### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

HEREAS, by an Act of the Governor with the Advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the present year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, intituled, "An Act to establish Courts of Requests at the Towns of " Melbourne and Port Macquarie, in the Colony of New South Wales," it is enacted, that Courts of Civil Jurisdiction, to be called Courts of Requests shall be holden at the Towns of Melbourne and Macquarie, in and for the said Towns and neighbourhoods, respectively, at such times as the Governor of the said Colony shall, by proclamation to be issued for that purpose, from time to time direct and appoint;—Now therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of Civil Jurisdiction, to be called Courts of Requests. shall be holden at the Town of Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, and at the Town of Macquarie, in the County of Macquarie, on the first Tuesday in every month, respectively.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to to direct, that the general objects of the following Bill, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command, E. DEAS THOMSON. "A Bill to enable the Churchwardens of the 
"Parish Church of Saint James, to build a 
"new side wall thereto, at a less distance from 
"the southern boundary line of King-street, 
"than is allowed by law."

Whereas, by the Act 5 WILLIAM IV., No. 20, persons are prohibited from building nearer than twelve feet from the curb-stone or outer edge of the footways in the town of Sydney; and whereas, by reason of the increased population of the parish of Saint James, in the said town, the accommodation afforded by the said Parish Church of Saint James is found to be insufficient for the numbers of persons desirous of attending Divine Service therein, and it is desirable to extend the same by enlarging the Church. It is proposed. that it shall be lawful for the Churchwardens of the said Church duly appointed under the provisions of the Act 8 WILLIAM IV., No. 5, to build a new side wall to the said Church on the foundations of that part of the dwarf wall at present enclosing the same, which fronts the southern boundary line of King-street, in the said town, notwithstanding that the said dwarf wall be at no greater distance from the curb-stone or outer edge of the footway than nine feet.

August, 1831, for the Leasing of Crown Lands, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that in all future cases where Crown Lands are to be Let by Auction, and before the bidding on each lot is accepted, the Yearly Rent, if not exceeding Five Pounds, will be demanded at the fall of the hammer; and if above Five Pounds, a deposit of ten per cent. of the Yearly Rent will be required at the fall of the hammer; the balance to be paid within one month from the day of sale.

Parties failing to pay the balance within that period will forfeit the deposit of ten per cent., and likewise all right of occupancy to the land intended to have been leased.

In the event of the lease being determined by the Government, before the expiration of the term it has to run, the balance of the rent will be refunded to the lessec. By His Excellency's Command,

TITH reference to the Government Notice of the 18th November, 1837, and the 12th December, 1838, intimating the intention of HER Majesty's Government, to discontinue, at the earliest possible period, the Assignment of Convicts in the Australian Colonies, the Governor directs a further notification to be made to the Colonists. informing them that by a despatch from the Most Noble THE MARQUIS OF NORMANBY, dated the 11th May, 1839, His Excellency is instructed that all Convicts arriving in future from the United Kingdom are to be transferred to Norfolk Island, as soon as preparations for their reception can be made in that settlement; and that they are not to be assigned to private individuals during any part of their servitude.

The Assignment Regulations applying therefore, henceforth, only to those Convicts who are already in the Colony, the Settlers must be prepared for the immediate diminution of Assignment, and the speedy discontinuance of it altogether.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above line of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance, but on all roads where Mail carriages can travel, a preferene will be given to that mode of conveyance; and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propos, and to provide secure lockers and dry covering for the Mail bags.

Mail carts drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses not more than six passengers, exclusive of the drivers; under a penalty of £3 for each

pose. The drivers and postmen to be free men, and of certified good character.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons. willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor. for the safety of the Mails and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to apply.

Printed Forms of Tender may be had on application at the General and all other Post Offices throughout the Colony.
