#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

W HEREAS, by an Act passed in the present year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to provide for the more effectual Administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint from time to time, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court to reside in the District of Port Phillip, and by Proclamation for that purpose, issued with the advice of the Executive Council, to declare and define the limits of the said District within which such resident Judge shall exercise jurisdiction; and that within the limits so declared and defined, the said Judge whilst so resident therein, shall have, exercise, and enjoy all such and the like powers, jurisdiction, and authority, as now is, or are, or can be legally exercised by the said Supreme Court, or by all, or any of the Judges thereof collectively or individually: And whereas, I, the Governor aforestid, have by a Commission bearing even date herewith, under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, appointed JOHN WALPOLE WILLIS, Esq., one of the Judges of the said Court, to reside in the said District of Port Phillip;-

Now I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby declare, in pursuance of the powers so in me vested, that the said District of Port Phillip shall comprise all that part of the Territory of New South Wales which is bounded on the north by the thirty-sixth degree of south latitude; on the east by the one bundred and forty-sixth degree of east longitude, measuring from the meridian of Greenwich; on the south by the waters of Bass's Straits and the Pacific Ocean, and on the west by the one hundred and forty-first degree of east longitude, from the said meridian of Greenwich, being the limits of the said district

at Sydney the Tenth Day of September, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, within which His Honor the Superintendent exercises the powers of a Lieutenant Governor, and that within the said limits the said John Walpole Willis as such resident Judge, or such other Judge of the said Supreme Court as may hereafter be duly appointed to reside therein, shall have exercise, and enjoy the powers, jurisdiction, and authority, which are conferred by the provisions of the said recited Act.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this Eighth day of February, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fortyone.

IS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that the following Order in Council appointing New Amsterdam, in Berbice, a free Warehousing Port, be re-published from the London Gazette for general information.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS, by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament, held in the third and fourth years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the Trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things enacted, that the several ports therein, in that behalf mentioned, shall be free warehouseing ports, for all the purposes of the said Act; and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from set forth in the Government Notice bearing date time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's

possessions in America to be a free warehouseing port, for all or any of the purposes of the said Act, and that every port so appointed shall be, for all the purposes expressed in such Order, a free warehouseing port, under the said Act, as if appointed by the same.

And whereas, Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the port of New Amsterdam, in Berbice, a free warehouseing port under the said Act, subject to the provisions hereinafter

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her Majesty by the said Act in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of New Amsterdam, in Berbice, shall be a free warehouseing port, for all the purposes of the said Act.

Provided always, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained shall exempt any goods, wares, or merchandise, imported from the said Port of New Amsterdam into any of the British Possessions in the West Indies, or on the Continent of South America, or into the Bahama Islands, from the payment of the duties now chargable thereon in such places under the said Act.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the

necessary directions herein accordingly.

WITH reference to the Government Notice of the 21st ultimo, respecting the disposal of Crown Lands in the Southern or Port Phillip District,-His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the following POR-TIONS OF LAND in that District, which have been previously advertised at upset prices not exceeding twenty shillings an acre, will, on and after the 1st day of March next, be open to selection at the fixed price of twenty shillings an acre, in the manner pointed out in the above notice.
