VACCINATION.

INFORMATION having been received that the small-pox has been accidentally introduced into the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the republication of the Notice of 29th July, 1839, with the view of again drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

In order to avert the calamities which must necessarily follow if the small-pox be introduced into the Colony, and to keep up a constant supply of Vaccine Lymph, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that children will receive Vaccination gratis, if taken to any of the Public Hospitals, or Colonial Surgeons, throughout the Colony, every Tuesday, at Eleven o'Clock in the forenoon. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect would be insufficient security to the public mind, His EXCELLENCY has been pleased to direct, that a charge of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next Vaccination day.

His EXCELLENCY very strongly recommends to parents and guardians to avail themselves as early as possible of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution, with respect to all children not already Vaccinated.

**LIGHT AT ST. KATHERINE'S POINT,
 ISLE OF WIGHT.**

Notice is hereby given, that the Light Tower, which has been for some time past in course of erection on St. Katherine's Point, in the Isle of Wight, being nearly completed,—the Light will be exhibited therein on or before the evening of the 1st March next, and thenceforth continued every night from sun set to sun rise.

The Light at the above Station will burn at an elevation of 178 feet above the level of high-water, and will appear as a *fixed bright Light* in all directions seaward.

Parties are reminded that all applications for Agricultural Laborers and Mechanics, must be renewed at these Sessions, as after the 1st day of October ensuing, all former applications for Convicts of that description will be cancelled in conformity with the existing regulations.

The Magistrates will take particular care to point out to applicants, any informality in their forms of applications, in order that the same may be corrected before transmission to the Commissioner, and to remind them when necessary, to require their overseers to send in their return in form B, to the Sessions of the District in which they reside. The Magistrates are also requested to see that all the particulars required in terms of the regulations, are duly filled up in the several forms, to avoid inconvenience and delay, in requiring them for correction.

The greatest accuracy will be required on the part of the applicants in filling up the returns, as the best means of avoiding confusion and inconvenience to the Public Service.

Those Magistrates who were authorised to employ assessors last year, for taking into consideration applications for servants, will be allowed, if still necessary, to retain the same parties on the present occasion; but where the employment of other parties in lieu should be requisite, the Magistrates will immediately report the names to this Office.

The assignment of prisoners in the Port Phillip districts, is discontinued, in pursuance of the notice inserted in the Government Gazette of the 26th December 1838, except to the actual purchasers of land previous to that date.

DESCRIPTION.

Dark bay Mare, supposed to be in foal, faint star on the forehead, three black legs, the near hind fetlock white, long tail, two white saddle-marks, about fifteen hands high.

Brown Pony, cropped ears, hog mane, small star on forehead, fired in both fore legs, fetlock joint of the off hind leg much enlarged, several white saddle-marks on both sides, white spot on the rump bone near side, small white spot in the lower part of the neck on the off side.

Dark bay Horse, four black legs, high between the rump and withers, small faint white spot centre of forehead, same over the off eye, white saddle-marks on both sides.

CROWN LANDS.

IT having been represented to the GOVERNOR that in order to avoid the expense of a Depasturing License and the assessment of their stock, parties have removed the same from beyond to within the limits of location; and that many persons, contrary to the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 2nd VICTORIA, No. 27, are in the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, within the said limits, or employed in cutting cedar or other timber thereon, without having a valid lease or license, as required by the regulations of 21st May, 1839, HIS EXCELLENCY directs it to be notified that the provisions of the said act will be strictly enforced against all persons whatsoever so offending; and the Police Magistrates and Benches in the several districts of the Colony are hereby directed, at the expiration of three months from this date, to cause proceedings to be instituted against them accordingly.
