PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act, intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, and other sums of money imposed by the Governors of New South Wales,' and for other purposes as relates to the levying of tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon;" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be, wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense; and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same; and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails and Fences to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing Passengers, Beasts, and Carriages from passing unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas by my Proclamations, bearing date the 20th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and 8th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, certain places were appointed for the collection of certain Tolls whereat they have been collected, and it has become necessary to appoint a place on the River Hastings, in the County of Macquarie for that purpose; Now, I the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited law or ordinance, do by this my Proclamation appoint Blackman's Point, on the River

Hastings, on the line of road to Ballyngarra in the district of Port Macquarie, to be a place in addition to those formerly named, at which a Ferry shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected to the amount and under the regulations, restrictions and provisions of the said recited ordinance; of which Ferry all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice according to the provisions of the said recited law or ordinance.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to amend an act intituled, 'An Act to repeal an act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled, an Act to authorise the erection of Pounds, and for regulating the impounding of Cattle, and to make further and other provisions in lieu thereof, and to extend the provisions thereof,'" it was, amongst other things, enacted that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being shall deem it expedient and advantageous to extend the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the fourth, so far as the same relate to any person suffering any Cattle belonging to him or in his charge, to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in any street or public place within the limits, or reputed limits of the several Towns in the said Act mentioned, to such other Towns now erected, or hereafter to be erected or established, at any place within the said Colony, as may hereafter be deemed

necessary to any other Town in the said Colony, it shall or may be lawful for the said Governor, or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette*. Now, therefore, I the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this my proclamation do hereby declare that so much of the provision of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the fourth, as is herein before particularly specified, be extended to the Town of Goulburn, in the County of Argyle.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief, of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by a certain act or ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for regulating the police in the towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other towns respectively, and for the removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of streets therein," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor, or Acting Governor for the time being, shall deem it expedient to extend the same to any other town in the said Colony, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor, or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited act, by this my Proclamation, do hereby direct that the provisions of the said act be extended to the town of Campbelltown, in the county of Cumberland."

COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bills, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.

No. 1.—"A Bill to amend an Act, intituled,

"An Act for the better regulation of servants, labourers, and work people."

It being expedient, from the increased population and extended occupation of the lands of the Colony of New South Wales, in part to repeal the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 9th Geo. IV., No. 9, and to amend and extend the operation thereof to the more remote parts of the said Colony and its dependencies, it is proposed—

That so much of the said Act, 9th Geo. IV., No. 9, as relates to servants refusing, neglecting, or absenting themselves from their work, shall be repealed.

That artificers, manufacturers, journeymen, workmen, shepherds, laborers, or other servants, refusing to serve the terms of their respective engagements, or returning or leaving work uncompleted, or absenting themselves from work, or refusing to work during the ordinary hours of working at their respective employments, may be committed to gaol for _____ calendar months, or to any house of correction for _____ calendar months, there to be kept to hard labour; and may also be mulcted in the whole or such part of the wages then due to them as the Justices shall think proper.

That in cases of dispute between masters and servants as to the wages to be allowed to such servants, where no specific agreement for wages has been entered into, or otherwise, and the amount claimed shall not exceed _____ pounds, it shall be lawful for two or more Justices to summon the parties to such dispute, and to order the payment of such wages as shall appear to them to be reasonable and just; and in case of non-payment thereof, may direct the same to be recovered by distress and sale of the master's goods and effects.

That persons hiring themselves, and obtaining money in advance of wages, and afterwards absconding, or refusing to perform the work they had engaged to perform, or to proceed to the respective places where they had engaged themselves to work or be employed, may be committed to gaol for _____ calendar months, or to any house of correction for _____ calendar months, there to be kept to hard labour.

No. 2.—"A Bill to render Shares in 'THE AUSTRALIAN SUBSCRIPTION LIBRARY' not transferable."

The Members of "THE AUSTRALIAN SUBSCRIPTION LIBRARY," or a majority of them, being desirous that the shares in the said Society should not be transferable in future, it is proposed—

That so much of an Act, passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, as relates to the transfer of shares in the said Society, shall be repealed; and that, from and after the passing of the proposed Act, it shall not be lawful to transfer any such shares under any circumstances whatsoever.

That the proposed Act shall not take effect until notice of the Royal approbation shall have been published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*.

That the proposed Act shall be deemed, and judicially taken notice of, as a public Act.

No. 3.—"A Bill to simplify Proceedings at Law and in Equity, by and against 'THE SYDNEY

“*BANKING COMPANY,*” and for other purposes.”

A Banking Company, carrying on business under the style and firm of “*THE SYDNEY BANKING COMPANY,*” having been established in the Colony of New South Wales, and it being expedient to simplify Proceedings at Law or in Equity, by or against the said Company, it is proposed—

That all such proceedings shall be in the name of the Manager of the Company, and that neither the death, resignation, suspension, nor removal of such Manager, shall abate or prejudice such proceedings.

That a memorial, in writing, of the name of the Manager, and of every Director for the time being of the said Company, shall be recorded in the Supreme Court of New South Wales, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the proposed Act, and that no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced until after such memorial shall have been duly so recorded.

That the Plaintiff in any action shall not be nonsuited for want of proof of the record of such memorial.

That the Manager or other officers of the said Company shall be competent to give evidence in any proceeding, notwithstanding his or their being interested therein.

That execution upon any judgment, or decree in any such proceeding, may be issued against and levied upon the goods &c. of any member or members of the said Company.

That a list of the names of all the then existing members of the said Company shall be recorded on oath, in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, within thirty days from and after the passing of the proposed Act, and thereafter, in the month of January in each and every year; and that every person included in any such list shall be considered to be, and be liable, as a member of the said Company, until a new list shall have been recorded, or until such person shall have given notice in the *New South Wales Government Gazette* of his or her retirement from such Company.

That all bonds, warrants of attorney, or other securities, not assignable in law, taken in the name of any person as Manager of the said Company, may be put in suit, and be prosecuted upon at law or in equity, in the name of the manager for the time being of such Company.

That nothing in the proposed Act contained shall affect or apply to any right, title, or interest of Her Majesty, or of any person or persons not mentioned therein.

That the proposed Act shall not take effect until notice of the Royal approbation shall have been Published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*.

That from and after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the proposed Act shall be deemed to be, and be judicially taken notice of, as a public Act.

No. 4.—“*A Bill to simplify Proceedings at Law and in Equity, by or against ‘THE ‘GENERAL STEAM NAVIGATION COMPANY,’ and for other purposes.’*”

A Joint Stock Company, carrying on business under the style and firm of “*THE GENERAL*

STEAM NAVIGATION COMPANY,” being established in the Colony of New South Wales, and it being expedient to simplify proceedings at Law and in Equity, by or against the said Company, it is proposed;—

That all such proceedings shall be in the name of the Secretary of the Company, and that neither the death, resignation, suspension nor removal from office of any such Secretary shall abate or prejudice any such proceedings.

That a memorial of the name of such Secretary and of the names of each member of the Committee of Management for the time being of such Company, shall be recorded in the Supreme Court of the said Colony, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the proposed Act, and that no such proceedings shall be commenced until after the record of such memorial as aforesaid.

That the Plaintiff in any such proceeding shall not be nonsuited for want of proof of the record of such memorial.

That the Secretary or other officers of such Company shall be competent to give evidence in any such proceeding notwithstanding his or their interest therein.

That execution upon any judgment or decree, may issue against and be levied upon the goods &c. of any member or members of the said Company.

That a list of all the then existing members of the said Company, shall be recorded, on oath, in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court within thirty days from and after the passing of the proposed Act, and thereafter, in the month of January in each and every year, and that every person included in such list shall be considered and held to be liable as a member of such Company, until a new list shall have been so recorded, or until such person shall have given notice in the *Government Gazette* of his or her retirement from such Company.

That all bonds, warrants of attorney, or other securities, not assignable in law, taken in the name of any person as Secretary, for or on account of the said Company, may be put in suit and be prosecuted upon at Law, or in Equity, in the name of the Secretary for the time being of such Company.

That nothing in the proposed Act contained, shall affect or apply to any right or title of Her Majesty, or any person or persons not mentioned therein.

That the proposed Act shall not take effect until after notice of the Royal approbation shall have been published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*.

That the proposed Act shall be deemed to be, and be judicially taken notice of as being, a public Act.

Parties are reminded that all applications for Agricultural Laborers and Mechanics, must be renewed at these Sessions, as after the 1st day of October ensuing, all former applications for Convicts of that description will be cancelled in conformity with the existing regulations.

The Magistrates will take particular care to point out to applicants, any informality in their forms of applications, in order that the same may be corrected before transmission to the Commissioner, and to remind them when necessary, to require their overseers to send in their return in form B, to the Sessions of the District in which they reside. The Magistrates are also requested to see that all the particulars required in terms of the regulations, are duly filled up in the several forms, to avoid inconvenience and delay, in returning them for correction.

The greatest accuracy will be required on the part of the applicants in filling up the returns, as the best means of avoiding confusion and inconvenience to the Public Service.

Those Magistrates who were authorised to employ assessors last year, for taking into consideration applications for servants, will be allowed, if still necessary, to retain the same parties on the present occasion; but where the employment of other parties in lieu should be requisite, the Magistrates will immediately report the names to this Office.

The assignment of prisoners in the Port Phillip districts, is discontinued, in pursuance of the notice inserted in the Government Gazette of the 26th December 1838, except to the actual purchasers of land previous to that date.

INFORMATION having been received that the small-pox has been accidentally introduced into the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the republication of the Notice of 29th July, 1839, with the view of again drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

In order to avert the calamities which must necessarily follow if the small-pox be introduced into the Colony, and to keep up a constant supply of Vaccine Lymph, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that children will receive Vaccination gratis, if taken to any of the Public Hospitals, or Colonial Surgeons, throughout the Colony, every Tuesday, at Eleven o'Clock in the forenoon. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect would be insufficient security to the public mind, His EXCELLENCY has been pleased to direct, that a charge of one shilling shall be deposited for every child Vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next Vaccination day.

His EXCELLENCY very strongly recommends to parents and guardians to avail themselves as early as possible of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution, with respect to all children not already Vaccinated.
