**ASSIGNED SERVANTS.**

**W**ITH reference to the Government Notice of the 18th November, 1837, and the 12th December, 1838, intimating the intention of HER MAJESTY'S Government, to discontinue, at the earliest possible period, the Assignment of Convicts in the Australian Colonies, the GOVERNOR directs a further notification to be made to the Colonists, informing them that by a despatch from the Most Noble THE MARQUIS OF NORMANBY, dated the 11th May, 1839, His Excellency is instructed that all Convicts arriving in future from the United Kingdom are to be transferred to Norfolk Island, as soon as preparations for their reception can be

made in that settlement; and that they are not to be assigned to private individuals during any part of their servitude.

The Assignment Regulations applying therefore, henceforth, only to those Convicts who are already in the Colony, the Settlers must be prepared for the immediate diminution of Assignment, and the speedy discontinuance of it altogether.

**C**ONVEYANCE being required for the Post Office Mails from and to the undermentioned places, for one year, from 1st January, 1840, Persons disposed to contract for providing the same are invited to transmit their offers, in writing, to this Office, before twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 16th day of November next, endorsed "Tender for Conveyance of Mails."

From and to Windsor, Pitt Town, Wilberforce, Richmond, and North Richmond, three times a week.

From and to Windsor and Wiseman's Ferry, once a week.

From and to Brisbane Water and Wiseman's Ferry, once a week.

From and to Penrith, Hassan's Walls, and Bathurst, three times a week.

From and to Bathurst and O'Connell, twice a week.

From and to Bathurst and Wellington, twice a week.

From and to Liverpool and Parramatta, daily Sundays excepted.

From and to Campbelltown, Liverpool, and Sydney, daily, Sundays excepted.

From and to Dapto and Shoalhaven, once a week.

From and to Campbelltown, Elderslie, Cawdor, and Berrima, three times a week.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start on days as now, or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to him under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty

of £5 for each and every offence, for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers, to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above line of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance, but on all roads where Mail carriages can travel, a preference will be given to that mode of conveyance; and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to provide secure lockers and dry covering for the Mail bags.

Mail carts drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses not more than six passengers, exclusive of the drivers; under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed for that purpose. The drivers and postmen to be free men, and of certified good character.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor, for the safety of the Mails and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to apply.

Printed Forms of Tender may be had on application at the General and all other Post Offices throughout the Colony.
