PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,
 Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of
 the Territory of New South Wales, and its
 Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same,
 &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a certain Act or Ordinance
 of the Governor and Legislative Council,
 passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late
 Majesty King WILLIAM THE FOURTH, intituled
 "An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws for
 the Transportation and Punishment of Offenders
 in New South Wales, and for defining the re-
 spective powers and authorities of General,
 Quarter Sessions and of Petty Sessions, and for
 determining the places at which the same shall
 be holden, and for better regulating the Summary
 jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and for
 repealing certain Laws and Ordinances relating
 thereto," it was amongst other things enacted,
 That Courts of General Quarter Session for the
 Colony of New South Wales should be held at
 Sydney, Parramatta, Campbelltown, Windsor,
 Maitland, and Bathurst, and at such other places
 within the said Colony, and at such times as the
 Governor for the time being should, by any Pro-
 clamations duly issued for such purpose, appoint ;
 Now therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of
 the power and authority so vested in me by the
 said recited Act, by this my Proclamation, do
 hereby appoint and direct that Courts of General
 Quarter Sessions shall be holden at the Town of
 BERRIMA, at such times as shall be hereafter fixed,
 of which all persons concerned are hereby required
 to take notice.

 vernment House, Sydney, this eighteenth
 day of September, in the Year of Our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 thirty-nine.

COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to
 direct that the general objects of the follow-
 ing Bills, now under consideration of the Legis-
 lative Council, be published for general inform-
 ation.

By His Excellency's Command,
 E. DEAS THOMSON.

1. "A Bill to provide for Trial by Jury, at the
 "Courts of Quarter Sessions, to be held at
 "Berrima."

Whereas, His Excellency the Governor hath,
 in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of Council
 3 WILLIAM IV., No. 3, issued his Proclamation
 whereby the Town of Berrima is appointed as a
 place at which Courts of General and Quarter
 Sessions shall be held ; and whereas it is necessary
 to provide for the trial of crimes, offences, and mis-
 demeanors, cognizable in the said Courts of Quarter
 Sessions, by Juries ; It is proposed,—

That all crimes, offences, and misdemeanors
 which shall be prosecuted in the said Courts, shall
 be tried by a Jury of twelve inhabitants of the
 Colony.

That all men residing within forty miles from
 the said town shall be liable to serve on Juries.

As to preparation of Juries, Lists, &c.

2. "A Bill for abolishing Arrest on Mesne Pro-
 cess in Civil Actions, except in certain cases,
 in New South Wales and the Dependencies
 thereof."

Whereas, the present power of Arrest on
 Mesne Process within the said Colony and its
 Dependencies, is unnecessarily extensive and
 severe, and ought to be relaxed ; It is proposed,—

That from and after the commencement of the
 proposed Act, no person shall be arrested on
 Mesne Process in any Civil Action, except in
 certain cases.

That no person shall be arrested or held to bail,
 unless on proof to the satisfaction of a Judge, that
 he is about to remove out of the jurisdiction of the
 Supreme Court, or to abscond to remote parts
 within the Colony.

As to proceedings under proposed Act.

3. "A Bill for extending the Remedies of Creditors against the Property of Debtors in New South Wales and the Dependencies thereof."

Whereas, the existing law in the Colony is defective in not providing more effectual means for enabling Creditors to obtain satisfaction from the Property of their Debtors; It is proposed—

That the Sheriff shall be empowered to seize money, bank notes, &c., and pay the sum to an Execution Creditor, and sue for amounts due by Bills of Exchange or other securities.

That the Stock and Shares in Public Companies belonging to any Debtor, and standing in his own name, shall by order of a Judge, stand charged with the payment of any judgment debt.

That securities not realised shall be relinquished, if the person of the Judgment Debtor be taken in execution.

As to proceedings under proposed Act.

4. "A Bill to authorise the Establishment of Markets in certain Towns in the Colony of New South Wales, and for the appointment of Commissioners to manage the same."

Whereas several of the Towns within the said Colony have, of late years, greatly increased, and are still increasing in population and buildings, by reason whereof Markets for supplying the inhabitants of the same with meat, fish, poultry, &c., and for the purposes of buying and selling goods, are required to be held therein; It is proposed—

That in any Town, on application of fifty inhabitants, the Police Magistrate may call a Public Meeting; and if, at such Meeting, a resolution in favor of establishing a Market in such Town be adopted, such Resolution, on approval of the Governor, shall be notified in the Government Gazette, and such Market shall be established accordingly.

YEARLY LEASES OF LAND.

WITH reference to the Regulations of 1st August, 1831, for the Leasing of Crown Lands, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it

to be notified, that in all future cases where Crown Lands are to be Let by Auction, and before the bidding on each lot is accepted, the Yearly Rent, if not exceeding Five Pounds, will be demanded at the fall of the hammer; and if above Five Pounds, a deposit of ten per cent. of the Yearly Rent will be required at the fall of the hammer; the balance to be paid within one month from the day of sale.

Parties failing to pay the balance within that period will forfeit the deposit of ten per cent., and likewise all right of occupancy to the land intended to have been leased.

In the event of the lease being determined by the Government, before the expiration of the term it has to run, the balance of the rent will be refunded to the lessee.

Twenty-seven and a half perches, county of Cumberland, town of Sydney, parish of Saint Phillip, allotment No. 11 of section No. 84; bounded on the east by George-street bearing north 45 minutes west 123 links; on the north by a line bearing west 1 degree north 138 links; on the west by vacant ground bearing south 45 minutes east 123 links; and on the south by allotment No. 10 bearing east 1 degree south 138 links.

This description was inserted in the Gazette of 13th April, 1839, page 441, in the name of Mrs. Eliza Broughton, preparatory to the making out of a Deed of Grant. Mr. O'Brien requests that the Deed may be subject to the trusts of the will of the late Mr. Broughton, he being a legatee.

Case No. 603.—James Cowan, of Bungonia, by his Attorney, James Norton, Esq.

No. 452. September 25, 1839.

Six hundred and forty acres, county of Cumberland, parish of Holsworthy, commencing at the north-east corner of W. Ikin's 200 acres grant; bounded on the north by a line bearing east 80 chains; on the east by a line south 80 chains; on the south by a line west 80 chains; and on the west by a line north 80 chains.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 6th of December, 1827, in favour of James and Andrew Cowan. Andrew, it is alleged, has released his right to his brother, and left the Colony. The description was inserted in the Gazette of 18th May, 1839, page 597, in the name of the promisees.

Case No. 504.—William Foster, of Laue Cove, in opposition to the Representatives of Capper Pass, deceased.

Fifty acres, county of Cumberland, parish of Gordon, commencing at the north-east corner of William Foster's grant of 70 acres, and bounded on the south-east by a line north 60 degrees east 30 chains; on the north-east by a line north 30 degrees west 20 chains; on the north-west by a line south 30 degrees west to the north-west corner of Foster's 70 acres; and on the south by that grant to the north-east corner thereof, as aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 30th October, 1822, in favour of William Foster, who, in the year 1837, requested the Deed of Grant to be prepared in the name of Capper Pass, deceased. Foster now claims it in his own name.

Case No. 505.—John Ford of Bathurst, by his Attorney, Augustus Hayward, Esq.

Two hundred acres, county of Westmoreland, parish unnamed, at Blaxland's Swamp; bounded on the north by Cox's River; on the east by part of Marsden's 600 acres being a line south 47 chains from Cox's River; on the south by a line west 45 chains to Blaxland's Swamp; and on the west by the water-course of the swamp.

This land was located on an order of Governor Macquarie's, dated October, 1821, in favour of William Orrell, now deceased, who, it is alleged, devised to claimant.
