HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bill, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.*

*" A Bill to alter and improve the mode of electing
" a Chairman for the Courts of General and
" Quarter Sessions in New South Wales."*

Whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the mode of electing the Chairman of the several Courts of Quarter Sessions throughout the Colony; It is proposed—

That the Chairman to be chosen, nominated and appointed, in manner and at the time hereinafter mentioned shall be a Barrister at law, of at least three years standing.

That the said Chairman, shall be chosen by the Justices of the Peace, attending at some place or places where Petty Sessions are holden, between the hours of twelve and four o'clock in the day, on the first Tuesday in the month of October in the present and every following year, by declaring in writing which of the several Justices so qualified as aforesaid, they severally and respectively desire to have appointed as such Chairman; and the Police Magistrate of the district, if present, or in his absence, the Senior Magistrate present shall forthwith transmit the voting paper or papers, or any declaration in writing as aforesaid, to the Colonial Secretary, for the purpose of being laid before the Governor, and the Justice of the Peace so qualified as aforesaid, in whose favour the greatest number of Justices throughout the Colony shall have so recorded their votes, or declaration in writing as aforesaid, shall be declared and appointed by the said Governor to be the Chairman of the several Courts of Quarter Sessions throughout the Colony, for the year then next following, commencing from the first day of January of such year: Provided that in case of an equality of votes for two or more Justices so qualified as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint either of the said Justices to be such Chairman as he shall see fit.

That nothing in the foregoing contained shall be construed to repeal or alter the existing provision for the appointment of a Chairman at distant places, or that for supplying the place of the Chairman in case of death, resignation, removal, or illness.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

NO eligible Tenders having been received for Conveyance of the Post Office Mails, from and to the undermentioned places, in pursuance of an advertisement from this Office, bearing date 9th July, 1839, and inserted in the *Government Gazette* of 24th July, Persons disposed to Contract for their Conveyance for Three Years from 1st January next, are invited to send their offers, in writing, to this Office, until twelve o'clock on Monday, the 30th September next, endorsed "*Tender for Conveyance of Mails in Cumberland.*" From and to Sydney and Windsor via Parramatta daily (Sundays excepted)

From and to Sydney and Campbelltown via Liverpool daily (Sundays excepted)

It will be required of persons tendering to specify the rate demanded per mile, and payment will be made according to the number of miles

actually run over and computed for the distance by the Surveyor-General.

Each Tender must be accompanied by a plan or model of the vehicle it is proposed to use, and each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of fifty pounds not to use any other description of carriage without the express permission of the Postmaster-General, accidents only excepted.

Each vehicle must be supplied with a commodious and secure box for the accommodation of the mail bags, and to be drawn by two horses, and not to carry more than three passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of five pounds for a breach of agreement in either case.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start at the hours as now or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags or letters which may be delivered to him under the authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of five pounds for each and every offence over and above the penalties provided by the Act of Council for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers, to the prejudice of the Post Office revenue.

The drivers employed to be free men, and of certified good character, and the Contractor to be answerable for the conduct of his agents and servants.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than seven miles per hour including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor.

It is desirable that each party tendering, or an agent for him, may attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and that each Tender may bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office, and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to tender are invited to apply.

H near rump, near ear out. One red and white Bullock, near ear out off, illegible brand off rump.

One brown and white Heifer, about twelve months old, no visible brand.

One red and white Bullock, wide horns, illegible brand off rump, W near rump near ear split.

One red and white Bullock, RJ off rump, like JMR near rump.

One brindle Cow, KK near rump, with a white Heifer

Calf, DB conjoined near ribs, H near rump, off ear split, near ear cut.

One grey and white Heifer, I near rump.

One red and white Steer, white star on forehead, EM off

ribs.

One red Steer, a cross within diamond off shoulder.

One red and white strawberry Heifer, about twelve months old, unbranded.

One yellow and white Cow, near rump, with a red Steer, about twelve months old.

If the above Cattle are not released, they will be sold in in twenty-one days from this date, agreeably to Act of Council.
