BUSHRANGERS.

SEVERAL districts of the Colony having recently been infested by Bushrangers who, until captured, carried their outrages to a considerable extent, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that in the event of any Bushrangers, either armed or of a known desperate character, appearing in any district, the Police Magistrates and Benchmen have been requested to swear in as many special constables as they may require, calling upon the holders of tickets of leave within the district to serve as such, if necessary, with whose exertions conjoined with that of the established police, it may be hoped that such lawless characters would be speedily apprehended.

His Excellency is pleased to remark, however, that he is satisfied neither these measures nor any others the Government can adopt will be of any permanent avail unless a stop can be put to the system of harbouring bushrangers, which recent circumstances have proved to be practised on the establishments of settlers to a considerable extent; nor can the exertions either of the regular police or of special constables be rendered efficient unless prompt and willing assistance be afforded them by the settlers, especially, in the supply of provisions and horses, it being impossible to follow bushrangers with any hope of overtaking them, unless the pursuers have at least the same facilities for obtaining fresh horses as the bushrangers themselves possess.

The Governor further directs it to be notified that he will feel himself compelled to withdraw the assigned servants from any establishment on which it shall be proved that bushrangers have been harboured, or in any way assisted, and that he will cancel all tickets of leave held by persons on the same establishment, if upon a full review of the circumstances of the case there shall appear to have been any neglect on the part of the assignees to provide for the proper discipline and control of their servants, or any omission on the part of the ticket of leave holders to afford any information or assistance in their power which might have been the means of bringing the guilty parties to justice.

DISTRICT OF CARCOAR.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that in consequence of the disorderly state of the Police District of Carcoar, in the counties of Bathurst and Georgiana, all indulgences to Convicts in that District are to be suspended, and no recommendations forwarded for Tickets-of-leave; and His Excellency further directs it to be notified that unless good order be restored in the District by the 1st of September, all Tickets-of-leave issued for the District will be cancelled, wherever the holders of them may be; and that if the District still continue disturbed, all convict servants assigned in it will be withdrawn on the 1st of November next.

POLICE.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the following Circular Letter, which has been addressed to the several Police Magistrates and Benchmen throughout the Colony, be published for general information.

CIRCULAR.] *Colonial Secretary's Office,
Sydney, 3rd June, 1840.*

SIR,—I am directed by the Governor to call your attention to the Notice published in this day's *Government Gazette*, respecting the district of Carcoar, and to inform you that His Excellency has been driven to the issue of it as a last resource, in order to enlist all classes of society in one strenuous effort, to put down the system of depredation which has so long prevailed in the Colony, and to bring to justice the parties who are guilty of abetting, concealing, or in any way harbouring or protecting the perpetrators of crime.

In the present state of the finances of the Colony His Excellency instructs me to say, that it is impossible to increase the expenditure on account of the police; neither does it appear to him that the additions which have been made to it during the last two years have produced a corresponding effect in increasing the public security; and the only other way in which the efficiency of the police can be increased, appears to him to be in having recourse to the services of holders of tickets-of-leave. The Governor therefore hereby authorises you to swear in, on any emergency, or even for the current services of the district under your charge, any number of special constables from amongst the holders of such tickets, as circumstances may seem to require.

With this assistance, and with the further aid which His Excellency hopes will be derived from the increased energy in all classes of the community called forth by the Notice of this day, Sir George Gipps trusts considerable effects may be produced. As it is however, only by their effects that he can judge of the exertions made by the police in any district, for the suppression of crime, His Excellency desires it to be understood, that the whole Police Establishments of any district will be removed, in which, within a reasonable time after promulgation of the notice referred to, disorder may still prevail.

PARDONS.

SOME misapprehension appearing to exist, as to the effect of a recommendation for Pardon in cases where the same is offered as a reward for the apprehension or bringing to Justice of any offender against the law, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information, that, as soon as the recommendation of any pardon has been transmitted to the Secretary of State for the gracious approbation and allowance of the Queen, the Principal Superintendent will furnish to the convict therein intended, a written intimation of the same; and that the production of that document will exempt the said convict, whether holding a Ticket of Leave or otherwise, from further attendance at musters, and will entitle him to employ himself for his own benefit, in any part of the Colony, and in any lawful manner he may think fit, until the Governor shall be made acquainted with Her Majesty's pleasure thereon.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR having approved of the subjoined Rules and Regulations for the Conduct and Management of the Savings' Bank of New South Wales, framed by the Vice-President and Trustees thereof, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 3rd Victoria, No. 12, is pleased to direct the publication of the same for general information.

PRESENT,

The Honourable E. Deas Thomson, Vice-President, in the Chair; Colonel Shadforth, A. B. Smith, James Raymond, Major Smyth, William Dawes, S. A. Donaldson, and John Lord, Esquires, from his Excellency, Sir George Gipps, dated the 4th day of November, 1839, appointing the Honourable Edward Deas Thomson to be Vice-President, John Blaxland, Roger Therry, Thomas Shadforth, William Charles Wentworth, Thomas Walker, William Lithgow, Alexander Brodie Spark, Thomas Urmson Ryder, Edye Manning, William Dawes, Thomas Gore, James Raymond, Andrew Blowers Smith, Henry Smyth, Robert Lethbridge, John Lord, and Stuart Alexander Donaldson, Esquires, to be Trustees to the New South Wales Savings' Bank, was read.

A COMMISSION

The Trustees then proceeded to revise the Rules and Regulations of the Bank, and resolved that the following be now adopted, and the same, when approved by his Excellency the Governor, and from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, be binding on the present and all future depositors.

1.—APPOINTMENT OF ACCOUNTANTS.

That the following gentlemen be the Accountants

in Sydney, and other districts, viz:—Sydney, George Miller; Windsor, John Ashcroft; Bathurst, George Fergusson; Maitland, John S. Mein; Parramatta, Charles Croaker; Goulburn, Charles E. Newcombe; Wollongong, William Taylor.

2.—ATTENDANCE OF TRUSTEES.

One Trustee in rotation successively, and the Accountant shall attend in Sydney every Saturday evening, (except the 1st and 2nd Saturdays in January,) at 7 o'clock at the Bank Office, and remain there until 9, and on every Thursday (except the first and second Thursdays in January) between the hours of one and two o'clock, for the purpose of receiving deposits, as may be offered agreeably to the rules of the Institution, and entering such deposits when received in the rough cash book, and in the duplicates of their accounts, to be kept by the depositors as after mentioned; and the office shall be open every Monday morning except the first and second Mondays in January. Between the hours of 9 and 11 o'clock for making repayments to depositors.

3.—LENDING OF MONEY.

That as often as the Trustees shall see fit, they will meet for the purpose of lending; the money of the Bank.

4.—ATTENDANCE OF ACCOUNTANT.

It shall be the duty of the Accountant in Sydney to attend the weekly and all other meetings of the Trustees, and to keep regular and distinct books of the whole affairs of the Bank, the transactions of which shall be duly entered and posted therein, as also the accounts of depositors in the districts, from lists furnished to him by the district accountants, and the whole shall be regularly balanced on the 31st day of December, in each year, exclusive of which the trial balance to the last day of each of the other three quarters of the year, shall likewise be prepared by him on the close of each quarter.

5.—ACCOUNT BOOKS.

The books to be kept shall consist of a rough and fair cash journal and ledgers, and a minute book, wherein shall be entered the minutes of the proceedings of the trustees at all their meetings.

**6.—DESCRIPTION AND DECLARATION OF
DEPOSITORS.**

Free persons becoming depositors in the Bank must, on and previous to making their first deposit, disclose their names, professions, business, occupations, callings, and residences, and sign a declaration acknowledging that they, or the person on whose behalf such deposit is made, have received due and full notice of the rules and regulations of the said Bank; and that the same are binding on them and their representatives.

7.—DEPOSIT BOOKS OR DUPLICATES.

All deposits and repayments are to be entered in the books of the Bank, and also in a deposit book or duplicate, to be given gratis to each depositor on opening an account with the Bank; and in which the sum received or paid on each occasion is to be entered in words at length, and signed with the initials of one trustee and the accountant; and whenever any business is transacted the deposit book or duplicate must be produced; and in case any depositor shall lose the book or duplicate, immediate notice must be given to the accountant, who, upon a satisfactory explanation being given of the loss, and payment of two shillings and sixpence in aid of the funds of the Bank, will fill up

another book or duplicate to be copied from the depositor's account in the Bank ledger; but if any money shall have been drawn from the Bank by any other person producing such book or duplicate, and representing himself or herself to be the depositor mentioned therein, before such notice shall have been given to the accountant, or if such depositor shall fail or neglect altogether to give such notice, the loss shall fall on the depositor so losing his or her book or duplicate.

8.—DEPOSITS OF PERSONS UNABLE TO ATTEND.

Forms for signature may be had at the Bank office, enabling persons to become depositors who cannot attend to sign the declaration appointed by the last rule. Those who are already depositors may send the deposit books or duplicates and additional sums by other persons.

9.—WITHDRAWING DEPOSITS.

Depositors may receive the whole or any part of their money on giving due notice, in conformity with the 17th clause of the Act of Council, 3rd Victoria, No. 12; provided, however, that they apply for payment at the hours previously fixed for making repayments to depositors. Payments can be made only to the depositors personally, and on his or her receipt, or to the bearer of an order signed by the depositor, and witnessed if the depositor cannot write. Forms of such orders may be obtained "gratis" on application at the Bank office.

10.—RESTRICTION OF DEPOSITORS.

The trustees reserve the option of returning or rejecting the deposits of any person or persons whom they may deem it inexpedient to continue or admit as a depositor.

11.—CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSITS.

In all cases where a certificate may be required of the state of the account of any depositor with this Bank, such certificate shall be in the following form, signed by one Trustee, and countersigned by the Accountant.

12.—ARBITRATION OF DIFFERENCES.

In case any difference shall arise between the Trustees of this Bank, or any person or persons acting under them, and any individual depositor therein, or any trustee, executor, next of kin, or creditor of any deceased depositor, or any person claiming to be such, then and in every such case the matter in dispute shall be referred to the arbitration of two indifferent persons, one to be chosen or nominated by the trustees, or the majority of them, and the other by the party with whom the dispute may arise; and in case the arbitrators so appointed may agree, their decision shall be final and binding upon both parties; but if they shall not agree, then such matter in dispute shall be referred in writing to His Majesty's Attorney-

General for the Colony, or to such other party as he may appoint to act in his behalf; and this decision of the Attorney-General, or of the person so appointed to act in his behalf, shall be binding and conclusive on all parties, and shall be final, to all intents and purposes, without any appeal; and the said award, order, or determination, shall declare by whom the expence of the reference to the Attorney-General shall be payable; and such award, order, and determination, shall be made a rule of the Honorable the Supreme Court, and may be therein enforced by attachment.

ASSIGNED SERVANTS.

IT having been represented that great neglect takes place in the very essential matter of reporting the absence of Runaway Convicts, His Excellency the Governor directs the attention of Assignees to the necessity for a strict compliance with the 21st section of the Act in Council, 3 William IV., No. 3, under the provisions of which any Master, Superintendent, or Overseer, failing or neglecting to report to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, and to the nearest Justice of the Peace, the absenting or absconding of any such person from his or her service or superintendence, within three days after such absconding, such Master, Employer, Superintendent, or Overseer, is liable, for every such failure or neglect, to forfeit and pay a sum of not less than Five Pounds, nor more than Ten pounds. And His Excellency further directs it to be intimated that instructions have been given to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts to enforce the penalty in future, in every case in which it shall appear that any Master, Superintendent, or Overseer, shall have failed or neglected to make the required reports.

Case No. 706—Thomas Johnson of George-street south, Victualler, and Samuel Stow of Parramatta, Baker.

Fifty-two perches, County of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 10, in section No. 16, on the east side of the Windsor road; bounded on the north by a line 2 chains 25 links; on the east by a line to Grose-street 1 chain 62 links; on the south by Grose-street 2 chains 6 links; and on the west by the Windsor road 1 chain 62 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from the 30th of June, 1823, to James Marshall, now deceased, who, it is alleged, sold a portion thereof to John Skyeng, who sold to Johnson. Marshall also sold another portion to Samuel Stow. These parties claim a Deed of Grant for having erected buildings of the value of £1000, as provided for, by a clause in the lease.

Eighteen and a half perches, County of Cumberland, town of Sydney, parish of St. Philip, allotment No. 10, section No. 94; bounded on the north by Windmill-street, bearing west 10 degrees 30 minutes south 93½ links; on the west by a line bearing south 12 degrees east 128 links; on the south by a line bearing east 10 degrees 30 minutes north 91½ links; and on the east by a line bearing north 11 degrees west 128 links.

By memorial No. 477, preferred to the former Commission, Thomas Watkins proved his title to this allotment, and a Deed of Grant was prepared in his name, but executed subsequent to his decease.

The deed is null and void, but someone has obtained it surreptitiously from the Colonial Treasurer, Watkins it is alleged, devised it to claimant for life, with remainder to their daughter Sarah, in fee.

Case No. 708—John Terry Hughes, of Sydney, Merchant.

Forty acres, County of Northumberland, parish of Maitland, No. 30 of the Veterans' allotments, Wallis' Plains; bounded on the north by a road 50 links wide on the south boundary of Wood's allotment No. 29, commencing on Wallis' Creek, 50 links south of the south east corner of allotment No. 29, and running north 51 degrees west 19 chains and 50 links, to a road on the south east boundary of allotments Nos. 23 and 24; thence south 45 degrees west 10 chains; thence south 37 degrees 30 minutes west 17 chains, to the north boundary of Bloomfield's Grant; thence by said boundary east 31 chains to Wallis' Creek; thence by said creek to the point of commencement.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 26th June, 1829, in favour of Joseph Daley, who, it is alleged, sold to claimant, and is either dead or has left the Colony. The description was inserted in the Gazette Notice of 21st September, 1839, page 1050, in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 709—John Terry Hughes, of Sydney, merchant.

Forty acres, County of Northumberland, parish of Maitland, allotment No. 33, at Wallis' Plains, commencing at 50 links south of the south west corner of allotment No. 32, and bounded on the north by an east line by compass of 33 chains, to the west boundary of a public road; on the east by the west side of that road bearing south by compass 11 chains; on the south by a west line by compass of 36 chains and 50 links to Wallis' Creek; and on the west by Wallis' Creek to the point first mentioned.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, in favour of John Watson, being in lieu of two orders for 60 acres each, promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane, on 23rd June and 15th July, 1824. Watson, it is alleged, sold to claimant, and is either dead or absent from the Colony.

Case No. 710—James M'Farlane, of Goulburn, Grazier.

Sixteen hundred and sixty-seven acres, County of Argyle, parish unnamed, at Goulburn Plains; bounded on the south by a line east 88 chains commencing on the Mulwarree Ponds, opposite the north east corner of M'Farlane's first purchase of 640 acres; on the east by a section line north 210 chains; on the north by the grants of S. M. Burrows, and Charles Elliot, being lines west 20 chains, south 80 chains, and west 128 chains to Mulwarree Ponds, and on the west by Mulwarree Ponds.

This land was obtained by the late Captain Ebhart on his remission, and by purchase, and was sold, it is alleged, to claimant, who will have to prove that the conditions of 15th August, 1834, have been fulfilled.

Case No. 711—Edward New, of Parramatta, Butcher, by his attorney, Augustus Hayward, Esq.

Seventy-seven perches, County of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 7, on the east side of Sorrell-street,

in section No. 6; bounded on the north by a line 202 links; on the east by a line to the river 4 chains 52 links; on the south by the river to Sora-rel-street; and on the west by the street 416 links, reserving a convenient passage, of sufficient width to admit a horse and cart to such of the adjoining allotments, as may be deemed necessary by the proper officer.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from the 30th June, 1828, to Thomas Kelly, now deceased, who, it is alleged, devised it to his wife for life, and remainder to his two daughters absolutely; who, with the widow, have sold to claimant. The deed is prayed for, on proposing to pay a fine of 21 years quit-rent, as provided for by a clause in the lease. Samuel Arkin, by memorial No. 868, preferred to the former Commission, made some vague claim to land here.

Case No. 712—Isaac Simmons, of George-street, Sydney, Auctioneer, by his Attorney, E. D. O'Reilly, Esq.

Eighty acres, County of Cumberland, parish of *Blacktown*; bounded on the north by a line east 20 chains, commencing at the north-east corner of Michael Reilly's grant; on the east by a line south 40 chains; on the south by a line west 20 chains; and on the west by Michael Reilly's east boundary 40 chains.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 7th February, 1831, in favour of Bernard Reilly, who, it is alleged, sold to Thomas Arnold, who sold to claimant.

Case No. 713—Isaac Simmons, of George-street, Sydney, Auctioneer, by his Attorney, E. D. O'Reilly, Esq.

Eighty acres, County of Cumberland, parish of *Blacktown*; bounded on the north by a line east 24 chains, commencing 26 chains north of the corner pin between Johnston and Graham; on the east by a line south 40 chains; on the south by a line west 23 chains 50 links; and on the west by part of Graham's east boundary 12 chains 50 links, and by part of Johnston's east boundary 26 chains.

This allotment was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 7th February, 1831, in favor of Michael Reilly, who, it is alleged, sold to Thomas Arnold, who sold to claimant.
