspector; and that all Spirits found deposited elsewhere than in such Store shall be forfeited, and the Owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty of 40s. for every gallon of Spirits so found.

That all Licensed Stills shall be set in Stone, or in Brick and Mortar; and that the Owners shall provide Locks and Keys for the same.

That the Coolers belonging to each such Licensed Distillery shall be screwed down and firmly fastened at both ends in the Walls of the Building; and that the same shall not be altered without four days previous notice to the Inspector, under penalty of £10.

That the Cooler used for the Worts in each such Distillery shall not be of less content than the full

charge of the Still, under penalty of £10, and forfeiture of such Cooler.

That no Licensed Distiller shall have upon his Premises more than one Worm for each Still, except such as may be deposited within the Store aforesaid, under penalty of £20 for each Worm.

That each Distiller, &c., shall, immediately on obtaining his License, furnish to the Inspector a Return of the Stills to be used by him, setting forth the content of the same, with other particulars, under penalty of the forfeiture thereof.

That all vessels used in every such Distillery shall be marked and numbered.

That Persons obstructing admission of Officers at any time, shall be liable to a penalty of from £50 to £200.

That all Stills, Spirits, &c. found by Officers on any premises shall be liable to be seized, unless the Owner produce License for using or making the same.

That every Distiller shall give twenty-four hours previous notice of his intention to Distil, under penalty of £100.

That upon all Spirits Distilled in the Colony there shall be levied a Rate or Duty of for every gallon.

That every Licensed Distiller shall be charged for so many gallons, as each and every Still he may have made use of shall be found capable of producing from the greatest number of charges that can be worked off in twenty-eight days.

That no Spirits shall be removed out of the premises of any Licensed Distiller without a Permit, under penalty of the forfeiture thereof.

That Officers may enter any house, and seize Spirits upon which the Duty has not been paid.

That every grower of Wine on being Licensed thereto, and entering into Bond not to sell the same, may keep and use one Still, if not more than fifty, nor less than twenty-five gallons content, for the purpose of Distilling Brandy for his own consumption; and that persons having such Stills without such License, shall forfeit from £100 to £500.

That all claims for Spirits or other property seized under proposed Act, shall be lodged within one month after the seizure, in default of which the same shall be sold.

That all persons dealing in Colonial and Foreign Spirits shall keep the same in separate cellars, under penalty of £100, together with the forfeiture of the Spirits so mixed.

That every person who shall either sell or purchase Illicit Spirits, shall forfeit £100, together with such Spirits.

As to the recovery of Fines, Forfeitures, Penalties, and other legal proceedings under proposed Act.
