By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief, of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

" An Act further to continue for a limited time

"an Act intituled, ' An Act for regulating " the Constitution of Juries, and for the " trial of Issues in Certain Cases in the " Supreme Court, of New South Wales." HEREASan Actof the Governor and Council of New South Wales, was passed in the Preamble. second year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act 2 Wm. IV., " for regulating the Constitution of "Juries, and for the Trial of Issues No. 3. " in Certain Cases in the Supreme Court of New " South Wales;" And whereas the said Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the fourth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled, "An Act to continue 4 Wm. IV., " for a limited time an Act of the "Governor and Council of New South " Wales, intituled, An Act for regulating the 46 Constitution of Juries, and for the trial of ... Issues in Certain Cases in the Supreme Court "of New South Wales," and to make further " provision for trial by Jury, in Criminal Cases, " in the said Colony," continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-five; And whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled, "An Act " New South Wales," further continued until the

"the trial of Issues in certain cases in the " Supreme Court of New South Wales,' and "to make further provision for trial by Jury." further continued until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council passed in the sixth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled, "An Act Surther to continue for a 6 Wm. IV., " limited time, an Act intituted, "An " Act for regulating the constitution No. 15. " of Juries, and for the triul of Issues in certain " cases in the Supreme Court of New South Wales," " and to muke further provision for trial by Jury," further continued until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven; and whereas the said first rec ted Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the seventh year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled, " An Act to further continue " for a limited time, an Act intituled, 7 Wm IV. No. 9. "An Act for regulating the con-stitution of Juries, and for the trial of Issues "in certain cases in the Supreme Court of New " South Wales," further continued until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight; and whereas lhe said first recited Act, as altered and amended by any or all of the Acts herein last recited, was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to further 1 Victoria, "continue for a limited time, an Act 1 Victoria, "intituled, " An Act for regulating No. 1. "the constitution of Juries, and for the trial of " Issues in certain cases in the Supreme Court of 5 Wm. IV, "to continue for a limited time, an thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty; and it is expedient further to continue " New South Wales, intituled. An Act for the said first recited Act, so altered and amended "regulating the Constitution of Juries, and for as aforesaid, as hereinafter is provided; Be it

Continued until MJune, the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, that the said first recited Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, as altered and amended by any or all of the Acts herein last recited, shall be, and the same is hereby continued in force, from and after the said thirtieth day of June next ensuing, until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

II. Provided always, and be it declared and enacted, that nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to alter or repeal, An Act intituled, " An Act to make further regulation 2 Vict.. " with respect to trial by Jury in No. 11. "Criminal Issues in the Colonyof New South Wales, " and to amend the form of proceeding in Criminal " Prosecutions in the said Colony."

"an act, instance, "tate the Apprehension of transported " · Felons and Offenders illegally at large, and of " persons found with arms and suspected to be " Rebbers," continued until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirtyeight; And whereas the said first recited Act was by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the first year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act further to continue for a 1 Victoria "Imited time, An Act intituled An " Act to facilitate the apprehension of "transported Felons and Offenders illegally at " large, and of persons found with Arms, and

therefore enacted, by His Excellency is suspected to be Robbers," continued in force, except as to so much of the said Act as relates to the time of passing and execution of any Sentence of Death as in the said Act is mentioned, from and after the said thirty-first day of August then next, until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty; and it is expedient further to continue the said first recited Act in manner and to the extent hereinafter provided: Be it there-

fore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, that the said first recited Act

of His said late Majesty, shall be, and the same is hereby continued in force, except as to so much of the said Act as relates to the time of passing and execution of any Sentence of Death as in said Act is mentioned, from and after the said thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty, until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

"An Act to continue for a limited time an " Act, intituled ' An Act for preventing the " Extension of the disease commonly " called the Influenza or Catarrh, in " . Sheep and Lambs, in the Colony of New " South Wales."

THEREAS an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales. was passed in the Second year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled, 2 Vict., No. 12. "An Act for preventing the extension "of the disease commonly called the " Influenza or Cutarrh, in Sheep and Lambs, in "the Colony of New South Wales," and the said recited Act will expire on the ninth day of October. One thousand eight hundred and forty, and it is expedient to continue the same for a limited time: Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, That the said Act shall be, and the same is hereby
