HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the following ORDER IN COUNCIL appointing Melbourne a Free Port, and a Free Warehousing Port, be republished from the *London Gazette*, for general information,

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament, holden in the and third fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "*An Act to regulate the trade of the British Possessions abroad*," it was amongst other things enacted, that no goods should be imported into, nor should any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, excepting to or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act contained; and it was thereby further enacted, that if any goods should be imported into any port or place in any of the said possessions, contrary to the said Act, such goods should be forfeited; and it was thereby provided, that if His Majesty should deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports, not enumerated in the said table, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures, therein contained, subject, nevertheless to the limitations and restrictions thereafter provided, should extend and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act. And it was thereby also enacted, that, the several

ports therein in that behalf mentioned, should be free warehousing ports, for all the purposes of the said Act; and that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's possessions in America, to be a free warehousing port for all or any of the purposes of the said Act; and that every port so appointed should be, for all the purposes expressed in such Order, a free warehousing port under the said Act, as if appointed by the same: And, whereas, by the said last before recited Act, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions, and make such regulations, touching the Trade and Commerce to and from any British Possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's Charter (excepting the possessions of the said Company), as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and if any goods shall be imported or exported in any manner contrary to any such Order of His Majesty in Council, the same shall be forfeited, together with the ship importing or exporting the same:

And whereas, HER MAJESTY doth deem it expedient, to extend the before mentioned provisions of the said Act, respecting such free ports, to PORT MELBOURNE, in the District of PORT PHILLIP, in New South Wales,—

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the powers thereby in Her Majesty in Council, in that behalf vested; Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, accordingly, that from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, the provisions of the said Act, as far as the same relate to the free ports respectively therein mentioned, shall be, and the same are hereby extended to PORT MELBOURNE, in the District of *Port Phillip, in New South Wales*; and that from and after the said first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, all privileges and advantages of the said Act, conferred

upon the free ports therein mentioned, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures, in the said Act contained, subject to the limitations and restrictions therein provided, shall extend to the said Port Melbourne, as fully and effectually, as if such Port had been situate in Her Majesty's American Colonies, and inserted and enumerated in the said table, at the time of passing the said Act.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her Majesty, by the said Act, in that behalf vested, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that Port Melbourne, aforesaid, so appointed a free Port, as aforesaid, shall also, from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, be a free warehousing port, for all the purposes of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NEW ZEALAND.

IN pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, passed on the fourth day of the present month of August, and intitled, "An Act to empower the Governor of New South Wales to appoint Commissioners with certain powers to Examine and Report on Claims to Grants of Land in New Zealand," His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that all persons claiming to be entitled to grants of Land in the Islands of New Zealand, by purchase from the Native Chiefs, or individuals of the Aboriginal Tribes inhabiting the same, are hereby required to set forth in writing, addressed to the Colonial Secretary of New South Wales, the particulars of such claims with as little delay as possible, in order that the same may be submitted to the consideration of the Commissioners, who are to be appointed under the above-mentioned Act.

The applicants should set forth as fully as possible the situation and extent of the Land claimed, and every other particular in their power, relative to the grounds of their claim.

And all persons claiming to be entitled to land at New Zealand, are distinctly warned that, under the conditions of the 4th clause of the Act in question all claims, except as therein excepted, which may not be preferred to the Colonial Secretary of New South Wales, as herein directed, on or before the 4th day of February next, will be absolutely null and void.

POLICE DISTRICTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the following "Boundaries of the Police Districts of the Colony," as recommended by the Committee of the Legislative Council, appointed on the 11th June, 1839, to report on the subject of Police and Gaols.

His Excellency, however, desires it to be notified, that the present division has been made merely to simplify and facilitate the Police operations of the Colony, and it is not intended to supersede or in any way interfere with the division of the Colony into Counties, as already published by the Proclamations of the 22nd May and 27th November, 1835, or with the boundaries of any Counties which may hereafter be proclaimed.

1. SYDNEY.

Embracing a north-eastern portion of the County of Cumberland, consisting of the hundreds of Sydney and Packerham, except the parish of Concord; bounded on the north and north-west by Broken Bay and Cowan Creek; on the west by lines bearing south-westerly and south dividing Hyndes' grant to Lane Cove River, thence by Lane Cove and its Bays to the western point of Ball's Head Bay, crossing the Parramatta River to Longnose Point, thence by the Long Cove to the junction of the Parramatta and Liverpool Turnpike Roads, and by the Liverpool Road to the Village Reserve at Irish Town, and from thence by a line bearing south to and by the Salt Ponds; on the south by George's River, and the South Shore of Botany Bay to Cape Solander, the sea shore which forms the eastern boundary to the South Head, crossing the entrance of Port Jackson to the North Head, and continued to Barrenjerrey Head, at the entrance of Broken Bay.

2. PARRAMATTA.

Embracing a northern and midland portion of the County of Cumberland, consisting of the hundreds of Parramatta and Dundas, and the parish of Concord; bounded on the north by the Hawkesbury River; on the north-west by a line bearing south-westerly to the North Road leading to Wiseman's Ferry; on the west by this Road, to the northern boundary of George Suttor's grant of fifty acres, thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the junction of the Pitt Town and Windsor Roads, thence by the Windsor Road, and a line bearing west to the confluence of Breakfast and Eastern Creeks, and by Eastern Creek to the Cowpasture Road; on the south by the Prospect old Road and Prospect Creek to

Lansdowne Bridge, thence by the Liverpool Road to its junction with the Parramatta Road; on the east by a line from hence bearing north-easterly to Long Cove, and by its eastern shore to Long-nose Point, crossing the Parramatta River to the western point of Ball's Head Bay, thence by Lane Cove and its Bays, and Lane Cove River, and by a line bearing north and north-easterly dividing Hind's grant to Cowan Creek, and by this Creek to the Hawkesbury River aforesaid.

3. LIVERPOOL.

Embracing a midland portion of the County of Cumberland, consisting of the hundred of Liverpool and parishes of Cabramatta and Wattamolla; bounded on the north from Cape Solander by Botany Bay, George's River, the Salt Ponds, the Liverpool Road, and Prospect Creek to the Cowpasture Road; on the west by the Cowpasture Road to the junction of the Northern Road, by the Northern Road to South Creek, and by South Creek to the Bringelly Road, and by this Road to the junction of the Cowpasture old Road, and by the Cowpasture old Road to the junction with the cross Road leading to the Campbell Town Road; on the south by this cross Road to the Campbell Town Road, thence by a line bearing easterly, crossing Bunberry Curren and Bow Bowing Creeks, George's River, Deadman's Creek to the northern boundary of John Lucas' grant, on Woronora Creek, thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Wattamolla on the sea shore, which forms the eastern boundary of the district to Cape Solander aforesaid.

4. CAMPBELL TOWN.

Embracing the southern portion of the county of Cumberland, and a northern portion of the county of Camden, consisting of the hundreds of Sounthend and Campbell Town, and the parishes of Cook, in the hundred of Bringelly and Heathcote and Bulga in the hundred of Wattamolla and a part of the county of Camden; bounded on the north from Wattamolla by a line bearing north-westerly to a northern boundary of John Lucas' grant on Woronora Creek, thence by a line bearing westerly, crossing Deadman's Creek, George's River, Bow Bowing and Bunberry Curran Creeks, to the cross-cut road on the Campbell Town road, and by this cross road to the Cowpasture old road, thence by the Cowpasture old road to the junction of the Bringelly road, thence by the Bringelly road to Bringelly Creek; and by that creek to the Nepean river, thence by a line dividing the village reserve on the Nepean, and bearing west to Werriberri creek, about two miles above its confluence with the Warragamba river; on the west by Werriberri creek to its head; on the south, by the southern boundary of the Church and School grant, the Nepean river and the Cataract river to its source, and thence by a line east to the sea shore, near Bulli, which is the eastern boundary to Wattamolla aforesaid.

5. STONEQUARRY.

Embracing a midland portion of the County of Camden, and an eastern portion of the County of Westmoreland; bounded on the north from its source by the Cataract river, the Nepean river, the southern boundary of the Church and School Grant to the source of Werriberri creek, and by this creek, the Warragamba and Cox's rivers to the confluence of the Kowming river, on the west

by Kowming river to its sources near the Colong Mountain; on the south by a line bearing south-easterly from Colong to Jellore, from thence by a line bearing north easterly to Lupton's Inn, and from that Inn by a line bearing south to the source of the Cordeaux River; on the east by the Crest of the Illawarra range to the head of the Cataract River aforesaid.

6. ILLAWARRA.

Embracing the eastern portion of the county of Camden and the northern portion of the county of St. Vincent, bounded on the north by a line west, to the head of the Cataract River, commencing on the sea-shore near Bulli; on the west by the Illawarra range, thence by a line to the middle source of the Kangaroo River, thence by that River to its confluence with the Shoalhaven River, and by this River to about two miles south of the confluence of the Warreemungo; on the south by the range north of Endrick's River to the source of Yalmal Creek; and again by a range to Lambes' grant; and by the eastern shore of St. George's Basin to Sussex Haven, and thence by the sea shore, which forms the eastern boundary to near Bulli, as aforesaid.

7. BERRIMA.

Embracing the southern portion of the County of Camden; bounded on the north by a line bearing west from the source of the Cordeaux River to Lupton's Inn; from this Inn by a line bearing south westerly to Jellore; from Jellore by a line bearing north westerly to the Wollondilly River in a line with Colong, and continued by this River to the mouth of a Creek rising at Murrum; on the west by the Wollondilly, Paddy's River, and the Uringalla to its source, and by a line to the source of Barber's Creek, and by that creek to its confluence with the Shoalhaven River; on the south by the Shoalhaven and Kangaroo Rivers; on the east by the middle source of the Kangaroo, and a line bearing north easterly to the Illawarra range, and by that range to the source of the Cordeaux River.

8. GOULBURN.

Embracing the southern portion of Georgiana and the whole of the County of Argyle; bounded on the north by Guinecor Creek the Burrah Lake, and the Abercrombie River to a village reserve near Bingham at the mouth of the Isabella River, and from thence by a line bearing south-westerly to a source of Kangaloola Creek at the village reserve, thence by that Creek to its confluence with the Crookwell; on the west by the Crookwell River to its source and by the dividing range to Lake George; on the south by the northern margin of Lake George to the village reserve at Kenna's, thence by a line bearing east to On-yougia, thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Wolowolar and the source of Boro Creek; and by this Creek and the Shoalhaven River to the confluence of the Mongarlow River; on the east by the Shoalhaven River to the confluence of Barber's Creek; and by this Creek and a line bearing north-easterly to the source of the Uringalla, and then by the Uringalla and Paddy's River, and the Wollondilly to the confluence of Guinecor Creek as aforesaid.

9. BRAIDWOOD.

Embracing the south-western portion of the County of St. Vincent, and the eastern portion

of the County of Murray; bounded on the north by the range north of Endrick River, the Shoalhaven River and Boro Creek to its source at Wolowolar; on the west including Long Swamp by the Gourcock Range to Tumanwong; on the south by a line bearing easterly to the south-western angle of Curlewis' grant, and by the southern boundary of this grant to the Shoalhaven River, and a line bearing east to Deua River; on the west by the Deua River, to the confluence of the Araluen, thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the Budawang Range, and by this Range to the Range aforesaid north of the Endrick River.

10. BROULEE.

Embracing a south-eastern portion of the County of St. Vincent; bounded on the north by the eastern shore from Sussex Haven and St. George's Basin to Lamb's grant, thence by a Range to the source of Yalmal Creek; on the west by Budawang Range to the source of the Buckenbowra, thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the confluence of the Araluen Creek with the Deua River; and on the south by the Deua River to Moruya; and on the east by the Sea Shore to Sussex Haven aforesaid, which forms the eastern boundary of the District.

11. QUEANBEYAN.

Embracing the midland portion of the County of Murray; bounded on the north from Wolowolar Mountain by a line bearing north-westerly to Mount Onyongia, and from Onyongia by a line bearing south-westerly to Kenny's grant, thence by the eastern and southern margin of Lake George to the Gap on the west side, thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Bywong Hill and the crest of the Range dividing the Gundaroo Waters from those of Ginninginniderry to One Tree Hill, thence by a line bearing westerly to the Murrumbidgee River on the west by the Murrumbidgee River to Mickleagle; on the south by a Creek and a line bearing east to Tinderry Mountains, thence by the western source, and again by the eastern source of the Queanbeyan River, and thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Tumanwong; and on the east by the Gourcock Range to Wolowolar aforesaid.

12. YASS.

Embracing the southern portion of the County of King and the northern portion of the County of Murray; bounded on the north by the Crookwell to its confluence with the Narrawa, thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the Burrowa River at the confluence with Pudman Creek; on the west by the Burrowa River to its source, then crossing the dividing Range to the source of Davingullen Creek, and by that Creek to its confluence with the Yass River, and by that River to its confluence with the Murrumbidgee to about four miles north of the village reserve; on the south from thence by a line bearing easterly to One Tree Hill, and by the crest of the Range dividing the Gundaroo Waters from those of Ginninginniderry to Bywong Hill, thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the Gap on the west side of Lake George, thence by its easterly margin to Kenny's grant and village reserve; on the east by the northern margin of Lake George and the Cul-

larine Range to the source of the Crookwell River aforesaid.

13. WINDSOR.

Embracing a north-western portion of the County of Cumberland, and the north-eastern portion of the County of Cook, and a southern portion of the County of Hunter; bounded on the north by the Hawkesbury to Wiseman's Ferry, thence up the valley of Webb's Creek, and by the dividing range to the confluence of the Wollern Creek with the Colo River; on the west by the Colo River and the Wollongunby to its two sources, thence by a line bearing south to King George's Mount, and from thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Grose's River; on the south by Grose's River to its confluence with the Hawkesbury, thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Rickaby's Creek, at the crossing of the Richmond Road, and by this Road to Eastern Creek; on the east by Eastern Creek to its confluence with Breakfast Creek, thence by a line bearing east to the Windsor Road, and by this Road to its junction with the Pitt Town Road, from thence by a line bearing north-easterly to William Suttor's grant of fifty acres to the north Road, and by this Road to the south-west angle of the parish of Frederick, thence by a line bearing north easterly to the Hawkesbury aforesaid.

14. PENRITH.

Embracing the south-eastern portion of the county of Cook, western portion of the county of Cumberland, and a small portion northward of the county of Camden; bounded on the north from Rooty Hill, and Eastern Creek by the Richmond Road to Rickaby's Creek, thence by a line bearing north-westerly to Grose's river, and by that river to Mount Hay, on the west from Mount Hay by a line bearing southerly to the Weatherboard hut, thence by Jamison's valley to Cox's river; on the south by Cox's and the Warragamba rivers to a point two miles above the confluence of the Warragamba and Werriberri, thence by a line bearing east to the village Reserve on the Nepean, thence by the Nepean, Bringelly Creek and Bringelly road to south Creek; on the east by south Creek to the northern old road; and by this road and the Cow-pasture old road and a line bearing north-westerly to Eastern Creek, and by eastern Creek to Rooty Hill and Richmond road aforesaid.

15. HARTLEY.

Embracing the western portion of the County of Cook, the midland and southern portion of the County of Westmoreland, and a north-eastern portion of the County of Georgiana; bounded on the north by the valley of the Colo river from the confluence of Willern Creek to the confluence of Cook's Creek; on the west by Cook's Creek and the dividing range to Honey Suckle Hill at the Bathurst road, thence by that road to Dixon's Creek, and by this Creek to its confluence with Fish river and by the Fish river to its source, thence by a line bearing south-westerly, crossing the dividing range to the source of the Isabella river and by that river to its confluence with the Abercombie; on the south by the Abercombie River to its southern source, from thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Burrah Burrah Lake, thence to the source of Guinecor Creek, and

by this creek to its confluence with the Wollondilly; on the east by the Wollondilly to near Bonnum Peak intersected by a line from Jellore Mountain to Colong Mountain bearing north-westerly, thence by this line to the middle source of the Koromung River, thence by the Koromung River and Jameson's Valley and the Weatherboard hut, thence by a line bearing north-easterly to Mount Hay, thence by a line bearing north-westerly to King George's Mount, thence by a line bearing northerly to the source of the Wollonganby, and by this river and the Colo river to the confluence of Wollim creek aforesaid.

16. BATHURST.

Embracing the County of Roxburgh, the northern portion of the County of Bathurst, the southern portion of the County of Georgiana, and the eastern portion of the County of Westmoreland; bounded on the north by the Cudgegong River to the village reserve; on the west by a Creek bearing south-westerly to the western source of Cunningham's Creek, thence by Cunningham's Creek the Turin River, and the Macquarie River to Lewis Ponds, thence by Lewis Ponds and Frederick's Valley to the northern boundary of Simeon Lord's Grant, and from thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Conoblas; on the south by a line from Conoblas bearing easterly to the north-east angle of J. Sterling's grant and to the dividing range dividing the Waters of King's Plains and Fitzgeralds Valley; and by the crest of this range and the dividing range of the Abercrombie and Campbells Waters to the Werong Range at the source of the Fish River; on the west by the Fish River to Dixon's Creek, and by Dixon's Creek to the Bathurst Road, and by that Road to Honey Suckle Hill, thence by this great dividing range to the source of Cook's Creek, and by this Creek to its confluence with the Colo River, and by this River to its source and the source of the Cudgegong River aforesaid.

17. CARCOR.

Embracing the south-western portion of the County of Bathurst, the northern portion of the County of King, and a western portion of the County of Georgiana; bounded on the north commencing at the source of the Isabella River by the crest of the dividing range of the Abercrombie and Campbell's Rivers, and the crest of the dividing range of Fitzgerald's Valley and King's Plains Waters to the eastern boundary of Sterling's grant, thence by a line bearing westerly to Conoblas; on the west by a line bearing southerly to Panuara Creek, and by this Creek to its confluence with the Belubula River, thence by the Belubula, Lachlan, and Burrowra Rivers to the confluence of Pudman Creek; on the south by a line from thence bearing north-westerly to the confluence of the Narrawa and Crookwell, and by the Crookwell River to the confluence of Kangaloola Creek, thence by Kangaloola Creek and a line bearing north-westerly to the village reserve at the confluence of the Isabella River with the Abercrombie; on the east by the Isabella River to its source aforesaid.

18. WELLINGTON.

Embracing the midland and southern portion of the County of Wellington; bounded on the north
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from the confluence of Wildra Creek with the Cudgegong River by a line bearing north-westerly to the range dividing the Cudgegong and Erskine waters; on the west by the crest of this range to the confluence of the Macquarie and Bell Rivers, thence by the Bell and Molong Rivers and Boorenor Creek, and a line bearing southerly to Conoblas; on the east by a line bearing north-easterly to the northern boundary of Simeon Lord's grant, thence by Fredericks Valley and Lewis' Ponds to the Macquarie, thence by the Macquarie and the Turon Rivers and Cunningham's Creek to the range dividing the Pyrumon River from Mero Creek, and by the crest of this range to the confluence of the Mero Creek with the Cudgegong and by the Cudgegong River to the confluence of Wildra Creek aforesaid.

19. MUDGEES.

Embracing the whole of the County of Phillip and the northern portion of the County of Wellington; bounded on the north from the confluence of Widdin Creek by the Goulburn River, and Wildra Creek to its confluence with the Cudgegong; on the west by the Cudgegong River to the confluence of Mero Creek, thence on the south by the crest of the range, dividing the Macquarie and Pyrumon from the Mero Waters to the western source of Cunningham's Creek, thence by a Creek bearing north-easterly to the village reserve, on the Cudgegong River, and by this river to its source at Corundgy; on the east by a line bearing north to Widdin Creek and by Widdin Creek to its confluence with the Goulburn aforesaid.

20. BRISBANE WATER.

Embracing the south-eastern portion of the County of Northumberland; bounded on the north by a line from Reid's Mistake across Lake Macquarie, bearing westerly to Dora Creek and by Dora Creek to the Warrawolong Range and to Mount Warrawolong, thence on the west by the crest of the said range to Mount Simpson and the north road, and by this road to Wiseman's Ferry; on the south by the Hawkesbury and Broken Bay roads to Box Head on the sea shore, which forms the eastern boundary to Reid's Mistake aforesaid.

21. NEWCASTLE AND RAYMOND TERRACE.

Embracing a southern portion of the County of Gloucester, and a north-eastern portion of the County of Northumberland; bounded on the north from South Head by the southern shores of Port Stephens to the village reserve of Sawyer's Point at the entrance of the Karua River, thence by a tracked Road to Mossman's Land on the William's River, thence on the west by William's River to the north-eastern angle of the boundary of William Sparke's grant, thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the Sugar Loaf Mountain, and by the Sugar Loaf Range to the source of Dora Creek; on the south by Dora Creek and a line bearing easterly from its mouth crossing Lake Macquarie to Reid's Mistake on the Sea Shore which forms the eastern boundary to the South Head of Port Stephens aforesaid.

22. DUNGOG.

Embracing the greater portion of the County of Gloucester and a north-eastern portion of the County of Durham; bounded on the north from Farquhar Inlet by the River Manning and the Barnard River to its source; on the west by the

range dividing the Manning and Hunter Waters, and the range dividing the Allyn and William's Waters to the southern boundary of John Verge's grant, thence by a line bearing east to William's River, and by this River to the western boundary of Mossman's Land, thence on the south by a track bearing easterly to the village reserve at Sawyer's Point of the Karna River, and by the southern shore of Port Stephens to South Head on the Sea Shore, which forms the eastern boundary of Farquhar Inlet aforesaid.

23. MAITLAND.

Embracing the northern portion of the County of Northumberland and a southern portion of the County of Durham; bounded on the north-east by the Hunter to Morpeth, thence across the River and by the right bank of the Paterson River to the northern boundary of T. Nowlan's Land; on the north by the northern boundary of Nowlan's Land and across the Government Reserve to Lamb's Valley and to the Hunter at the eastern boundary of Gaggin's Land, and thence by the right bank of the Hunter to the entrance of Black Creek; on the west by Black Creek to the Maitland Road thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Broken Back Mountain; on the south from thence by the crest of the Broken Back Mountains to the Sugar Loaf Range at the source of Wallis' Creek; on the east by the Sugar Loaf Range and a line bearing north-easterly to William Sparke's Grant, thence crossing the Hunter by the right bank of this River to the confluence of William's River being the commencement of the north-east boundary aforesaid.

24. WOLOMBI AND MACDONALD RIVER.

Embracing the south-western portion of the County of Northumberland and a part of the southern portion of the County of Hunter; bounded on the north by the Broken Back Range from the head of Willis' Creek, and by the range heading Milbro Dale to the Wambo Range, and thence by the Monandilla Range heading Doyle's and Greig's Creeks to Widdin Creek; on the west by Widdin Creek to Corendgy, thence by the head of the Cudgegong River to Ganduddy Creek, and by this Creek and a line bearing southerly to Umbiella Creek, and by this Creek to its confluence with the Colo or Capertee River; on the south by the Colo River to the confluence of Wollim Creek, thence by the crest of the range dividing the Colo and Macdonald Waters to the confluence of the Macdonald River with the Hawkesbury, and thence to Wiseman's Ferry; on the east by the New North Road to Mount Simpson, and by this range to Warrawolong, thence to the range heading Dora Creek, and by this range to the Broken Back Range at the head of Wallis' Creek aforesaid.

25. PATERSON.

Embracing the eastern portion of the County of Durham; bounded on the north by the range at the heads of the Paterson and Allyn Rivers; on the west by the range dividing the Waters of Glendon Brook from the Paterson to the south-east angle of T. Gaggin's Grant on the Hunter; on the south by a line bearing easterly across the Government Reserve to Lamb's Valley, and thence by the northern boundary of Nowlan's land, thence by the right bank of the Paterson to its confluence with the Hunter, and by the Hunter to the confluence of William's River; on the east

by the William's beyond the Government Reserve thence by a line bearing westerly to the dividing range of the Allyn and William's Waters, and by this range to the northern boundary aforesaid.

26. PATRICK'S PLAINS.

Embracing the midland portion of the County of Durham, the north-eastern portion of the County of Hunter, and the north-western portion of the County of Northumberland; bounded on the north by the range at the head of Fall Brook; on the west by the range heading Sandy Creek and Muscle Brook, to a point where the road crosses to the east of Mount Arthur, thence by a line bearing southerly to the eastern boundary of James Robertson's grant; and the River Hunter, thence by the western boundary of Jerry's Plains reserve and the Wambo range; on the south by the range heading Milbro Dale, crossing the north road near to Wollombi Brook, thence to Broken Back Mountain; on the east by a line bearing north-easterly from Broken Back Mountain to Black Creek at the northern boundary of Stephenson's grant, thence by Black Creek to the Hunter and the south-west angle of Underwood's grant, crossing the river to the dividing range of the Paterson Waters and the Glendon Brook to the range at the head of Fall Brook aforesaid.

27. MERTON AND MUSWELLBROOK.

Embracing the south-western portion of the County of Durham, the south-eastern portion of the County of Brisbane, and the north-western portion of the County of Hunter; bounded on the north by the range between Rouchell River and Sandy Creek to its confluence with Dart Brook with the Page and Hunter Rivers, and the southern boundary of Hall's grant, thence by a line bearing west crossing the Waybong to its confluence with Cuongua Creek to Hall's lands, and by the south-eastern boundaries of Hall's lands to the range dividing Hall's Creek and the Werruadi River; on the west by this range to the northern banks of the Goulburn River opposite the north-eastern angle of Townsend's grant, and by the Goulburn to its confluence with Widdin Creek, and by this Creek to four miles south of Tindall's grant, thence on the south by a line bearing south-east to the Monandilla Range, and by this range to the Wambo range; on the east by the Wambo range to the western boundary of Jerry's Plains reserve, thence by a line bearing northerly to a point where the road crosses to the east of Mount Arthur, and thence by the range heading Muscle Brook and Sandy Creek, to the range south of the Rouchell River aforesaid.

28. SCONE AND MURRURUNDI.

Embracing the northern portion of the County of Durham, and the north-eastern portion of the County of Brisbane: bounded on the north by the crest of the Liverpool Range heading the Peel River and other waters to Mount Terrell; on the west by the ranges dividing the Waters of the Gumm and Hall's Creek to the southern boundary of Hall's Land; on the south by the southern and eastern boundaries of Hall's Land, thence by a line heading Grant's Creek, and crossing the Wybong to the confluence of Dart Brook and the Hunter, and by the crest of the range dividing the Rouchell River and Sandy Creek, and by the range heading Fall Brook; on the east by the range leading northward from Mount Royal and heading the Rouchell River, and by the crest of

the range dividing the Hunter, Manning, and Barnard Waters to the Liverpool Range heading the Peel River aforesaid.

29. CASSILIS.

Embracing the Western portion of the County of Brisbane, and the whole of the County of Bligh; bounded on the north from Mount Terrel by the Liverpool Range to Pandora's Pass; on the north-west by the Coalaaburragundy and Erskine Rivers to the western boundary of William Lawson's grant; on the West by the crest of a range to a track leading from Guntawong to Cobra; and on the south-west by this tracked Road to Wildra Creek; on the south by Wildra Creek and a line bearing north-easterly to the source of the Goulburn River; and by the northern bank of this River to the eastern boundary of M. Townsend's grant; on the east by the crest of the range dividing the Valleys of Hall's Creek and the Werrendi and Gummum Waters to the Terrell Mount aforesaid.

30. MACQUARIE.

Embracing the whole of the County Macquarie, above Crescent Head; bounded on the north by a line bearing west to a range heading Maria's and Wilson's Rivers, and by this range and a line from thence bearing south-westerly to Werrekembe at the source of the Hasting's River, and by the range heading the Apsley River to the Basaltic Rock, thence by a range to the range heading the River Peel; on the south by the range heading Hunter's River to the source of the Barnard, and by this River and the Manning to Farquhar's Inlet on the sea shore, which forms the eastern boundary of the district to the point northward of Crescent Head aforesaid.

ABORIGINES.

WITH reference to the various notices respecting the treatment of the ABORIGINAL NATIVES of this Colony, which have been issued from this Office, and particularly to those published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th May, 1836, and 22nd May, 1839; the GOVERNOR desires that the following Extract from a Despatch addressed to him by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonial Department, on the 31st December, 1839, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.

(EXTRACT)

"You cannot overrate the solicitude of Her Majesty's Government on the subject of the Aborigines of New Holland. It is impossible to contemplate the condition and the prospects of that unfortunate race without the deepest commiseration. I am well aware of the many difficulties which oppose themselves to the effectual protection of these people, and especially of those which must originate from the exasperation of the Settlers, on account of aggressions on their property, which are not the less irritating, because they are nothing else than the natural results of the pernicious examples held out to the Aborigines, and of the many wrongs of which they have been the victims—still it is impossible that the Government should forget that the

original aggression was our own, and that we have never yet performed the sacred duty of making any systematic or considerable attempt to impart to the former occupiers of New South Wales, the blessing of Christianity, or the knowledge of the arts and advantages of civilised life. It is, I know, superfluous to stimulate your zeal in this service. Yet, I cannot be satisfied to quit the subject without commending it to your renewed attention. I am convinced that you may confidently reckon on the advice and co-operation of the Ministers of Religion of every Christian Denomination; and you may calculate, with the utmost confidence, on the cordial support of the Crown, in every well directed effort for securing to the Aboriginal Race of New Holland, protection against injustice, and the enjoyment of every social advantage which our superior wealth and knowledge at once confer on us the power, and impose on us the duty, of imparting to them. For this purpose, you will use every effort to afford instruction to their children and young men. You will seek out persons, whose humanity leads them to be kind to the Native Races; and you will take means to reward the Missionaries who may engage in this good work."

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.—To Mariners, After the 1st of August, 1840, a plain stationary Light will be shown from sunset to sunrise from a Light-house erected on the extremity of Gellibrand's Point, William's Town, Hobson's Bay, visible five leagues in clear weather, from any safe position to the Southward.

All Masters of Vessels entering the Port are requested to notice the following Bearings by Compass:—

From the N. end of the Western Channel, the anchorage at William's Town bears N. 14° E.

From the N. end of Symond's Channel, the anchorage at William's Town bears N. 6° E.

From the N. end of the Pinnacle Channel, the anchorage at William's Town bears N. 5° E.

From the N. end of the South Channel, the anchorage at William's Town bears N. 6° W.

The courses indicated will give Vessels a fair berth from the Shoal off Gellibrand's Point. Care must be taken after bringing the Light-house to bear N 67° 33' W. by compass, not to stand into less than four fathoms water on the western shore, and also to guard against a Bank which lies off the eastern beach, bearing from the Light-house from about N. 22° E. to N. 7° E. 1½ mile. After rounding the Light and bringing it to bear about S. 14° W. 1' the anchor may be dropped in four fathoms water, in good holding ground of stiff clay and mud.
