PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, it is ordered and directed that Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden at certain places therein respectively set forth; and at such times as the Governor for the time being shall by any Proclamation duly issued for such purpose appoint, Now, therefore, I the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby direct and appoint that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden in the Town of Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, on the twenty-ninth day of January next ensuing, and from and after that date, on the first Monday in each of the months of January, April, July and October, in each and every year.

the Courts of Requests for the Town of Melbourne in the County of Bourke, to be holden on other days than those fixed by the said proclamation, Now, therefore, I the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of Civil Jurisdiction to be called Courts of Requests, shall be holden at the Town of Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, on the first Mondays and following days in the months of January, April, July and October, and in each and every year respectively.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a despatch, dated 13th July, 1839, signified Her Majesty's disallowance of the Act of Council, No. 1, 1837, intituled, "An Act for regulating the appointment of the Surveyor of the Town of Sydney, and for transferring to other persons, certain powers heretofore vested in the Surveyor-General of New South Wales, and in the Surveyors and assistant Surveyors of the Colony;" it appearing inexpedient that the Commanding Royal Engineer, or any Officer of his Department, should in his official capacity as such, be charged with the duties, or invested with the powers intended to be imposed or conferred upon him by the said Act.

#### PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of the present month, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands, respectively, up to that date, so that the entire revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient dispatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of the current month to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st instant.

They will also as soon as practicable after the close of the year bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted, and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any

instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Public Officers concerned.

#### ROADS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR having deemed it expedient to open and make certain Parish Roads in the Districts of SEAHAM and BUTTERWICK, as hereunder described, Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the Provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4 Wm. IV., No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof;" Surveys and Tracings shewing the intended lines of the said Roads are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor-General; and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Roads, viz:—

1. Commencing at the termination of the marked Road to the Ferry, which is about a mile and a half north of the said Ferry, near the confluence of the Hunter and Paterson, and extending northerly to the village reserve of Butterwick, and thence in a north-easterly direction to Clarence Town.
2. Commencing at the Ferry at the confluence of the Rivers Paterson and Hunter, and extending easterly along or near to the north bank of the River Hunter, and across the Williams' River through the property known as Pennington's to the Raymond Terrace Road.
3. Commencing opposite West Maitland at the West Maitland Ferry, and extending in a north-east and then in an easterly direction through the properties known as M'Dougall's, Bulwarra, and Phoenix Park, across the Paterson River to where the first Road commences.
4. Commencing on the second Road at about a mile and a half west of the Williams' River, and at the point where the fifth Road commences, and extending northerly to the Town of Seaham and onwards about two miles, when it turns north-easterly to Clarence Town.
5. Commencing on the second Road about a mile and a half west of the Williams' River, and at the point where the fourth Road commences, and extending north-westerly to the village reserve of Butterwick, and thence to a punt on the River Paterson, opposite the Town of Paterson.
