HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, now under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

No. 1.—“ *A Bill to repeal so much of an Act, intituled ‘An Act for preventing the mischiefs arising from the Printing and Publishing Newspapers, and Papers of a like nature, by persons not known, and for regulating the Printing and Publication of such Papers in other respects; and also for restraining the abuses arising from the Publication of blasphemous and seditious Libels,’ as relates to the sentence of Banishment on a second conviction, and further to amend the same.*”

It is proposed, by this Bill, to repeal so much of the said recited Act, 8 George IV., No. 2, as authorises the punishment of Banishment to be passed on persons convicted a second time of the publication of blasphemous or seditious Libels.

That in future no Actions shall be instituted for the recovery of Penalties under the said recited Act, or the proposed Act, except in the name of the Attorney General, at Sydney, or the Crown Prosecutor, at Melbourne.

That persons sued for Penalties, under the said recited Act, at any time before the passing of the proposed Act, may apply to the Court to stay proceedings, upon certain conditions.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD,

OR

A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that two Drays, laden with produce—the one a Bullock Dray belonging to Mr. Thomas Cowper, in charge of a Ticket of Leave holder, named Edmund Ireland, and an Aboriginal Native, and the other a Horse Dray belonging to Mr. Samuel Bawtree, in charge of two free men, named William Fraser, senior and junior, are supposed to have been Robbed near Bargo, and some of these persons Murdered;—His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any Free Person or Persons who may give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the Party or Parties by whom the Drays may have been Robbed, and any of the persons in charge of them, Murdered; and that if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

The Drays were last seen at an encampment between Lupton's Inn and the Lock-up House, on the 8th November last, where one of them has since been found secreted in the Bush; and it is stated that Mr. Cowper's Dray was seen in possession of a man named John Snelling, per *Lady Feversham*, in 1830, a description of whose person is annexed.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of his Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Public Officers concerned.
