No. 1.—“ *A Bill for rendering a Notarial Copy of an Exemplification of the Charter of the Bank of Australasia, evidence in all Courts of Law, Equity, Admiralty, Vice-Admiralty, and in all Courts of inferior Jurisdiction in the Colony of New South Wales.*”

The Bank of Australasia, having in New South Wales but one exemplification of their Charter, it is proposed, in order to obviate the public and private detriment which might occur from the loss of the said exemplification,—

That a copy of such exemplification, certified under the hand and seal of some Notary Public, to be a true copy, shall be received as legal evidence of the contents of such Charter, in all Courts of superior and inferior Jurisdiction in New South Wales.
