By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the Advice of the Legislative Council.

“An Act to remove Doubts concerning the Validity of certain Grants of Land in New South Wales.”

WHEREAS, certain Grants or Conveyances of parts of the Waste Lands of the Crown in the Colony of New South Wales, have been made and issued to divers persons under the Great Seal of the said Colony, and in the name of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, between the twentieth day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, being the day of the demise of His said late Majesty, and the twenty-fifth day of October in the same year, on which last-mentioned day the intelligence of the said demise first reached the said Colony; and whereas Doubts have been entertained whether such Grants or Conveyances made and issued as aforesaid are valid in Law, or binding upon Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors; and whereas, to remove such Doubts, and to quiet the Titles of Her Majesty's Subjects holding, or entitled to hold, any Lands in New South Wales so granted or conveyed as aforesaid, Her Majesty hath, through the Right Honorable Charles Lord Glenelg, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, been graciously pleased to signify Her Royal Will and Pleasure that all Grants or Conveyances of Lands made or issued by the Governor of the said Colony, under the Great Seal of the same, and in the name of His said late Majesty, during

the time aforesaid, in the exercise or supposed exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him as said Governor, should be valid in Law, and binding upon Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors: Be it therefore enacted,

All Grants, Deeds, or Conveyances made or issued during the period between the day of the demise of His late Majesty King William the Fourth and the date of the receipt in this Colony of the intelligence of such demise, to be as valid in Law, and as binding upon Her present Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, as if the same had been made or issued in the name of Her said present Majesty.

by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, That all Grants, Deeds, or Conveyances of any Land situated in the said Colony, that have been made or issued in the name of His said late Majesty King William the Fourth, at any time after the demise of His said Majesty, and on or before the twenty-fifth day of October in the year aforesaid, being the day on which the said demise was known in the said Colony, shall be, and shall be deemed, taken, and held to be, and to have been, from the respective dates thereof, as valid and effectual in Law to Grant and Convey such Lands, and shall be as binding upon Her Majesty, Her Heirs, and Successors, to all intents and purposes, as if such Grants, Deeds, or Conveyances had been made and issued in the name of Her present Majesty

Queen Victoria, and had been recorded in the most regular form of Law, anything, in any Act, or Law, or usage to the contrary, in anywise notwithstanding.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the Advice of the Legislative Council.

"An Act to enable the Society denominated Wesleyan Methodists to appoint Trustees for Chapels built before the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six."

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the seventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty 7 Wm. IV., King William the Fourth, intituled, No. 3, *"An Act to promote the Building of Churches and Chapels, and to provide for the Maintenance of Ministers of Religion in New South Wales,"* it was among other things recited and enacted, That it was expedient that Trustees should be appointed for those Churches or Chapels already built, which were repaired and maintained at the public expense, or for the Ministers whereof, stipends were issued from the Colonial Treasury, and that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the Advice of the Executive Council, within six months after the passing thereof, to nominate not less than three, nor more than five of the Pewholders of the said Church or Chapel belonging to the religious denomination for whose use the said Church or Chapel was maintained, to be Trustees thereof, and to whom, and the heirs of the survivor of such Trustees, should be conveyed, as soon as conveniently might be, the real estate in the said Church, or Chapel, or Minister's dwelling, upon trust, for the maintenance and repair of such Church or Chapel, and Minister's dwelling, and for the provision out of the revenues belonging to, or arising from, the use of the said Church or Chapel, in such manner as should be lawfully appointed, of all things necessary for the celebration of divine worship therein: And whereas, by another Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the said Colony, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, 2 Victoria, No. 7, *"An Act to regulate the Temporal Affairs of the Religious Societies denominated Wesleyan Methodists, Independents, and Baptists,"* it was among other things recited and enacted, That with regard to Chapels and Ministers' dwellings of the Religious Societies denominated Wesleyan Methodists, Independents, and Baptists, it was expedient to make further provision for creating a succession of properly qualified Trustees, according to the usages and regulations of the said Societies respectively, and for defining the manner in which the Trusts thereby created should be fulfilled; and that as soon as any Church or Chapel, and Minister's dwelling, belonging to the Societies aforesaid respectively, should be erected, it should be lawful for the Trustees, or the survivor of them,

or the heirs of such survivor, who should be appointed in pursuance of the Act herein first recited, and he and they were thereby authorised and required, at the request, in writing, of any three or more of the Subscribers to the undertaking, or of any three or more of the Members of the Society or denomination for whom the said Church or Chapel was erected, to convey the said Trust-premises, with any lands or hereditaments thereunto belonging, to any number of Trustees, to be nominated and elected according to the usages of such Society as aforesaid, not being less than three nor more than five, and to their heirs, to hold the real estate of, and in, the said hereditaments, to the use of such Society, upon the Trusts stated and set forth in a Model Deed of such Society, to be enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales within two years after the passing thereof: Provided always, That if the original Trustees, or the survivor of them, or the heirs of such survivor, should leave the Colony of New South Wales, or should become either naturally or legally incapacitated to act, or should neglect or refuse to make such conveyance for six calendar months after such requisition as aforesaid, then, in any of such cases, the fee simple of the Trust Estate should pass from the said original Trustees, or the survivor of them, or the heirs of such survivor, to the Registrar for the time-being of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, who was thereby authorised and required forthwith to make a proper conveyance of the said estate to the new Trustees, in manner therein set forth: And whereas, there are certain Chapels in the Town of Sydney, one situated in Macquarie-street, and another in Prince-street, the property of one of the Societies aforesaid, denominated the Wesleyan Methodist Society, for which Trustees have not been appointed according to the provisions of the said first recited Act; And whereas to entitle the two Wesleyan Chapels aforesaid to the benefits of the said first recited Act, it is necessary that Trustees should be appointed conformably to the provisions thereof, and of the said last recited

Act: Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, That any appointment of Trustees for the two Wesleyan Chapels aforesaid, which may have been heretofore made, shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be, null and void; and that the election and appointment of Trustees for the said two Wesleyan Chapels respectively, shall, and may be made as in the two hereinbefore recited Acts is directed, within six months from the passing of this Act.

LUNATIC ASYLUM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that no application for the admission of any person to the Lunatic Asylum at Tarban Creek can be attended to, unless it be accompanied by a Medical Certificate from some Practitioner duly qualified to give evidence on inquests, under the Act of Council 2 VICTORIA, No. 22, that the said Medical Practitioner has examined the person, and believes him, or her, to be insane.

The applications, accompanied by the necessary Certificate, are to be made to the Colonial Secretary for the Governor's approval, and if approved, an order will be given by the Colonial Secretary, to the Superintendent of the Asylum, for the admission of the Patient.

If the person required to be admitted be a Free Pauper, a Certificate from a Clergyman, or Magistrate of his District, should be forwarded with the application, to the effect that the party is not in circumstances to admit of his, or her, making any payment on account of the usual charges; otherwise, it will be necessary for the person applying, to enter into an engagement with the Superintendent of the Asylum to pay the sum of three shillings per diem for the time the Patient may remain in the establishment.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,

WITH a view to improvement in the conveyance of the Post-office Mails, and to induce a better establishment, it is proposed to afford an opportunity for the same, by extending the term of Contract to three years from 1st January, 1840. Should eligible Tenders be received, and persons disposed to Contract for their transit to and from the undermentioned places for three years, are invited to send their offers in writing to this Office until 12 o'clock on Thursday, the 1st August next, endorsed "*Tenders for Conveyance of Mails in Cumberland.*"

From and to Sydney and Windsor, via Parramatta daily (Sundays excepted).

From and to Sydney and Campbelltown, via Liverpool daily (Sundays excepted).

From and to Sydney and Penrith daily (Sundays excepted).

It will be required of persons tendering, to specify the rate demanded per mile, and payment will be made according to the number of miles actually run over, and computed for the distance by the Surveyor-General.

Each Tender must be accompanied by a plan or model of the vehicle it is proposed to use, and each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £50 not to use any other description of carriage without the express permission of the Postmaster-General, accidents only excepted.

Each vehicle is to be supplied with a commodious and secure box for the accommodation

of the Mail Bags, and to be drawn by two horses, and not to carry more than three passengers, exclusive of the Driver, under a penalty of Five pounds for a breach of agreement in either case.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start at the hours as now or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags or letters which may be delivered to him under the authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £5 for each and every offence over and above the penalties provided by the Act of Council for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers to the prejudice of the Post-office Revenue.

The Drivers employed, to be free men and of certified good character, and the Contractor to be answerable for the conduct of his agents and servants.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes' delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than seven miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes' delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement, to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor.

It is desirable that each party tendering, or an agent for him, may attend at this Office on the appointed day for opening the Tenders; and that each Tender may bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post-office, and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post-office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to apply.
