IS Excellency the Governor having deemed it expedient to open and make certain Parish Roads in the Districts of SEAHAM and BUTTERWICK, as hereunder described, Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the Provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4 Wm. IV, No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, "altering, and improving the Roads throughout "the Colony of New South Wales, and for " opening and improving the Streets in the Towns "thereof," Surveys and Tracings showing the intended lines of the said Roads are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor-General; and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Roads, viz. :-

1. Commencing at the termination of the marked Road to the Ferry, which is about a mile and a half north of the said Ferry, near the confluence of the Hunter and Paterson, and extending northerly to the village reserve of Butterwicks and thence in a north-easterly direction to Clarence Town.

- 2. Commencing at the Ferry at the confluence of the Rivers Paterson and Hunter, and extending easterly along or near to the north bank of the River Hunter, and across the Williams' River through the property known as Pennington's to the Raymond Terrace Road.
- Commencing opposite West Maitland at the West Maitland Ferry, and extending in a north-east and then in an easterly direction through the properties known as M'Dougall's, Bulwarra, and Phænix Park, across the Paterson River to where the first Road commences.
- 4. Commencing on the second Road at about a mile and a half west of the Williams' River, and at the point where the fifth Road commences, and extending northerly to the Town of Seaham and onwards about two miles, when it turns north-easterly to Clarence Town.
- 5. Commencing on the second Road about a mile and a half west of the Williams' River, and at the point where the fourth Road commences, and extending north-westerly to the village toserve of Butterwick, and thence to a punt on the River Paterson, opposite the Town of

They will also as soon as practicable after the close of the year bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted, and liquidated within one month after its termination.
