PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS, by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, sed in the Second Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, intituled " An Act for · Regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other "Towns respectively; and for removing and pre-" venting Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the "better Alignment of Streets therein," it was amongst other things enacted that whenever the Governor, or Acting-Governor for the time-being, shall deem it expedient to extend the same to any other Town in the said Colony, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor, or Acting-Governor for the time-being, to declare the same by Proclamation; Now, therefore, 1, the GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the Power and Authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby direct that the Provisions of the said Act be extended to the Town of KELSO, in the County of Roxburgh.

Commencing on the Macquarie River, at the north-west corner of an allotment granted to John Cooke; and bounded south-easterly by a line bearing east 30 degrees north 70 chains; northeasterly by a line bearing north 291 degrees west 131 chains; north-westerly by a line bearing west 35 degrees south 80 chains 33 links to the Macquarie River; and south-westerly by that river upwards to the north-west corner of the allotment granted to John Cooke as aforesaid.

N order to avert the calamities which must L necessarily follow if the Small Pox be introduced into the Colony, and to keep up a constant supply of Vaccine Lymph, His Excellency the Go-VERNOR directs it to be notified, that Children will

But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that a charge of one shilling shall be deposited for every Child vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the Child on the next Vaccination day.

His Excellency very strongly recommends to Parents and Guardians to avail themselves as early as possible of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution, with respect to all Children not already Vaccinated.

SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR PORT ESSINGTON.

Ships from Torres' Straits bound to Port Essington, after passing about ten miles to the northward of Cape Wessel, should steer a course that would carry them about the same distance north of New Year's Island, which lies in latitude 10 ° 55' South, longitude 133 ° 1' East; from thence a course that would take them at least twelve miles to the northward of Cape Croker, for there is a very dangerous shoal (which is not laid down in Captain King's Charts), with less than ten feet water on it, lying about seven miles to the northward of that Cape, on which two ships have struck lately. There is a channel between this shoal and the Cape, but it cannot be recommended to strangers as a safe passage, for its breadth and soundings are not yet known. Having brought Cape Croker to bear south, distant at least twelve miles, a direct course should be steered for Point Smith, which is the east point of the entrance to Port Essington. This point is low and sandy; it should be rounded at the distance of one mile and half in nine fathoms, to avoid a shoal reef running in a W. N. W. direction from it, but which generally shows itself. By bordering on Point Smith, as above directed, and avoiding mid-channel, ships will keep clear of a very dangerous reef, hitherto unknown, but now named " Orontes" Reef from the ship " Orontes," of London, having struck on it on the 18th of December, 1838. This ugly reef lies nearly mid-channel, and has only five feet on its centre at low water spring tides. From it, Bashon Head bears by compass S. W. by W. five miles nine-tenths-Point Smith S. E. by E. about six miles-and Turtle Point S. S. E.

After rounding Point Smith in nine fathoms, eteer about S. by B. & E 13 miles, and you will be abreast of Point Record, which is low and the climate extremely healthy.

Public Hospitals, or Colonial Surgeons, throughout | sandy, but steep too. In this track will be found nine, eight, seven, six, and five fathoms, at low water spring tides, with the bottom all mud.

Working in, after passing Point Smith, as above directed, ships may stand in on either side to about three-quarters of a mile of the shore; remembering always that Turtle Point and Ouster Head on the west side, Rocky Point, Table Head and Observation Cliff, on the east side, are all foul. Off the latter, in a N.W. direction, lies a rock which dries at low water, and is three-quarters of a mile off shore. This cliff may be known by its being the northern extremity of the southernmost Red Cliff outside Point Record. The Tamar Rock lies off Table Head, but is quite out of the way, even working in. When off Point Record, the water will deepen to ten and twelve fathoms at less than a cable's length from the point. Great care should be taken in passing between Point Record and the opposite shore, called " Spear Point," for the distance across is only one mile, and a very dangerons bank, with rocks that dry at low water on its S. E. extremity, stretch halfway across from Spear Point.

To avoid this shoal, ships should pass about a cable's length off Point Record, steering S. by E. until about half a mile to the southward of the Point. A S. S. W. course (allowing for tide) from thence will carry them to the anchorage of Victoria, in which track will be found seven, six, five, four, and three fathoms, at low water spring tides, the distance being about two miles and a quarter. Working up to the anchorage of Victoria from Point Record, with a southerly wind, being well clear of the shoal off Spear Point, stand to the eastward until Point Record bears north. By not standing further in, a shoal will be avoided which runs more than a mile north of Middle Head. Standing to the westward, tack the first shoal,

The Settlement of Victoria is on the west shore, and may be known by its standing on a promontory which is the highest piece of land on that side of the harbour. The northern part of this promontory is now named Minto Head, its latitude being 11 º 21' 45" South, and longitude 132 ° 18' 0" East, and its height from the level of the sea, about seventy-five feet. The southern part is a remarkable red cliff, the only one inside Point Record. It can be seen more than two miles outside Peint Record, and will always be a leading mark to the anchorage off the Settlement. With a fair wind, and inside Point Record, steer directly for it.

The best anchorage for ships not drawing more than sixteen feet water, is, with Minto Head bearing W. I N.; Point Record N. by E. E.; and the end of the red cliff S.W. 1 S.; in three fathoms low water, spring tides, on a muddy bottom. This anchorage is only a quarter of a mile from a very good pier which has just been built, where all cargoes may be landed with convenience and safety. Ships of greater draught should anchor a mile and half to the N. N. E. of the above berth. It is high water at full and change, at 3h. 30m. P. M. The rise and fall at spring tides, ten feet; but the neaps are very irregular. The flood runs to the southward, the ebb to the northward.
