HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command.

No. 1. "A Bill to enable the Members of a certain Society in the Colony of New South Wales denominated the 'Hawkesbury Benevolent Society,' to sue and be sued in the name of the Treasurer for the time being, and for other purposes therein contained."

A Society called the "HAWKESBURY BENEVOLENT SOCIETY," having been for some years established at Windsor, in the Colony of New South Wales, which has for its object the relief of such poor persons, as through age, accident, or infirmity, are unable to support themselves; and it being deemed necessary to the permanent prosperity of such Society, that some one member thereof should be enabled by law to sue and be sued in place and stead of the whole; it is proposed—

That all actions, suits, and other proceedings whatsoever, whether at law or in equity, by or against the said Society, may be lawfully commenced, prosecuted, and carried on by or against their Treasurer for the time being.

That it shall be lawful for the said Society by and in the name of their Trustees for the time being, to accept, take, and hold any estate or estates in lands, tenements, or hereditaments already granted, or hereafter to be granted to them by the Crown, but no other estate or estates whatsoever; and that the same shall be vested in such Trustees, who, within a certain time after their election, shall declare by deed, in writing, that the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, books, accounts, &c. so to be vested in them, shall be held, accepted, and taken by them in trust only, and to and for the sole use, benefit, and advantage

of the said Society, and to and for no other use, trust, or purpose whatsoever.

That the whole of the estates, lands, tenements, and hereditaments so to be vested in such Trustees, shall revert to and become vested in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, if, by default of any election of Trustees, the number of such Trustees shall at any time be reduced, and continue for any one entire year, below the number of five.

That the Governor may appoint visitors, with power fully to inspect, enquire into, and report on the affairs of the said Society, and if, by the report of such visitors, it shall appear to the Governor and Executive Council, that the affairs of the Society have not been discreetly or properly managed, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor for the time being, with the advice of the Executive Council, to remove the whole or any one or more of such Trustees, and to appoint others in their stead; or if it shall at any time appear by any such report, that the value of the whole estates, property, and effects, real and personal, then vested in the said Society, exceeds the sum of £40,000, or if it shall so appear that the annual income or revenue of the Society exceeds the sum of £3,000, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that a portion of such annual income or revenue shall be paid to the Trustees or Directors of any other Society or Societies then established for the relief of the poor in the Town of Windsor, or at any Town or place within a distance not exceeding thirty miles in any direction therefrom, for the benefit of such Town or place.

No. 2. "A Bill to provide for the Maintenance of deserted Wives and Children."

Several instances having occurred in this Colony and its Dependencies, of persons deserting their Wives or their Children, and leaving them without adequate means of support; it is proposed—

That if it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of any Justice of the Peace, that any married woman hath been unlawfully de-

serted by her husband, or hath been left by him without means of support, it shall be lawful for such Justice, upon complaint by her, or by any respectable householder on her behalf, to cause a summons to be issued directing such husband to appear before any two Justices, to show cause why his wife should not be supported by him; and in any case of actual desertion or threatened desertion, or of the husband having quitted his usual place of residence, it shall be lawful for the Justice, upon proof thereof on oath, to issue a warrant for the husband's apprehension, in order to compel such appearance.

That it shall be lawful for such Justices, in case they shall be satisfied that the wife is in fact, without means of support, and that her husband is able to maintain her, or to contribute to her maintenance, to make an order in writing, directing him to pay, either weekly or monthly, such sum or allowance as they shall consider proper.

That every man who has permitted a woman to assume the character of his wife shall, for the purposes of the proposed Act, be deemed the husband of such woman, but no man shall be liable for the maintenance of a woman whom he has put away for adultery.

That all such provisions of the proposed Act with respect to wives, shall extend equally to children, illegitimate as well as legitimate, but no man shall, for the purposes of the proposed Act, be taken to be the father of any illegitimate child upon the oath of the mother only; and if the mother of any child is able to contribute to its support, it shall be lawful for the Justices to direct that she shall so contribute as well as the father; and if it shall appear that the mother only is of such ability, then the Justices may make an order in respect of her alone.

No. 3. "A Bill for vesting all Estates and Property in the Colony of New South Wales occupied for the Ordnance Service, in the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance, and for granting certain powers to the said Principal Officers."

Divers messuages, lands, tenements, estates, and other hereditaments belonging to the Crown, in the Colony of New South Wales, having been long reserved and used for military purposes, and the same being now actually in the custody and under the charge of the respective officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance resident in the said Colony, and acting under the orders of the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance, resident in England; and it being expedient that the principal officers, or the resident respective officers acting under their authority, should have certain powers to acquire, hold, and alienate lands, tenements, estates or hereditaments, which they do not now possess; it is proposed—

That the principal officers shall have power to have and to hold all such messuages, lands, tenements, or other hereditaments heretofore used for military purposes, as by Her Majesty may be conveyed to them by Deed of Grant from the Crown; and that the said messuages,

lands, tenements, and other hereditaments, with all erections and buildings now or hereafter to be erected or built thereon, together with the rights, members, easements, and appurtenances to them respectively belonging, shall be, and become and remain and continue vested in the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance in Great Britain for the time being, and their successors in the said office, according to the respective nature and quality of the said messuages, lands, tenements, and other hereditaments respectively, in trust for Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, for the service of the said Ordnance Department, or for such other military service or services as the said principal officers, or their successors in the said office shall, from time to time, order and direct.

That from and after the purchase and conveyance, grant or demise thereof, all other messuages, lands, tenements, estates, and other hereditaments which shall, at any time or times hereafter be granted to, or purchased by the said principal officers for the time being, or by any other person or persons by their order for the service of the Ordnance Department, and all buildings which shall then, or which may hereafter be erected thereon, with the rights, members, easements, and appurtenances to the same respectively belonging, by whatever mode of conveyance, either unto or in the name of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors or otherwise, the same shall be granted, purchased, or taken, shall, in like manner, be and become and remain, and continue vested in the said principal officers.

That it shall be lawful for the said principal officers for the time being, or for the respective or other chief officers or officer of the Ordnance resident in the Colony for the time being, for and on behalf of the said principal officers, to sell, exchange, or in any manner dispose of, or to let or demise, as well any of the messuages, lands, tenements, estates, and other hereditaments respectively, which shall be so vested in them as aforesaid, with their respective appurtenances, either by public auction or by private contract, in due form of law, as to convey, surrender, or assign, or make over, or grant or demise the same respectively, (as the case may require) to any person or persons who shall be willing to purchase, or take the same in exchange or otherwise, respectively, and also to do any other act, matter, or thing, in relation to any such messuages, lands, tenements, estates, and other hereditaments, which shall by the said principal officers, or other chief officers or officer, be deemed beneficial to the public service in relation thereto, or for the better management thereof, which might be done by any person having a like interest in any such messuages, lands, tenements, estates, or other hereditaments.

That the monies to arise and be procured by the sale or exchange of any such messuages, lands, tenements, estates, or other hereditaments as aforesaid, shall be paid by the respective purchasers thereof, or by the persons making such exchange, unto the respective or other

chief officers or officer of the Ordnance in the Colony of New South Wales, or to such other person or persons as the principal officers shall appoint to receive the same, for the use of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors.

That it shall be lawful for all persons and for all Bodies Politic or Corporate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, to contract or agree with the said Principal Officers or with the Respective, or other Chief Officers or Officer, for the time being, either for the absolute sale or for the exchange of any Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Estates, or other Hereditaments.

That all such Contracts and Agreements shall be valid, without the Principal, or Respective, or other Chief Officers or Officer, being specially named therein.

No. 4. "A Bill to continue for a limited time an Act intitled an Act for preventing the extension of the disease commonly called the Influenza or Catarrh in Sheep and Lambs, in the Colony of New South Wales."

As the Act 2 Victoria, No. 12, will expire on the ninth day of October next ensuing,— it is proposed to continue the provisions thereof for two years from that date.

No. 5. "A Bill to further continue for a limited time an Act entitled an Act to facilitate the apprehension of transported Felons and Offenders illegally at large, and of Persons found with Arms, and suspected to be Kobbars."

As the Act 5 William IV, No. 9, will expire on the 31st day of August next ensuing, it is proposed further to continue the same for two years from that date.

No. 6. "A Bill further to continue for a limited time an Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases in the Supreme Court of New South Wales."

As the Act 2 William IV, No. 3, will expire on the 30th of June, 1840, it is proposed further to continue the same for two years from that date.

No. 7. "A Bill to amend an Act intitled 'An Act to repeal an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales entituled an Act to authorize the erection of Pounds, and for regulating the impounding of Cattle, and to make further and other provisions in lieu thereof, and to extend the provisions thereof:'"

By the Act 4 William IV, No. 3, it is enacted, that the Keeper of every Public Pound, shall, in certain cases, cause notice of all cattle impounded in such Pound to be inserted in the next *Government Gazette* which may be published after the expiration of twenty-four hours from the impounding of such cattle, and such enactment having been found to be oppressive to the owners of such cattle in remote districts, It is proposed,

That it shall be lawful for the Governor to declare by an order in the *Government Gazette*, that the Pound Keeper of every Public Pound in any such order mentioned, shall not be required to cause such notice to be published in the *Government Gazette*, but that in lieu thereof such notice may be inserted in any one or more of the public newspapers which may be published within, or nearest to the

district wherein such Public Pound may be situate.

It is also enacted, by the said Act, that it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any cattle belonging to him or her, to stray or to go about or to be tethered, or depastured in any Street or Public Place within the limits of certain Towns therein specified, and there being many other Towns and Districts in the Colony that are rapidly increasing in population and trade to which it may hereafter be advantageous to extend such enactment, It is proposed,

That it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to extend the same accordingly to any other Town or District within the said Colony.

No. 8. "A Bill to provide for the establishment and regulation of Municipal Corporations within the Territory of New South Wales."

It being expedient and desirable that Bodies Corporate should be constituted within certain Towns in the Territory of New South Wales, It is proposed,

That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor to issue Charters or Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Colony for the incorporation of the inhabitants of any town within the Colony and its Dependencies, provided that such inhabitants shall have applied for the same by Petition to the Governor, and that at the last general census preceding the issuing of such Charter or Letters Patent, the number of such inhabitants shall not have been less than ———.

That every Town so incorporated shall be a Borough, and that the Body Corporate thereof shall take and bear the name of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses, of such Borough, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be capable by Law to do and suffer all Acts as a Body Corporate.

That the Metes and Boundaries of every Borough shall be set out, marked and described, and published in the *Government Gazette*,

That every male person of the full age of 21 years, who shall have occupied any House, Warehouse, Counting-house, or Shop, within any Town, during One whole year, preceding the date of the Charter or Letters Patent incorporating such Town, and having also during the same period been an inhabitant householder in the said Town, shall, if duly enrolled, be a Burgess of such Borough; and that every male person of the full age aforesaid, who on the last day of _____ in any year, after the

incorporation of such Town, shall have occupied any House, Warehouse, Counting-house, or shop, of the clear annual value of Ten Pounds, during the whole of One year, preceding such date, being also during such occupation, an inhabitant householder within the said Borough or within seven miles thereof, shall, if duly enrolled in that year, be a Burgess of such Borough, provided that no person shall be so enrolled in any year, who, within the Twelve Calendar Months preceding, shall have received relief (in-doors) in any Bene-

volent Asylum, or other Charitable Institution, or who may have had any child admitted to any Orphan School, within the three years preceding; and provided further that no person shall be so enrolled who having come to the Colony, or having been sent therefrom, under sentence of Transportation, shall have returned thereto, and shall not have received a Free Pardon, or whose sentence shall not have expired for a period of at least three years, or who shall not have held a Conditional Pardon for the same period.

That it shall be lawful for any occupier of any House, Warehouse, Counting-house, or Shop, to claim to be rated for any of the purposes mentioned in the proposed Act, and such occupier, after having actually paid or tendered the full amount of the last made rate then payable in respect to such premises, shall have his name put upon the rate for the time being, but the sum shall not be deemed to vary or discharge the liability of the Landlord of any such premises, if such occupier should make default in the payment of such rate.

That in all cases where any House, Warehouse, Counting-house, or Shop, shall come to any person by Descent, Marriage, Marriage Settlement, or Demise, such person shall be entitled to reckon the occupancy and rating, in respect of the occupancy thereof by the person from or by whom the same shall have so come to him, as his own occupancy and rating conjointly with the time during which he shall have since occupied and been rated for the same, and shall be entitled to be enrolled a Burgess in respect thereof, if he shall be otherwise duly qualified.

That persons to be called Collectors shall be appointed by the Mayor to keep the Burgess lists for each Parish within the Borough, which lists shall contain the names of all persons entitled to be enrolled as Burgesses.

That on the incorporation of any Borough, a Commissioner and two Assessors shall be appointed by the Governor for the revision of the first Burgess lists, and that annually thereafter the Mayor and two Assessors shall revise such lists.

That such revised lists shall be delivered to the Town Clerk, who shall cause copies thereof to be written or printed every year for distribution to parties requiring the same, on payment of a reasonable sum.

That on the day of in every year, there shall be elected for such Borough, a Mayor, Alderman, and Councillors, who shall be called the Council of such Borough, and the number of persons so to be elected Councillors of such Borough shall be fixed in proportion to the number of inhabitants of such Borough, and the number of persons so to be elected Alderman shall be one-third of the number to be elected Councillors.

That none but those persons who shall be duly enrolled on the Burgess lists, shall be entitled to vote in the election of Councillors, and of Auditors and Assessors.

That on the day of in every year, the Burgesses so duly enrolled shall openly assemble and elect from persons among

themselves qualified to be Councillors, the Councillors of such Borough, or such part of them as shall be needed to supply the places of those who shall then go out of office.

That after the first election of Councillors upon the day of in every succeeding year, one-third part of the number appointed to be the whole number of the Councillors of the Borough shall go out of office, and those who so go out of office shall be the Councillors who were elected under the provisions of the proposed Act by the smallest number of votes—the majority of the whole Council always determining, in the event of an equality of votes, who shall be the persons so to go out of office; and thereafter those who shall so go out of office, shall always be the Councillors who have been for the longest time in office without re-election; provided that any Councillor so going out of office shall be capable of being forthwith re-elected, if then qualified.

That first elections of Councillors shall be held before the Commissioners and Assessors to be appointed by the Governor, and that all elections thereafter shall be before the Mayor and Assessors.

That on the day of in every year the Burgesses shall elect from persons qualified to be Councillors, two Burgesses who shall be called the Auditors of the Borough, and two other Burgesses who shall be the Assessors of the Borough, and every such Auditor and Assessor shall continue in office until the day of in the year following his election.

That if, at the time appointed to execute the powers and duties in the proposed Act provided with respect to Elections, the Mayor of any Borough shall be dead, absent, or otherwise incapable of acting, the Council shall forthwith elect one of the Aldermen of such Borough to execute all such powers and duties in place of such Mayor.

That on the day of in every year after the first election of Councillors, and on the day of in every third succeeding year, the Council of every Borough shall elect from the Councillors, persons to be the Aldermen of such Borough, or so many as shall be needed to supply the places of those who shall then go out of office; and that upon the day of in every third succeeding year, one half of the whole number of Aldermen of every Borough shall go out of office, and the Councillors immediately after the first election of Aldermen shall appoint who shall be the Aldermen so to go out of office in the third succeeding year to such election. And thereafter those who shall go out of office shall always be those who have been Aldermen for the longest time without re-election; provided that any Alderman so going out of office may be forthwith re-elected if then qualified, but shall not be entitled to vote in the election of a new Alderman.

That on the day of in every year the Council of every Borough shall elect, from among the Aldermen or Councillors the

Mayor of such Borough, who shall continue in office for one year.

That the Mayor and Aldermen shall continue to be members of the Council of such Borough during their respective offices.

That no person in Holy Orders, or being a regular Minister of any Dissenting Congregation shall be qualified to be a Councillor or an Alderman of any Borough, nor any person who shall not be entitled to be on the Burgess List; nor any person who shall not be possessed of real or personal estate to the amount of one thousand pounds, or rated upon the annual value of not less than thirty pounds in all Boroughs to be divided into four or more Wards, or real or personal estate to the amount of at least five hundred pounds, or be rated upon the annual value of not less than fifteen pounds in Boroughs divided into less than four Wards, or in Boroughs which shall not be divided into Wards; nor any person actually holding any place of profit other than that of Mayor, in the gift of the Council of such Borough; nor any person who shall at the time have directly or indirectly by himself or his partner any share or interest in any contract or employment with, by, or on behalf of such Council; (provided that no person shall be disqualified from being a Councillor or Alderman by reason of his being a proprietor or shareholder of any Company which shall contract with the Council for lighting, or supplying with water, or insuring against fire, any part of such Borough); nor any person who shall at any time have been under sentence of transportation whether to or from the colony.

That whenever the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall deem it proper that any Borough shall be divided into Wards, every such Borough shall be so divided into Wards accordingly, provided that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall approve of the particulars of such division.

That after the division of any such Borough into Wards, the Governor and Executive Council shall apportion a certain number of Councillors to each Ward; the Councillors so apportioned to each Ward being a number divisible by three, and such number shall be and continue to be the number of Councillors to be elected for such Ward, until the same shall be altered by authority of the Governor and Legislative Council.

That the Burgesses of every Ward shall, on the day fixed for the first election of Councillors, separately elect from the persons qualified to be Councillors, the whole number of Councillors apportioned to such Ward; and on the day of in any subsequent year the Burgesses shall separately elect, from the persons qualified to be Councillors, one third part of the whole number of Councillors apportioned to such Ward; and on the day of next after the first election of Councillors in such Ward, and on the same day in every subsequent year, the said Burgesses shall separately elect, from the persons qualified to be Councillors, two Assessors for such

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ward; and every such ward election, first after such division into wards as aforesaid, shall be held before the Mayor, or the person whom the Mayor shall appoint on that behalf, and in every succeeding year such election shall be held before the Aldermen whom the Councillors chosen in such Ward shall yearly appoint in that behalf; and before the two Assessors of such Ward; and the Assessors who shall hold the Court for revising the Burgess Lists with the Mayor, shall be the Assessors of the Mayor's Ward; and the votings and other proceedings in all other respects shall be conducted in the same manner as at elections of Councillors or Assessors respectively by the Burgesses of the whole Borough; and the Aldermen and Assessors of each Ward shall have the same powers in regard to elections in their Ward, as the Mayor and Assessors for the whole Borough would have had if such Borough were not divided into Wards; and every person so elected a Councillor or an Assessor in such Ward, shall hold office for the same length of time that he would have held it if he had been elected by the Burgesses of the whole Borough and the number elected in such Ward had been the whole number for such Borough.

That Burgesses rated for property in two or more Wards, shall be entitled to vote in each.

That no person elected Mayor, or Alderman, or Councillor, or Auditor, or Assessor for any Borough, shall be capable of acting in such capacity until he shall declare his acceptance of office.

That every person so elected shall accept office or pay a fine.

That any Mayor, Alderman, Councillor, Auditor, or Assessor, who shall become bankrupt, or being a Mayor, shall be absent from the Borough for more than two calendar months, or being an Alderman, Councillor, Auditor, or Assessor, shall be absent for more than six calendar months at one and the same time, shall immediately become disqualified for and shall cease to hold such office; and in the case of absence shall be liable to a fine as for the non-acceptance of office; provided that every person so becoming disqualified on account of bankruptcy or absence, shall be capable of re-election if not then otherwise disqualified, upon the full satisfaction of his debts, or upon his return to such Borough, respectively as the case may be.

That any disqualified person who shall act in any of the said capacities after he shall have become in any way so disqualified as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty.

That every person convicted of bribery shall be liable to pay a penalty, and be for ever thereafter disqualified to vote in any Municipal election within the Colony.

That the Mayor and Alderman of every such Borough shall be ex-officio Justices of the Peace for such Borough.

That Justices of the Peace for the Territory shall not have jurisdiction within any such Borough.

That the Governor may appoint Justices of the

Peace for each Borough, as well as for the adjoining County, or for any more extensive jurisdiction.

That the Council of every Borough shall have power to appoint the Town Clerk, the Treasurer, the Surveyor, and such other officers as they may deem necessary, provided no such officer be a member of the Council.

That the Council may make allowance to Mayor, and pay salaries to the Town Clerk, Treasurer, and all other officers employed for the purposes of the proposed Act.

That the rents and profits of all property belonging to or vested in the Corporation of any Borough, and all fines levied under the proposed Act, and the proceeds of all rates, shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough, and be applied towards the payment of the allowances and salaries of the officers, and all other the necessary expenses of such Borough.

That two or more Justices having jurisdiction within any Borough shall yearly in the month of October appoint Special Constables for such Borough.

That the Council of every Borough shall have power to make a distinct rate, to be called the "Police Rate," for the support of the Police of such Borough.

That the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of every Borough, shall possess a Common Seal, and may sue and be sued by and in the name of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of such Borough; and in all cases of legal proceedings, service of notice thereof upon either the Mayor or Town Clerk, shall be deemed and taken to be sufficient service upon the Corporate Body.

That the Mayor and Councillors of every Borough shall have the same powers, authorities, and duties in respect to Markets, as are vested in the Commissioners appointed or to be appointed under the Act 3 Victoria No. 19.

That the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of every Borough, may accept and hold property for charitable purposes.

That the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of every Borough, shall make a Lighting Rate yearly, and have power to contract for lighting the streets and public places within such Borough.

That the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of every Borough, shall have the direction of the formation and repair of Streets within the Borough.

That the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of every Borough, may hold, construct, and maintain Water-works in such Borough, and fix the rent to be charged for water.

That the Council of every Borough shall have power to make Bye-laws for regulating the sale and quality of bread and butcher's meat—for regulating bathing—for the suppression of disorderly houses—for the prohibition of forestalling—and regulations for the preservation in a wholesome state—of tanneries, &c.—for the regulation of carters, porters, &c.—for the regulation of slaughter-houses—for the suppression of noisome trades, and of gambling of every description—for the prevention of obstruction in the streets, &c.—and for the regulation of flagging, paving, and repairing the streets.

As to the power of the Council to impose fines for breach of Bye-laws;—to compel the rendering

of accounts, &c. by officers;—to remove officers;—to appoint where records shall be kept;—and as to legal proceedings under proposed Act.

No. 9.—"A Bill to exempt from Duty and Wharfage Rates for a certain time Flour and Meal and Wheat, and other Grain and Pulse, imported into New South Wales."

It being expedient for a certain period to exempt flour, wheat, &c. from duty and wharfage rates, it is proposed:

That all flour and meal, and all wheat and other grain and pulse, which may be imported to this Colony on or before the 31st day of December next ensuing, shall be exempt from all duties and wharfage charges whatsoever.

If any assistance be required towards the erection of buildings, the application must be made in the annexed form Z, specifying the object, amount of contributions collected, and other particulars therein mentioned; nominating Trustees for the approval of the Governor and Executive Council; enclosing a plan and specification of the intended Building; and describing the nature of the Title to the site, without satisfactory proof of the validity of which, no aid whatever can be granted towards the purpose stated.

5. If the objects of the Institution, and the manner of conducting it, are such as in the opinion of the Governor to render it deserving of support from the public funds, application will be made to the Legislative Council for such aid as it may be deemed proper to grant, in no case exceeding the amount of private contributions and donations from public bodies.

6. If the Council shall think fit to appropriate a sum towards the general support of the Institution, a warrant for issuing the amount will be prepared immediately after, upon application being made to the Auditor-General, accompanied by

such statements and vouchers as that Officer shall find necessary under the established regulations.

7. If any sum shall be appropriated towards the erection of buildings, the Trustees will be required to transmit to the Colonial Secretary, before any issue can be made, an account of the sums actually expended thereon, accompanied by the usual vouchers. Such account will then be referred to some competent Architect appointed on behalf of the Government, who will be required to examine the building, and certify that the workmanship and materials are good and sufficient, and conformable to the plan and elevation laid before the Governor and Council, and that he believes the specified sum to have been actually laid out. One half of the amount of any sums so expended and certified, will be issued to the Trustees from time to time; but it is to be understood that the number of examinations and issues is not on account of any one building to exceed two intermediate, and one final, or three in the whole.

8. No expenditure can be sanctioned unless the estimate be sent in, and the amount voted by the Legislative Council as above mentioned.
