**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,  
 E. DEAS THOMSON.*

*"A Bill to enable the Members of a certain Society in the Colony of New South Wales, denominated 'The Hawkesbury Benevolent Society,' to sue and be sued in the name of their Treasurer for the time-being, and for other purposes therein contained."*

Whereas a Society has been for some years established at Windsor, in the Colony of New South Wales, called "The Hawkesbury Benevolent Society," which has for its object the relief of such poor persons as through age, accident, or infirmity, are unable to support themselves; and whereas, to ensure its permanent prosperity, it is expedient that some Member of the same should be enabled to sue, and should be liable to be sued in place of the whole. It is proposed;—

That the Society shall sue and be sued in name of their Treasurer.

That the said Treasurer shall be a competent witness.

That the Society shall hold Land in the name of their Trustees.

That the Lands belonging to the Society shall be vested in the said Trustees, and their survivors.

That in case of the death of any Trustee, another shall be appointed in his place.

That the Society may frame Bye Laws at General Meetings.

That change of Members shall not affect validity of Act.

That it shall be lawful for any two Justices of the Peace to punish any Inmate of the Asylum who shall waste any provisions, &c., committed to his charge, by imprisonment in the common gaol for any period not exceeding one month.

That the proposed Act shall not affect the rights of Her Majesty or others not mentioned therein.

That the proposed Act shall take effect from and after the publication of the Royal approbation in the *Government Gazette*.

*"A Bill to amend an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled 'An Act to regulate the Temporal Affairs of Presbyterian Churches and Chapels connected with the Church of Scotland, in the Colony of New South Wales.'"*

WHEREAS, certain powers, privileges and advantages were conferred upon the Presbytery of New South Wales, and the Ministers of the Churches and Congregations subject to the spiritual authority thereof, by the Act 8 William IV, No. 7; and whereas it is the desire of the said Presbytery, and expedient for the good government of the Presbyterian Church in the said Colony, that a Synod should be formed comprehending all the Ministers and Congregations in the said Colony in connexion with the Church of Scotland, and that the said Act, 8 William IV, No. 7, shall be amended so as to apply to the said "Synod of Australia in connexion with the Established Church of Scotland"—It is proposed, that all the said powers, privileges and advantages so conferred on the said Presbytery of New South Wales as aforesaid, shall vest in the said "Synod of New South Wales in connexion with the Established Church of Scotland," so soon as that body shall have been formed and confirmed by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

That the Real Estate in the several Churches or Chapels, and Ministers' Dwellings, and in the

sites of the same, which are now held in behalf of Congregations under the spiritual superintendence of the Presbytery of New South Wales, shall continue to be held by the said Trustees and their successors in behalf of Congregations under the spiritual superintendence of the said Synod; and that the proposed Act shall not take effect until after notification in the *Government Gazette* of satisfactory proof having been adduced to the Governor and Executive Council of the approval and confirmation of the said Synod by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

*"A Bill to make good certain Contracts which have been, or may be entered into by certain Banking and other Co-Partnerships."*

WHEREAS, divers Spiritual Persons have been, and are Members of, or Shareholders, or otherwise interested in divers Associations and Co-Partnerships, consisting of more than Six Shareholders, which have been formed from time to time for the purpose of carrying on the business of Banking, and other trades and dealings, for the purpose of gain and profit; and whereas doubts have arisen as to the legality of the same, it is proposed, that no such Association or Co-Partnership already formed, or which may be hereafter formed, nor any Contract heretofore, or which may hereafter be entered into by any such Association or Co-Partnership for the purposes thereof, shall be deemed, or taken to be illegal or void, by reason only of any such Spiritual Person having been, or becoming a Member of, or Shareholder in any such Association or Co-Partnership as aforesaid.

**CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.**

**C**ONVEYANCE being required for the Post Office Mails from and to the undermentioned places, for one year, from 1st January, 1840, Persons disposed to contract for providing the same are invited to transmit their offers, in writing, to this Office, before twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 16th day of November next, endorsed "*Tender for Conveyance of Mails.*"

From and to Windsor, Pitt Town, Wilberforce, Richmond, and North Richmond, three times a week.

From and to Windsor and Wiseman's Ferry, once a week.

From and to Brisbane Water and Wiseman's Ferry, once a week.

From and to Penrith, Hassan's Walls, and Bathurst, three times a week.

From and to Bathurst and O'Connell, twice a week.

From and to Bathurst and Wellington, twice a week.

From and to Liverpool and Parramatta, daily Sundays excepted.

From and to Campbelltown, Liverpool, and Sydney, daily, Sundays excepted.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start on days as now, or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to him under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £5 for each and every offence, for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers, to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above line of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance, but on all roads where Mail carriages can travel, a preference will be given to that mode of conveyance; and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to provide secure lockers and dry covering for the Mail bags.

Mail carts drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses not more than six passengers, exclusive of the drivers; under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed for that purpose. The drivers and postmen to be free men, and of certified good character.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor, for the safety of the Mails and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to apply.

Printed Forms of Tender may be had on application at the General and all other Post Offices throughout the Colony.
