By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

"An Act to declare that the laws of New
"South Wales extend to Her Majesty's
"Dominions in the Islands of New Zea"land; and to apply the same, so far as
"applicable, in the administration of
"justice therein; and to indemnify certain
"Officers for acts already done."

HEREAS, Her Majesty hath been pleased to annex Her Majesty's Dominions in the Islands of New Zealand to the Government of New South Wales; and it is expedient that the Laws of New South Wales should be enforced in Her Majesty said Dominions, so far as the same can be applied in the adminisacts and Ordinary.

Acts and Ordinances of New South Males to extend to and be applied in the administration of Justice in Her Majesty's Dominions in the Islandsof New within Her Majesty's Dominions in the said Islands of New Zealand, so far as the same can be applied therein, any law, usage, or custom to the contrary in anywise

notwithstanding.

II. And whereas doubts may arise as to the validity of acts heretofore done and performed in Her Majesty's said vernor, Justices of the Peace, and others.

Zealand, by the Lieutenant Governor thereof, and by Justices of the Peace,

Constables, and other Officers, acting under and

by virtue of Commissions or Appointments from Her Majesty, or Her Majesty's Government of New South Wales, for the removal of such doubts, as well as for the indemnification of such Lieutenant Governor, Justices of the Peace, Constables, and other Officers acting as aforesaid; Be it enacted, that the said Lieutenant Governor, Justices of the Peace, Constables, and all other persons who may have acted under, and by virtue of any Commission or Appointment from Her Majesty, or the Governor of New South Wales, or the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Dominions in New Zealand, shall be freed and discharged from all damages, penalties, and forfeitures to which they might otherwise be liable for anything so done or performed; and that no act done or performed by any such Officers shall be questioned or avoided in any Court of Law, by reason of the want of sufficient power and authority, but that all such acts shall be, and they are hereby declared to be, as good and effectual in law as if such persons respectively had done or performed such acts within, and under or by virtue of any Law Act or Ordinance in force in, the Colony of New South Wales.

THEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of Preamble. the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the Eleventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled, "An "Act for confirming certain Rutes and Duties 11 Geo. W., "heretofore levied and collected in the No. 9. "Colony, and for continuing the like "Rates and Duties until further provision shall " be made;" it was amongst other things enacted, That all goods, except those in the said recited Act particularly mentioned, not being the growth, produce, or manufacture of the United Kingdom, imported into the said Colony, should be subject to a rate or duty of Five Pounds sterling on every Hundred Pounds value: and whereas, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the Third year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, " An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, 3 Gul. IV., "Harbours, Havens, Roadsteads, Chan-No. 6. "nels, Navigable Creeks, and Rivers, "in New South Wales, and the better Regulation of Shipping in the same;" it was amongst other things enacted, That all Flour and Meal, and all

" An Act to exempt from duty and wharfage | Grain landed at the King's Wharf, Sydney, should Flour and Meal be subject to certain Wharfage and Wheat, &c., Rates therein-mentiohed: And Rates therein-mentiohed: And imported before whereas, it is expedient for a certhe 31st Decem-ber, 1840, to be exempted from tain period to exempt Flour and Meal, and Bread or Biscuit, and Duty and Wheat and other Grain, and Pulse Wharfage Rates from the said Duty and Wharfage Rates; be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, That from and after the passing of this Act, all Flour and Meal, and Bread or Biscuit, and all Wheat and other Grain and Pulse, imported into the said Colony, on or before the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and forty, shall be exempted from the said Duty; and all Flour and Meal, and Bread or Biscuit, and all Wheat and other grain and Pulse, landed at the Queen's Wharf, Sydney, within the same period, shall also be exempted from the said Wharfage Rates; anything in the said recited Acts to the contrary notwithstanding.
