HIS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bill, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

1.—“*A Bill to prohibit the Aboriginal Natives of New South Wales from having fire arms in their possession.*”

It being considered dangerous to the public security, to allow the Aboriginal Natives of New South Wales to have fire arms in their possession, it is proposed :—

That from and after the passing of the proposed Act, it shall not be lawful for any Aboriginal Native, or Half Caste, to have or keep any description of fire arms under any pretence whatsoever.

That any constable or free person may obtain or take from any such Native or Half Caste, any description of fire arms which he may have in his possession, and lodge the same with the Police Magistrate of the district, provided that no unnecessary violence be used towards such Native or Half Caste.

That no person shall give or lend fire arms to any such Native or Half Caste, under penalty of not less than pounds.
 As to the recovery and appropriation of penalties.

CROWN LANDS.

IT having been represented to the GOVERNOR that in order to avoid the expense of a Depasturing License and the assessment of their

stock, parties have removed the same from beyond to within the limits of location; and that many persons, contrary to the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 2nd VICTORIA, No. 27, are in the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, within the said limits, or employed in cutting cedar or other timber thereon, without having a valid lease or license, as required by the regulations of 21st May, 1839, HIS EXCELLENCY directs it to be notified that the provisions of the said act will be strictly enforced against all persons whatsoever so offending; and the Police Magistrates and Benches in the several districts of the Colony are hereby directed, at the expiration of three months from this date, to cause proceedings to be instituted against them accordingly.

POSTAGE.

WHEREAS the 4th clause of the Colonial Post Office Act, 5th William IV., No. 24, provides, "That nothing herein contained shall be taken to authorize any charge for postage, upon any letter or packet, addressed to, or franked by any person in Great Britain or Ireland, being empowered by law to send or receive letters or packets beyond the sea, free from postage." And whereas, by a minute issued by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated London, 26th December, 1839, and a notice from the Secretary to the Postmaster-General, of the same date, it has been brought under the notice of His Excellency the Governor, that the privilege of franking and receiving letters free would entirely cease in Great Britain from the 10th of January last.

His Excellency therefore directs it to be intimated, that letters or parcels addressed to public officers, or departments in England, will not pass free through the Sydney Post Office unless they be franked by some person authorized under existing regulations to receive and send letters free of postage in and from this Colony.

His Excellency has further directed, that for the present, and until further directions shall be issued on the subject, all letters from public departments in England, or from officers formerly allowed to frank, will be allowed to pass free through the Sydney Post Office.

DESCRIPTION.

Dark bay Mare, supposed to be in foal, faint star on the forehead, three black legs, the near hind fetlock white, long tail, two white saddle-marks, about fifteen hands high.

Brown Pony, cropped ears, hog mane, small star on forehead, fired in both fore legs, fetlock joint of the off hind leg much enlarged, several white saddle-marks on both sides, white spot on the rump bone near side, small white spot in the lower part of the neck on the off side.

Dark bay Horse, four black legs, high between the rump and withers, small faint white spot centre of forehead, same over the off eye, white saddle-marks on both sides.
