PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better regulating Courts of Requests in the Colony of New South Wales;" it is enacted, that Courts of Civil Jurisdiction, to be called Courts of Requests, shall be holden at and in the following Towns or Places respectively; that is to say, in the County of Cumberland, at the several Towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Liverpool, Penrith, Windsor, and Campbelltown; in the County of Camden, at the Towns of Wollongong, and of Bong Bong or Berrima; in the County of Bathurst, at the Town of Bathurst; and in the County of Northumberland, at the Town of Maitland: and the said Courts respectively shall be holden at such times, at the said several Towns or Places, as the Governor for the time-being shall, by Proclamation, to be issued for that purpose from time to time, direct and appoint:—

Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint the said Courts of Civil Jurisdiction to be called Courts of Requests, shall be holden in the present year for the said respective Counties aforesaid the several and respective Places aforesaid, on the days and times hereinafter respectively mentioned; that is to say,—

At the Town of Sydney, on the first Thursday and following days in the respective months of February, March, May, June, July, August, September, November and December.

At Liverpool, on Monday, the 6th of April, Monday the 6th of July, and Monday the 6th of October.

At Campbelltown, on Tuesday the 7th of April, Tuesday the 7th of July and Tuesday the 6th of October.

At Parramatta, on Wednesday the 1st. of April, Wednesday the 8th of July and Wednesday the 14th of October.

At Windsor on Thursday the 2nd of April, Thursday the 9th of July and Thursday the 15th of October.

At Penrith on Saturday the 4th of April, Saturday the 11th of July and Saturday the 17th of October.

At Berrima on Thursday the 9th of April and Thursday the 8th of October.

At Wollongong on Monday the 13th of April and Monday the 12 of October.

At Bathurst on Thursday the 23rd of April and following days and Thursday the 22nd of October and following days.

At the Court-house, Maitland, on Thursday the 21st. of May and following days and Thursday the 19th of November and following days.

TO AUCTIONEERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that a strict compliance with the provisions of the Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Sections of the Act of Council 9, Geo. 4th, No. 13, intituled "An Act to regulate the Licensing of Auctioneers and the Collection of Duties on Property sold by Auction," will henceforth be enforced.

For the information of those Auctioneers who appear to be unacquainted with this Act, the Sections particularly referred to above are subjoined:—

VI. And be it further enacted, That the said Rate and Duty, by this Act imposed, shall be, and is hereby declared to be, a charge upon every Auctioneer or Seller by Commission, immediately from and after the knocking down of the hammer, or other closing the bidding, at every Sale by way of Auction, and that the Rates and Duties so charged shall be paid by every such Auctioneer, or Seller by Commission, in manner and at the times hereinafter mentioned.

VII. And be it further enacted, That each and every person, so acting as Auctioneer as aforesaid, shall, and he is hereby required, within Fourteen Days after the expiration of every Calendar month, to deliver or cause to be delivered, to the Collector of Internal Revenue for the time being, or at his Office, or to such other Person as shall, from time to time, be authorised to receive the same, an exact and particular account in writing, of the total amount of money that shall have been bidden at each and every Sale, and of the several articles, lots or parcels, with the price at which every such article, lot or parcel shall have been sold, at each and every Sale, which shall have been had and holden by such Auctioneer, during the said month, together with the time or times when, and the place or places where, such sale or sales, shall have been had and holden; and every such Auctioneer shall, at the same time, make payment to the said Collector of Internal Revenue of all such sum and sums of money as shall be due and payable to His Majesty, in pursuance of, and according to the true intent, and meaning of this Act, which sum or sums of money such Auctioneer is hereby authorised and empowered to retain out of the produce arising by such Sale or deposit made at such sale, or otherwise, to recover the same by action at law, against the person or persons by whom such Auctioneer shall have been employed; or on whose account such goods shall have been so sold. And every person, so acting as Auctioneer, at such Sale or Sales, if any, shall make oath to the truth of each and every such account, before the said Collector of Internal

Revenue, or such Person as shall be so appointed as aforesaid, or before any Justice of the Peace, who are hereby respectively authorised to administer the same. And in case any such Auctioneer shall neglect to deliver in his account, at the time, and in manner aforesaid, or to make payment of the Rates and Duties as herein directed; or if it shall appear that the account delivered in, by such Auctioneer, is not a true and just account, or that the said Auctioneer hath acted contrary to the true intent and meaning of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person so to be appointed as aforesaid, to cause the Bond or Bonds of such Auctioneer and his Sureties, to be put in suit and in case of a Judgment being thereupon had against the Defendant, such License shall thenceforth become void to all intents and purposes; and such Auctioneer shall be, and he is hereby declared to be for ever after disqualified for holding any License as an Auctioneer, unless it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Court, or Judge before whom the trial of such bond shall have been had, that no fraud or wilful delay, contrary to the true meaning of this Act, was intended by such Auctioneer, and a certificate to such effect shall be granted by such Court or Judge respectively.

VIII. And whereas it may sometimes happen, that Sales at Auction of Estates of Goods may be rendered null and void, by reason that the person or persons, for whose benefit the same shall be sold, had no title to, or no right to dispose of the same: Be it therefore enacted, That if any Sale by Auction of any Estate, Goods, or Effects, shall be rendered void, by reason that the person for whose benefit the same was sold, had no title to the same, or no right to dispose thereof, then, and in every such case, it shall and may be lawful for the Auctioneer who paid the duty for Estates, Goods or Effects so sold, or for the person or persons for whose benefit the same was so sold, to apply to the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or to the person who shall be appointed as aforesaid, for a return of the duty so paid; and the said Collector or the person so appointed as aforesaid, shall, and is hereby required to hear and investigate all such applications, and examine the witnesses upon oath, who shall be produced on the part of the party or parties making such application, which oath the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person appointed as aforesaid, is hereby empowered to administer, and thereupon to report the case to the said Governor or Acting Governor, who upon being satisfied as to the justice of the application, may order the amount of duty, which shall have been so paid as aforesaid, to be refunded and paid to such Auctioneer, or such other person, on whose behalf the same shall have been originally paid to such Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person appointed as aforesaid, anything in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

CONDITIONS.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1. All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.
2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent, and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of

3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3½lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the Military Ration shall be in the proportion of 6lbs. of Beef and 2lbs. of Mutton weekly; deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations the Beef shall be delivered in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal shall be similar in quality to the Weaten Meal, and shall be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto, shall be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum shall be West India, five per cent. under proof.

MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. No part whatever of the Supplies above specified shall be received in charge of the Commissariat, but shall all be delivered by the Contractor direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, upon the written order of the Commissariat Officer in charge of the District, or of the Person authorised for that purpose.

7. GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. The whole of the supplies of every description in each District are to be included in one Contract; and, therefore, no Tenders will be received unless for supplying the whole without exception that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender.

10. Provisions and Forage being required by Rations according to scales under these respective heads, the Tenders are to express the price per Ration only, and not of the several Articles, excepting that of Rum, the price of which must be separately stated.

11. Fuel and Light, as well as the supplies for Hospitals and Penal Settlements, being required by Weight and Measure, must be priced accordingly, as shewn under these heads respectively.

12. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other roads similarly situated, shall have at all times on the spot a supply for

fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent to whom reference may be had in the Contractor's absence.

13. 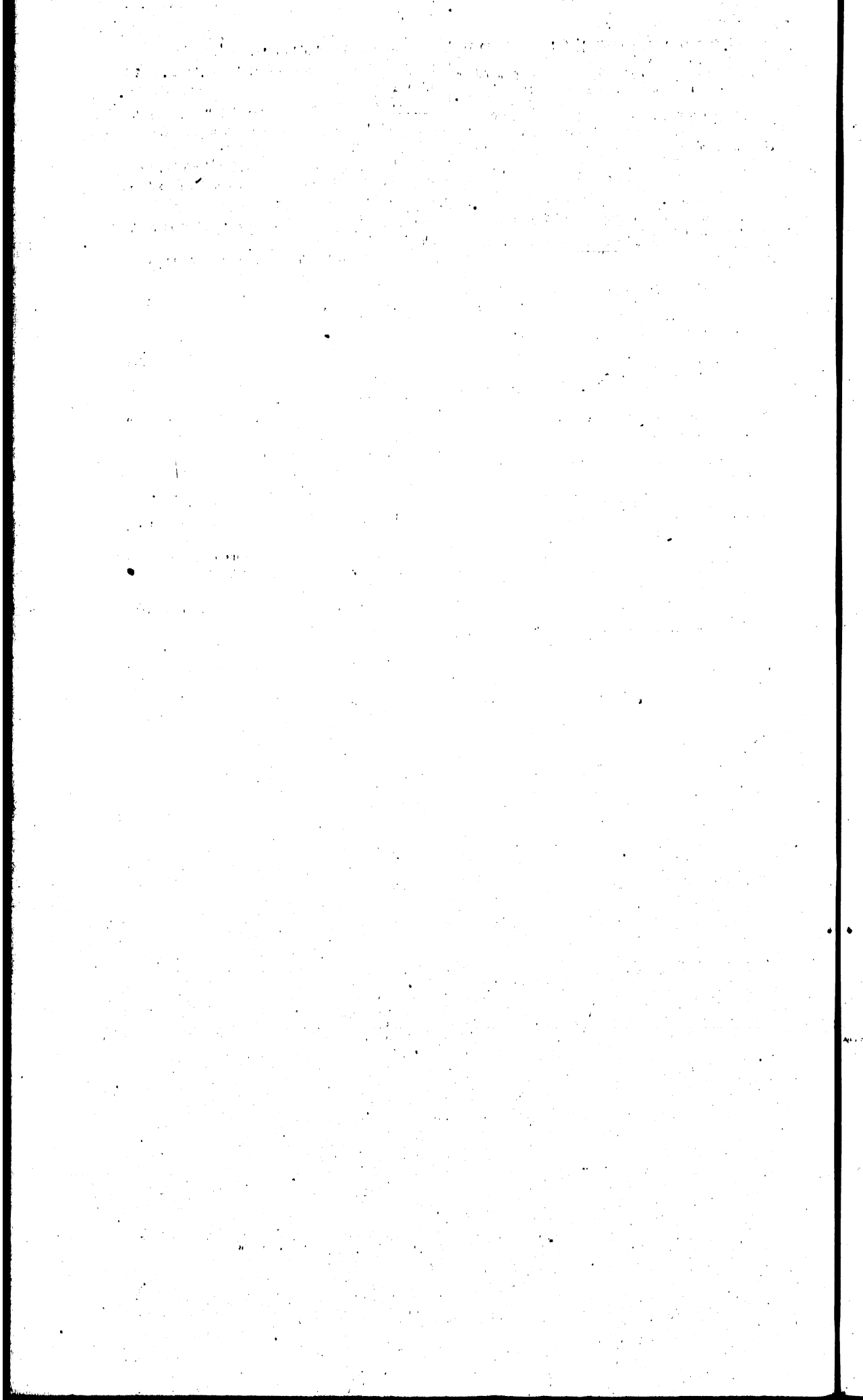

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR GEORGE GIPPS**, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled "*An Act for the better regulating Courts of Requests in the Colony of New South Wales*;" it is enacted, that Courts of Civil Jurisdiction, to be called Courts of Requests, shall be holden at and in the following Towns or Places respectively; that is to say, in the County of Cumberland, at the several Towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Liverpool, Penrith, Windsor, and Campbelltown; in the County of Camden, at the Towns of Wollongong, and of Bong Bong or Berrima; in the County of Bathurst, at the Town of Bathurst; and in the County of Northumberland, at the Town of Maitland: and the said Courts respectively shall be holden at such times, at the said several Towns or Places, as the Governor for the time-being shall, by Proclamation, to be issued for that purpose from time to time, direct and appoint:—

Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint the said Courts of Civil Jurisdiction to be called Courts of Requests, shall be holden in the present year for the said respective Counties aforesaid the several and respective Places aforesaid, on the days and times hereinafter respectively mentioned; that is to say,—

At the Town of Sydney, on the first Thursday and following days in the respective months of February, March, May, June, July, August, September, November and December.

At Liverpool, on Monday, the 6th of April, Monday the 6th of July, and Monday the 5th of October.

At Campbelltown, on Tuesday the 7th of April, Tuesday the 7th of July and Tuesday the 6th of October.

At Parramatta, on Wednesday the 1st. of April, Wednesday the 8th of July and Wednesday the 14th of October.

At Windsor on Thursday the 2nd of April, Thursday the 9th of July and Thursday the 15th of October.

At Penrith on Saturday the 4th of April, Saturday the 11th of July and Saturday the 17th of October.

At Berrima on Thursday the 9th of April and Thursday the 8th of October.

At Wollongong on Monday the 13th of April and Monday the 12 of October.

At Bathurst on Thursday the 23rd of April and following days and Thursday the 22nd of October and following days.

At the Court-house, Maitland, on Thursday the 21st. of May and following days and Thursday the 19th of November and following days.

TO AUCTIONEERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that a strict compliance with the provisions of the Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Sections of the Act of Council 9, Geo. 4th, No. 13, intituled "An Act to regulate the Licensing of Auctioneers and the Collection of Duties on Property sold by Auction," will henceforth be enforced.

For the information of those Auctioneers who appear to be unacquainted with this Act, the Sections particularly referred to above are subjoined:—

VI. And be it further enacted, That the said Rate and Duty, by this Act imposed, shall be, and is hereby declared to be, a charge upon every Auctioneer or Seller by Commission, immediately from and after the knocking down of the hammer, or other closing the bidding, at every Sale by way of Auction, and that the Rates and Duties so charged shall be paid by every such Auctioneer, or Seller by Commission, in manner and at the times hereinafter mentioned.

VII. And be it further enacted, That each and every person, so acting as Auctioneer as aforesaid, shall, and he is hereby required, within Fourteen Days after the expiration of every Calendar month, to deliver or cause to be delivered, to the Collector of Internal Revenue for the time being, or at his Office, or to such other Person as shall, from time to time, be authorized to receive the same, an exact and particular account in writing, of the total amount of money that shall have been bidden at each and every Sale, and of the several articles, lots or parcels, with the price at which every such article, lot or parcel shall have been sold, at each and every Sale, which shall have been had and holden by such Auctioneer, during the said month, together with the time or times when, and the place or places where, such sale or sales, shall have been had and holden; and every such Auctioneer shall, at the same time, make payment to the said Collector of Internal Revenue of all such sum and sums of money as shall be due and payable to His Majesty, in pursuance of, and according to the true intent and meaning of this Act, which sum or sums of money such Auctioneer is hereby authorised and empowered to retain out of the produce arising by such Sale or deposit made at such sale, or otherwise, to recover the same by action at law, against the person or persons by whom such Auctioneer shall have been employed, or on whose account such goods shall have been so sold. And every person so acting as Auctioneer, at such Sale or Sales, if any, shall make oath to the truth of each and every such account, before the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or such Person as shall be so appointed as aforesaid, or before any Justice of the Peace, who are hereby respectively authorised to administer the same. And in case any such Auctioneer shall neglect to deliver in his account, at the time, and in manner aforesaid, or to make payment of the Rates and Duties as herein directed; or if it shall appear that the account delivered in, by such

Auctioneer, is not a true and just account, or that the said Auctioneer hath acted contrary to the true intent and meaning of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person so to be appointed as aforesaid, to cause the Bond or Bonds of such Auctioneer and his Sureties, to be put in suit and in case of a Judgment being thereupon had against the Defendant, such License shall thenceforth become void to all intents and purposes; and such Auctioneer shall be, and he is hereby declared to be for ever after disqualified for holding any License as an Auctioneer, unless it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Court, or Judge before whom the trial of such bond shall have been had, that no fraud or wilful delay, contrary to the true meaning of this Act, was intended by such Auctioneer, and a certificate to such effect shall be granted by such Court or Judge respectively.

VIII. And whereas it may sometimes happen, that Sales at Auction of Estates of Goods may be rendered null and void, by reason that the person or persons, for whose benefit the same shall be sold, had no title to, or no right to dispose of the same: Be it therefore enacted, That if any Sale by Auction of any Estate, Goods, or Effects, shall be rendered void, by reason that the person for whose benefit the same was sold, had no title to the same, or no right to dispose thereof, then, and in every such case, it shall and may be lawful for the Auctioneer who paid the duty for Estates, Goods or Effects so sold, or for the person or persons for whose benefit the same was so sold, to apply to the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or to the person who shall be appointed as aforesaid, for a return of the duty so paid; and the said Collector or the person so appointed as aforesaid, shall, and is hereby required to bear and investigate all such applications, and examine the witnesses upon oath, who shall be produced on the part of the party or parties making such application, which oath the said Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person appointed as aforesaid, is hereby empowered to administer, and thereupon to report the case to the said Governor or Acting Governor, who upon being satisfied as to the justice of the application, may order the amount of duty, which shall have been so paid as aforesaid, to be refunded and paid to such Auctioneer, or such other person, on whose behalf the same shall have been originally paid to such Collector of Internal Revenue, or other person appointed as aforesaid, anything in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

CONDITIONS.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1. All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.
2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent, and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent, has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of

3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3½lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the Military Ration shall be in the proportion of 5lbs. of Beef and 2lbs. of Mutton weekly; deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations the Beef shall be delivered in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal shall be similar in quality to the Weaten Meal, and shall be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto, shall be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum shall be West India, five per cent. under proof.

MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. No part whatever of the Supplies above specified shall be received in charge of the Commissariat, but shall all be delivered by the Contractor direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, upon the written order of the Commissariat Officer in charge of the District, or of the Person authorised for that purpose.

7. At the several fixed Stations the Rations for the Troops, the Convict Establishments, and Road and other Parties, shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Barracks, Establishments, or Huts where the Parties to be supplied may be stationed; being previously to removal from the Contractor's Premises approved by a Person authorised for the purpose.

8. The Forage shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Establishments where the Horses or Cattle are stationed, and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species shall be reckoned as the proportion of the Ration undermentioned, viz.—

The Maize or Barley 4-12ths.
The Hay 5-12ths.
The Bran 2-12ths.
The Straw 1-12th.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. The whole of the supplies of every description in each District are to be included in one Contract; and, therefore, no Tenders will be received unless for supplying the whole without exception that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender.

10. Provisions and Forage being required by Rations according to scales under these respective heads, the Tenders are to express the price per Ration only, and not of the several Articles, excepting that of Rum, the price of which must be separately stated.

11. Fuel and Light, as well as the supplies for Hospitals and Penal Settlements, being required by Weight and Measure, must be priced accordingly, as shewn under these heads respectively.

12. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other roads similarly situated, shall have at all times on the spot a supply for

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fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent to whom reference may be had in the Contractor's absence.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the Party receiving the supply as to its quality, the same shall be decided in the following manner:—The Party objecting shall name one Person as Arbitrator, the Contractor or his Agent another, these two shall (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as Umpire, who, in the event of the Arbitrators not agreeing in the opinion, shall be called upon for his decision, which shall be final. And should it be decided that the article is not of proper quality, it shall be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing which it shall be procured and the expense charged to his account.

14. It shall be in the power of either Party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing a notice of three *calendar months* to the opposite Party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month.

15. 2. 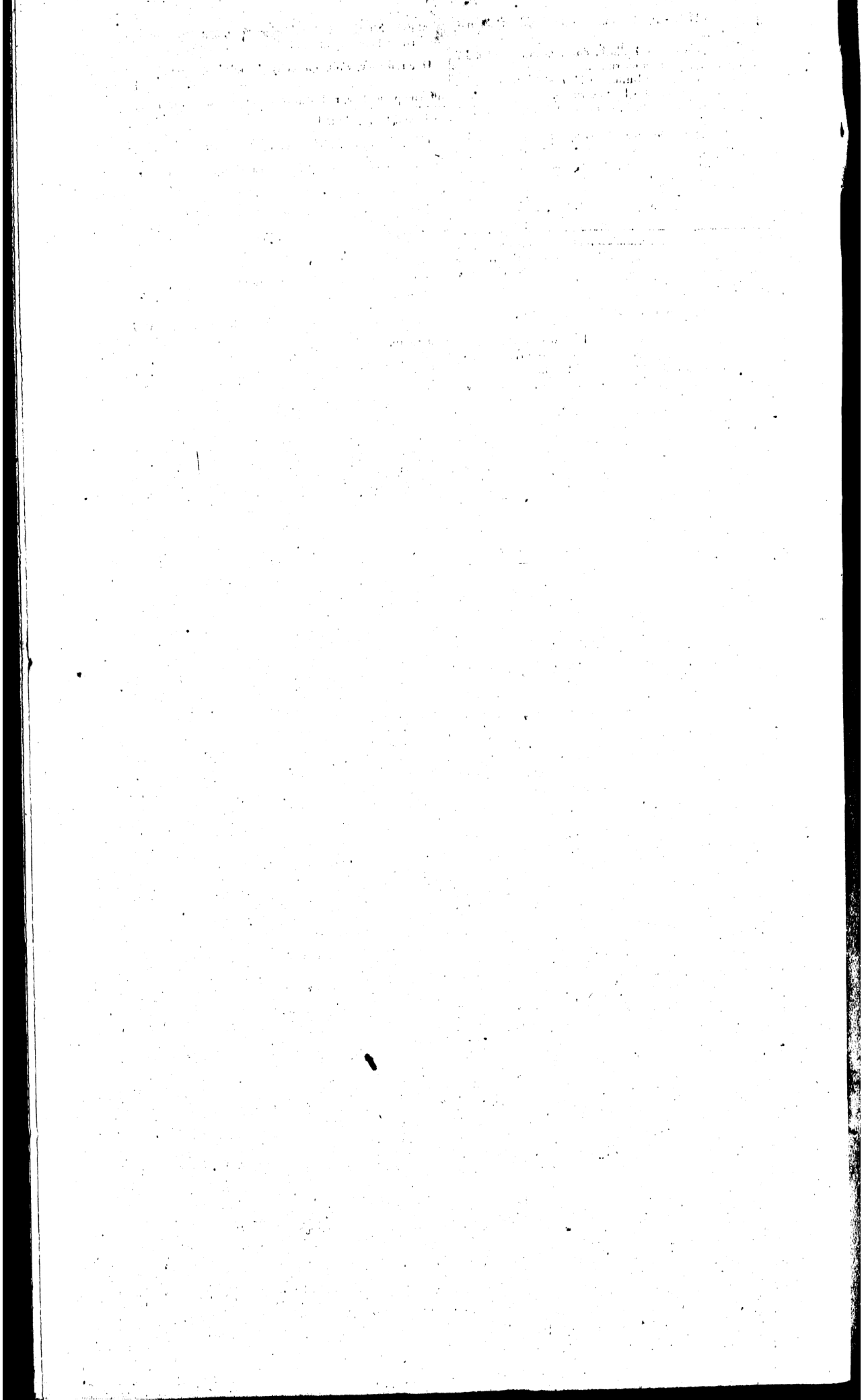

and length of Service, and the circumstances of their Discharge.

3. When this has been approved by the Governor, the Applicant will receive a Certificate from the Colonial Secretary, stating the amount of Remission to which he is entitled, which Certificate will be received either in whole or part payment of any Crown Lands bought by the Holder of it, at Public Auction, in the Colony, within Twelve Months from its date.

“ An Act to amend an Act of the Ninth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, and for the more effectual government thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto, and to continue the same, until the thirty-first Day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty, and thenceforward to the end of the then next Session of Parliament.”
 (24th August, 1839.)

WHEREAS, an Act was passed in the Ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King George the Fourth, intituled, “ An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, and for the more effectual government thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto:” And whereas the said Act hath been since continued, and will now shortly expire: And whereas it is expedient further to continue the said Act, with such amend-

mends as are hereinafter mentioned: Be it therefore enacted, by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, That the said recited Act, as herein after amended, shall continue, and be in force until the thirty-first Day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty, and thence Recited Act forward to the end of the then next further con- Session of Parliament.

11. And whereas, by the said recited Act, pro- Local Legis- latures Em- powered to make Provi- sion for Ad- ministration of Justice. vision was made for the Adminis- tration of Justice within the said Colonies, and for defining the Con- stitutions and Powers of the Courts of Law and Equity therein: And whereas the Provisions of the said Act in that behalf have, by reason of the extension of the said Colonies, been found, in divers respects, inapplicable to the circumstances of the said Colo- nies, and to the wants of the inhabitants thereof; but the Local Legislatures of the said respective Colonies, established under the said recited Act, have no power to repeal or alter any of the before mentioned provisions thereof: Be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Local Legis- latures of the said respective Colonies, by any laws or ordinances to be by them or either of them, from time to time, for that purpose, made in the manner prescribed by the said recited Act, and subject to the conditions and provisions therein contained, to make such provision as to them may seem meet for the better Administration of Justice, and for defining the Constitution of the Courts of Law and Equity, and of Juries within the said Colonies re- spectively, or within any present or future Depend- encies thereof respectively; anything in the said recited Act, or in any Charter of Justice or Order in Council, made and issued in pursuance thereof, or in any Law, Statute, or Usage, to the contrary thereof, in anywise notwithstanding.

IMMIGRATION.

WITH a view to the further encouragement of the introduction into the Colony of useful and respectable agricultural laborers, and mechanics from the United Kingdom, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, in accordance with the recommendation of the Committee of the Legislative Council on Immigration in their Report of 12th November, 1839, to revise the Regulations published in the Government Notices of 25th Sep- tember, and 18th November, 1837, and 30th April, 1838, and directs it to be notified, that a pecuniary aid to the amount and under the condi- tions hereinafter specified, will be granted to those persons who shall be at the charge of bringing into New South Wales, from the United Kingdom, Emigrants of the following description, viz.—

- Agricultural Laborers.
- Shepherds.
- Carpenters.
- Smiths.
- Wheelwrights.
- Bricklayers.
- Masons.
- Female Domestic and Farm Servants.

- (1.) The sum of £38 will be granted as a bounty towards defraying the expence of the passage of every married man of any of the foregoing description and his wife, neither of whose ages shall exceed on embarkation 40 years.
- (2.) The sum of £5 will also be paid for each child between the ages of 1 and 7 years; of £10 for each child between the ages of 7 and 15 years; and of £15 for each child above 15 years, for whose parents, or either of them, the foregoing bounty is allowed, but for no other children.
- (3.) A sum of £10 will also be allowed for every unmarried female domestic or farm servant, whose age shall not be below 15, nor above 30 years, who shall come out under the protection of a married couple, as forming part of the family, and destined to remain with it until such female be otherwise provided for.
- (4.) A bounty of £10 will also be allowed for every unmarried male mechanic or agricultural laborer of any trade or calling as above enu- merated, above the age of 18, and not exceeding 30 years, brought out by a person who, at the same time brings out an equal number of females, accompanying and attached to a family, as hereinbefore described.

11. With a view to encourage attention to the health, comfort, and improvement of the Emigrants during the passage, the selection of well informed medical men to fill the office of Surgeon Super- intendent, and a zealous co-operation with them on the part of the officers of the ship; the following gratuities have been established, viz.—

- A gratuity of 10s. 6d., per head, for every Emigrant brought out under these Regulations, and including children under 1 year, to the Surgeon Superintendent in charge, upon the Government being satisfied of the zealous and efficient performance of his duties.
- A gratuity of 3s., to the Master, of 1s. 6d., to the first Mate, and of 1s. each to the second and third Mates, for every such Emigrant brought out in the ships to which they belong, provided that the Government be satisfied of their atten- tive, humane and orderly conduct towards the Emigrants.

The Surgeon Superintendent will be allowed, where the number of bounty Immigrants shall exceed one hundred, to appoint an Hospital Assistant, to whom, if recommended by him and approved by the Government, a gratuity of £3 will be granted. To preserve order and clean- liness amongst the Immigrants, the Surgeon Superintendent will also be allowed to appoint Overseers in the proportion of one for every fifty Immigrants, who, upon being recommended and approved as above, will be entitled to a gratuity of £2 each: Also a Teacher for the Children, who, in proportion to the numbers and to the satisfactory proofs of his good conduct, will be rewarded by a gratuity not exceeding £5. In consideration of these advantages, it will be the duty of every Sur- geon Superintendent of a vessel on the Bounty System to establish a School on board, selecting the fittest person he can for the Teacher, and to assemble the Passengers every Sunday morning for public worship, which he is to conduct with all proper seriousness and devotion.

111. In consideration of raising the Bounties to the scale hereby established, the parties claiming

them, or their agents, will be required to provide the Immigrants with suitable accommodation on shore, or allow them to remain on board the ships by which they arrive, for a period not exceeding ten clear days from the time of their coming to anchor, and to supply them with a ration at least equivalent to that they received at Sea.

IV. Before any payments are made under these Regulations, the Immigrants on whose account they are claimed will be required to present themselves before a Board appointed by the Governor to inspect persons of this description, to whom the Adults are to exhibit Testimonials of good character, signed by Clergymen and respectable inhabitants of note in the places of their former residence; with which Testimonials it is necessary that every family and single person, for whom the Bounty is claimed, should be provided. If the Board shall be satisfied with these Testimonials, and that the persons presenting themselves are within the prescribed ages, (to be established, where possible, by the production of copies or extracts of the registry of their Baptism, duly certified by the parish Minister, or other proper Officer), of good bodily health and strength, and in all other respects likely to be useful members of their class in society, a Certificate to such effect will be granted by the Board, or if the Immigrants be landed at Melbourne, by His Honor the Superintendent, which, being presented at the Colonial Secretary's Office in Sydney, a warrant will be immediately issued for the payment of the sum to which the person bringing the Emigrants out shall become entitled under this Notice.

V. In addition to the foregoing Certificates, the Importer will be required to satisfy the Board that the Immigrants have been duly supplied with a sufficiency of good and wholesome provisions and water, the latter in the proportion of at least three quarts per day for every Immigrant, and with reasonable comfortable accommodation.

VI. It will be the duty also of the Board to enquire strictly whether the conditions upon which the gratuities hereby established in favour of the Surgeon Superintendent, and Officers of the Ship, have been duly fulfilled, and to report, for the intimation of his Excellency the Governor, the grounds upon which they may recommend the Gratuities to be paid or withheld, as the case may be.

VII. Any Persons desiring to avail themselves of these Bounties, are required to transmit to the Colonial Secretary, at Sydney, a List specifying, as nearly as circumstances will permit, the number, condition, and calling of the Persons they propose to bring out, and whether to Sydney or to Melbourne.

VIII. It is to be understood that Bounties will not be allowed for any Persons brought out, unless the Claimant shall have transmitted to the Colonial Secretary the list required by the foregoing paragraph, and shall have received in reply an intimation of its being the intention of this Government to grant a Bounty on the introduction of the persons described therein. This document the claimant will be required to produce to the Board, and to prove to their satisfaction that the Immigrants have been imported in pursuance thereof. In order to guard against the inconvenience of long outstanding claims against the Government, Bounties will not be allowed unless the Immigrants described in the application shall be presented to

the Board within two years after the date of the notification of acceptance by the Colonial Secretary.

IX. It is to be distinctly understood, that parties claiming bounties under the Regulation of 25th September, 1837, will only be entitled to receive them according to the scale therein set forth, on account of any Immigrants who may sail from the United Kingdom previously to the first day of July 1840, but for any who sail after that date, they will become entitled to the increased bounties and gratuities established by the present Regulation.

X. It is also to be understood, that no expense whatever attendant upon the introduction of these Immigrants will be defrayed by Government, excepting the Bounties and Gratuities herein-before mentioned; and that the Wives and Families of Soldiers in Regiments in this Colony, or in Van Diemen's Land, and of persons serving under sentence of Transportation in either Colony, are excepted from the present Regulations.

XI. To prevent misapprehension and disappointment, and to ensure a strict adherence to the principle of this Regulation, it is proper to state that the qualifications of Immigrants brought out under it will be strictly construed. Parties therefore, who may introduce Immigrants not qualified by age, calling, character, or otherwise, will do so entirely at their own risk, and will have no claim on the Government to obtain the bounties offered by the present Notices.
