## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,  
Captain General and Governor in Chief of  
the Territory of New South Wales and its  
Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same,  
&c. &c. &c.

**W**HEREAS, by an Act of the Governor and  
Council of New South Wales, passed in  
the fourth year of the Reign of Her present  
Majesty, intituled "*An Act for the Regulation  
of Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction in  
the Colony of New South Wales and its Depen-  
dencies, and for other purposes relating thereto,*"  
it is enacted, That all Buildings, Erections,  
Houses, and Premises, which should hereafter be  
erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained  
at the public expense, as and for public Gaols,  
Prisons, and Houses of Correction within the said  
Colony and its Dependencies, and which should,  
by Proclamation, to be from time to time published  
in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*,  
by order of the Governor for the time being of the  
said Colony, be declared and notified as such  
public Gaols, Prisons, or Houses of Correction,  
should, from and after the publication of such  
notification, be severally deemed and taken to be  
the public Gaol, Prison, or House of Correction,  
of the place or District where the same was or  
should be situated within the said Colony or its  
Dependencies, respectively, and should be subject  
to the several provisions thereafter made for the  
regulation, management, care, and discipline of  
the public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correc-  
tion belonging to the said Colony and its Depen-  
dencies, and of the Prisoners confined within the  
same.

Now, therefore, I, the GOVERNOR, by virtue of  
the said recited Act, and in furtherance of the  
power and authority thereby in me vested, do  
hereby proclaim, declare, and notify the building,  
known as the Eastern Watch House, at the angle  
of Stephen-street and Collins-lane, in the  
Town of Melbourne, in the District of Port Phillip,  
to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of  
Correction.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Govern-

ment House, Sydney, this eighteenth day  
of December, One thousand eight hundred  
and forty-one.

## COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to  
direct that the general objects of the  
following Bill, about to be brought under consi-  
deration of the Legislative Council, be published  
for general information.

No. 1.—"*A Bill to facilitate Proceedings by and  
against the Proprietors of a certain Joint Stock  
Company, lately carrying on business at Mel-  
bourne, in the District of Port Phillip, in the  
Colony of New South Wales, under the name,  
style, or firm, of "THE MELBOURNE AUCTION  
COMPANY," and for other purposes therein  
mentioned.*"

It is proposed, by this Bill, to enable the Pro-  
prietors of the said Joint Stock Company, to sue  
and be sued, in the name of their Manager, in order  
to wind up their affairs, and to relieve them from  
any penalties to which they may have subjected  
themselves, in case they should not have been duly  
licensed.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD,

OR

A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the  
Government that two Drays, laden with  
produce—the one a Bullock Dray belonging to

Mr. Thomas Cowper, in charge of a Ticket of Leave holder, named Edmund Ireland, and an Aboriginal Native, and the other a Horse Dray belonging to Mr. Samuel Bawtree, in charge of two free men, named William Fraser, senior and junior, are supposed to have been Robbed near Bargo, and some of these persons Murdered;— His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any Free Person or Persons who may give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the Party or Parties by whom the Drays may have been Robbed, and any of the persons in charge of them, Murdered; and that if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

The Drays were last seen at an encampment between Lupton's Inn and the Lock-up House, on the 8th November last, where one of them has since been found secreted in the Bush; and it is stated that Mr. Cowper's Dray was seen in possession of a man named John Snelling, per *Lady Feversham*, in 1830, a description of whose person is annexed.

#### PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

**A**LL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st December next, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands, respectively, up to that date, so that the entire revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient dispatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of next month, to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his

endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of his Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Public Officers concerned.

#### POLICE.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Victoria, No. 2, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns, respectively, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein*," the provisions of which Act were, by His Excellency's Proclamation of the 2nd August, 1841, extended to the Town of Geelong, in the County of Grant, at Port Phillip, has been pleased to direct the publication of the following boundaries of the said Town, viz:—

Leases to be granted for Twenty-one years, with the option to the Tenant to determine it at the

The biddings at the time of Auction to refer only to the rental for the first term of seven years; the rental for the second and third terms to be increased in the following ratio:—If 4d. per acre is offered for the first term of seven years, the rental for the second term will be 6d., and the third term 8d. per acre per annum.

The Lease will not contain any clause to prevent assigning or under-letting, but the under tenants will in no way be recognized by the Government, and the original Lessee always held responsible for the due payment of the rent.

The usual reservations regarding the right of making roads, constructing bridges, &c., will be introduced, but the reservation will not extend to Timber which the Tenant will be allowed to cut.

Any Lands not bid for at the time of Auction, will be left open for the selection of future applicants; in such cases the Government will not bind themselves to accept the minimum price, but any offers made will be submitted by the Agent for approval.

The rent will be required to be paid in advance; 25 per cent. deposit on the first year's rental, to be paid to the Agent at the time of Sale, and the residue within one month.

The rent for the remainder of the term, when

the amount is above £30, to be paid half yearly in advance; below this amount, yearly.

The biddings will be upon the rent per acre; the upset rent per acre being fixed in each case by the Government.
